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Wonderful, warm colors enhance the beauty of this traditional quilt. The block is a little tricky to put together, but well worth the effort. Our step by step instructions will guide you through to a beautiful quilt for a special person in your life!

**All yardages are based on 40" wide fabric.  
All seams are 1/4" unless other wise noted.**

**Sew one block together before you chain piece them all, just to make sure. OK?**






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The yardages given are for cutting the borders on the lengthwise of fabric. This is very important for the narrow borders #1 and #3. Also starch the narrow borders well before and after cutting and sewing! The measurements given are exact. Allow extra for differences in piecing.

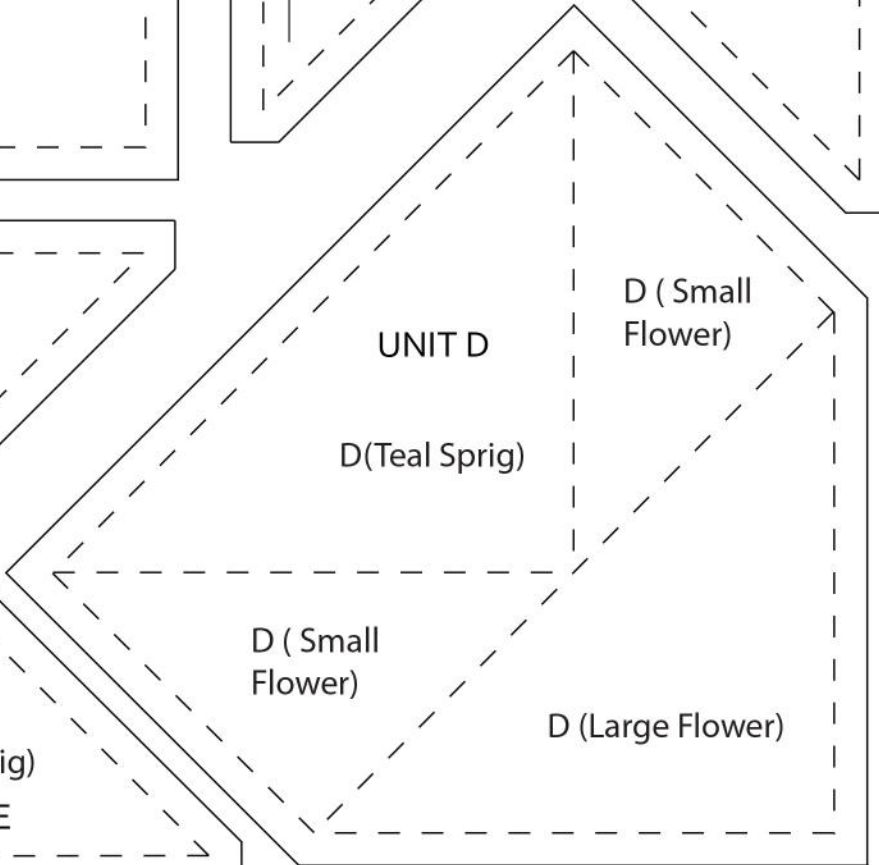
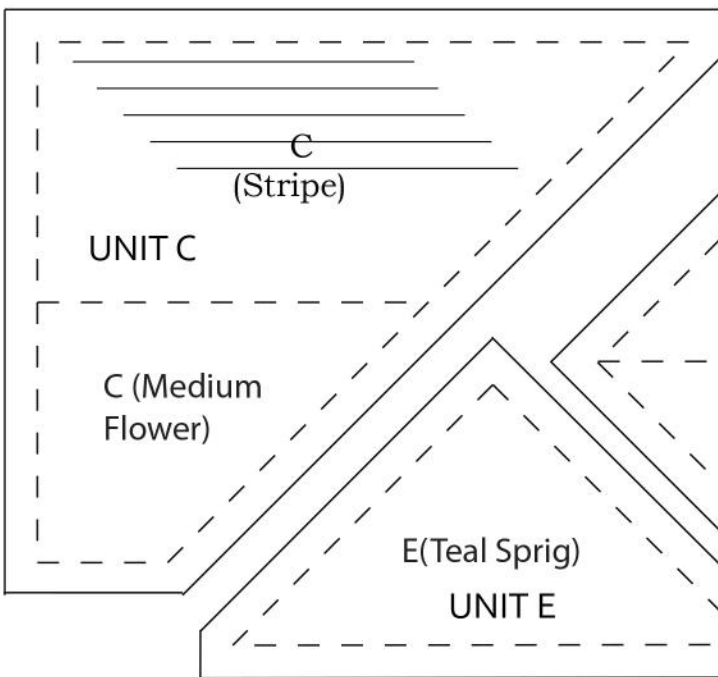
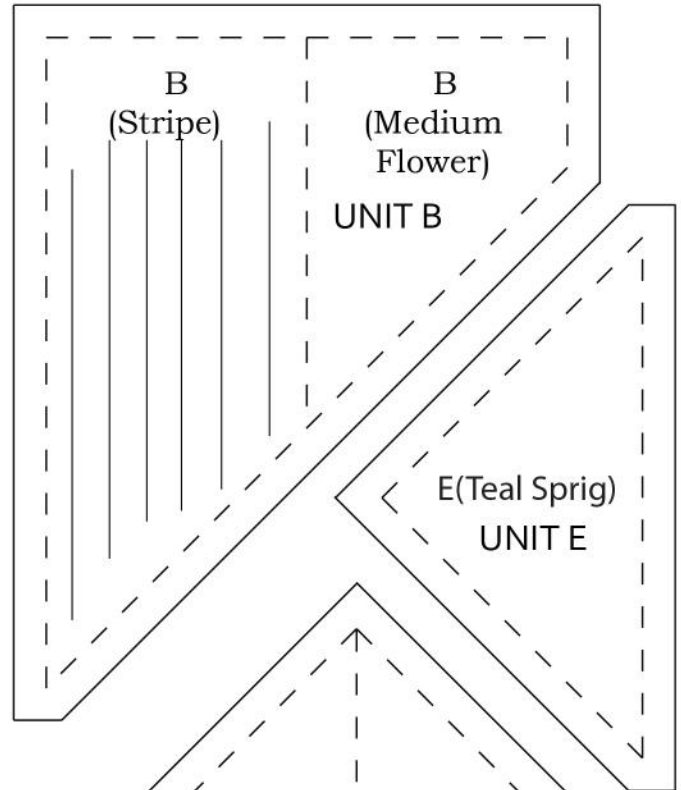
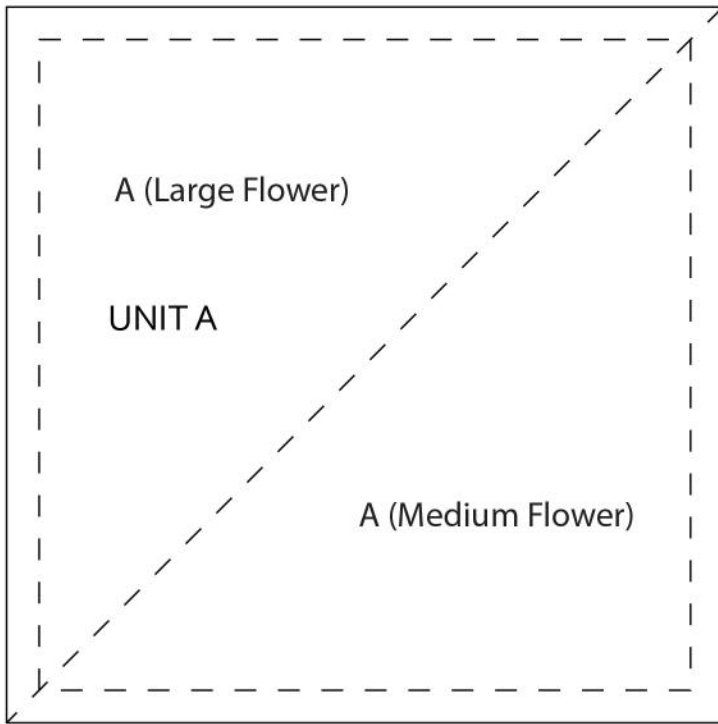
Be careful cutting the stripe fabric. All the pieces should be cut on the length of the fabric so that the stripe runs along the piece, not across it.

	<p><b>For Border # 4</b> - Cut 2 lengthwise strips 62 1/2" x 4 1/2". Cut 2 length strips 52 1/2" x 4 1/2".</p> <p><b>For Blocks</b> - Cut 8 strips 3 3/8" x WOF (22"). Cut into 48 - 3 3/8" squares for flying geese units.</p>	<p><b>For Border # 4</b> - Cut 2 lengthwise strips 84 1/2" x 6 1/2". Cut 2 length strips 78 1/2" x 6 1/2".</p> <p><b>For Blocks</b> - Cut 24 strips 3 3/8" x WOF (14"). Cut into 96 - 3 3/8" squares for flying geese units.</p>
	<p><b>For Border #2</b> - Cut 2 lengthwise strips 3 1/2" x 55 1/2". Cut 2 lengthwise strips 3 1/2" x 43 1/2".</p> <p><b>For Blocks</b> - Cut 3 strips 6" x WOF (26"). Cut 12 - 6" squares for half square triangles. Cut 3 strips 5" x WOF (26"). Cut 12 - 5" squares. Cut in half diagonally for corner triangles.</p>	<p><b>For Border #2</b> - Cut 2 lengthwise strips 5 1/2" x 65 1/2". Cut 2 lengthwise strips 5 1/2" x 73 1/2".</p> <p><b>For Blocks</b> - Cut 8 strips 6" x WOF (18"). Cut 24 - 6" squares for half square triangles. Cut 6 strips 5" x WOF. Cut 24 - 5" squares. Cut in half diagonally for corner triangles.</p>
	<p><b>For Blocks</b> - Cut 2 strips 6" x WOF. Cut 12 - 6" squares for half square triangles. Cut 4 - 2 1/2" x WOF. Use templates to further cut.</p>	<p><b>For Blocks</b> - Cut 4 strips 6" x WOF. Cut 24 - 6" squares for half square triangles. Cut 8 - 2 1/2" x WOF. Use templates to further cut.</p>
	<p><b>For Border #1</b> - Cut 2 lengthwise strips 1" x 54 1/2". Cut 2 length strips 1" x 37 1/2".</p> <p><b>For Border #3</b> - Cut 2 lengthwise strips 1" x 61 1/2". Cut 2 lengthwise strips 1" x 44 1/2".</p> <p><b>For Blocks</b> - Cut 4 - 2 1/2" lengthwise strips. Use templates to further cut.</p> <p><b>For Binding</b> - Cut 260" x 2 1/2" <b>on bias</b>.</p>	<p><b>For Border #1</b> - Cut 2 lengthwise strips 1" x 72 1/2". Cut 2 length strips 1" x 55 1/2".</p> <p><b>For Border #3</b> - Cut 2 lengthwise strips 1" x 83 1/2". Cut 2 lengthwise strips 1" x 66 1/2".</p> <p><b>For Blocks</b> - Cut 7 - 2 1/2" lengthwise strips. Use templates to further cut.</p> <p><b>For Binding</b> - Cut 360" x 2 1/2" <b>on bias</b>.</p>
	<p><b>For Blocks</b> - Cut 4 strips 3 3/8" x WOF. Cut 24 rectangles 6 1/8" x 3 3/8" for flying geese units. Cut 2 strips 5 3/8" x WOF. Cut 12 - 5 3/8" squares. Divide in half diagonally twice for corner triangles.</p>	<p><b>For Blocks</b> - Cut 8 strips 3 3/8" x WOF. Cut 48 rectangles 6 1/8" x 3 3/8" for flying geese units. Cut 4 strips 5 3/8" x WOF. Cut 24 - 5 3/8" squares. Divide in half diagonally twice for corner triangles.</p>
	<p>Cut yardage in half. Sew back together making a backing about 60" x 80".</p>	<p>Cut 2 lengths 106" long. Divide remainder in half lengthwise. Sew together to make a piece about 106" long. Sew the three sections together making a backing about 100" x 106".</p>

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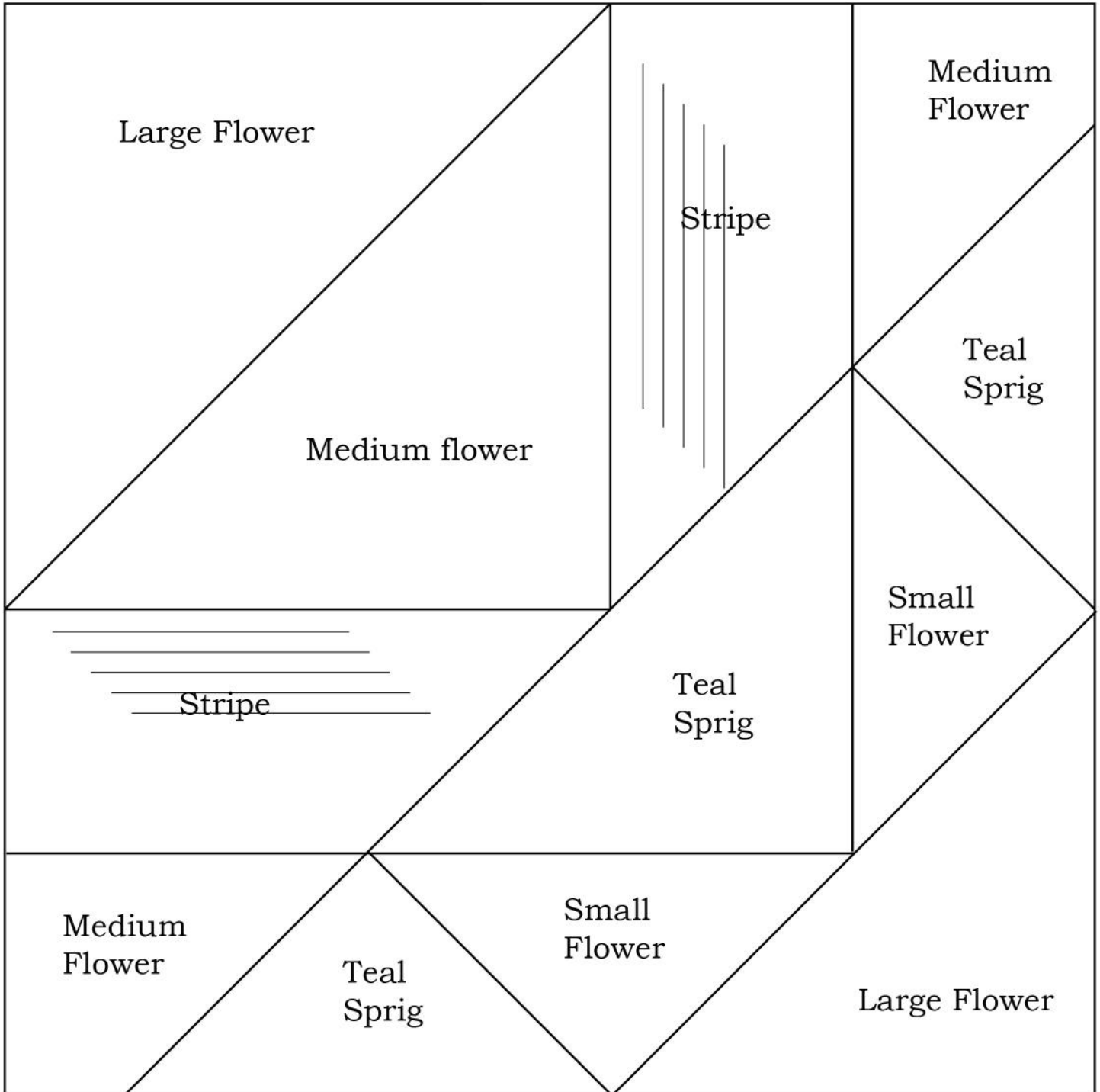
Illustrated below are the units that go together to create the block. You will probably save yourself some massive headaches if you pin or glue a swatch of each fabric on the matching place below. Pin the stripe fabric with the stripes going the proper way!



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This illustrates the block sewn together. Again, it would probably be a good idea to pin or glue swatches to this to help you keep track of what fabric goes where.



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## Make Unit A —

- Mark the diagonal center on the wrong side of the **Medium Flower 6"** squares. ( Fig. 1)
- Mark  $\frac{1}{4}$ " on each side of the center mark.
- Pair up the 6" squares of the **Large Flower** with the **Medium Flower**, with the wrong sides together.
- Sew on the  $\frac{1}{4}$ " marks. Cut on the center mark. ( Fig. 2)
- Press toward the dark.
- Trim squares to a perfect  $5\frac{1}{2}$ " with the seam down the middle.
- Label **Unit A** and set aside.

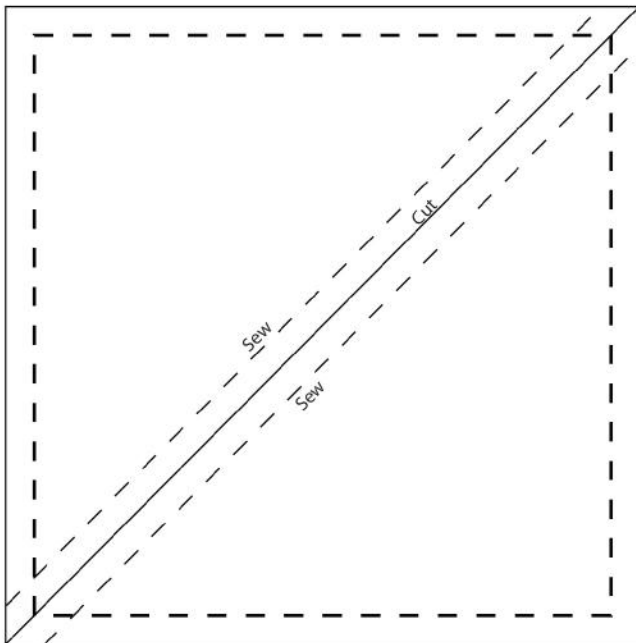

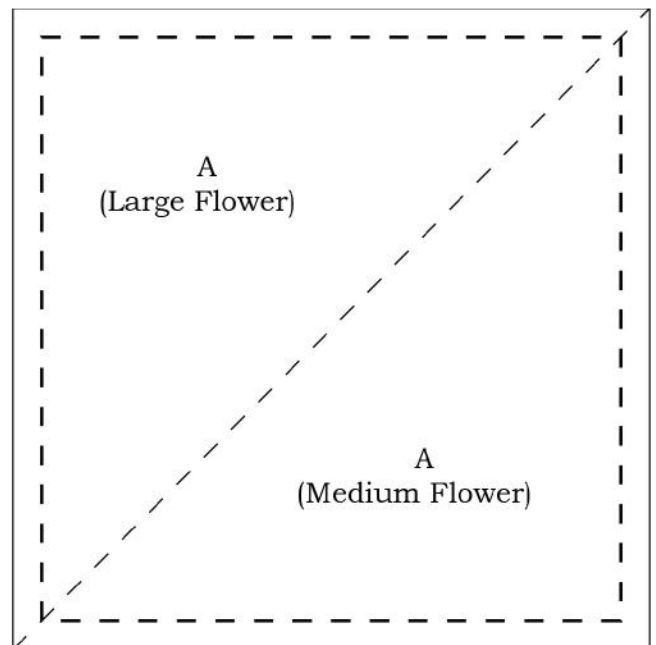

## Make Units B & C —

- Cut the templates provided at the end of the pattern out of template plastic or oak tag.
- With right sides together, sew a  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6" **Stripe** rectangle to a  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $3\frac{3}{4}$ " **Medium Flower** rectangle matching at the bottoms. ( Fig.3 ) Make 24 (48 for queen) rights and 24 (48 for queen) lefts as shown following.
- Press seams toward stripe.
- Using the template, trim pieces to shape. ( Fig. 4 ) Be careful not to stretch or distort the bias edge while cutting. Make 24 (48 for queen) of each side.
- Label **Unit B or C** and set aside.



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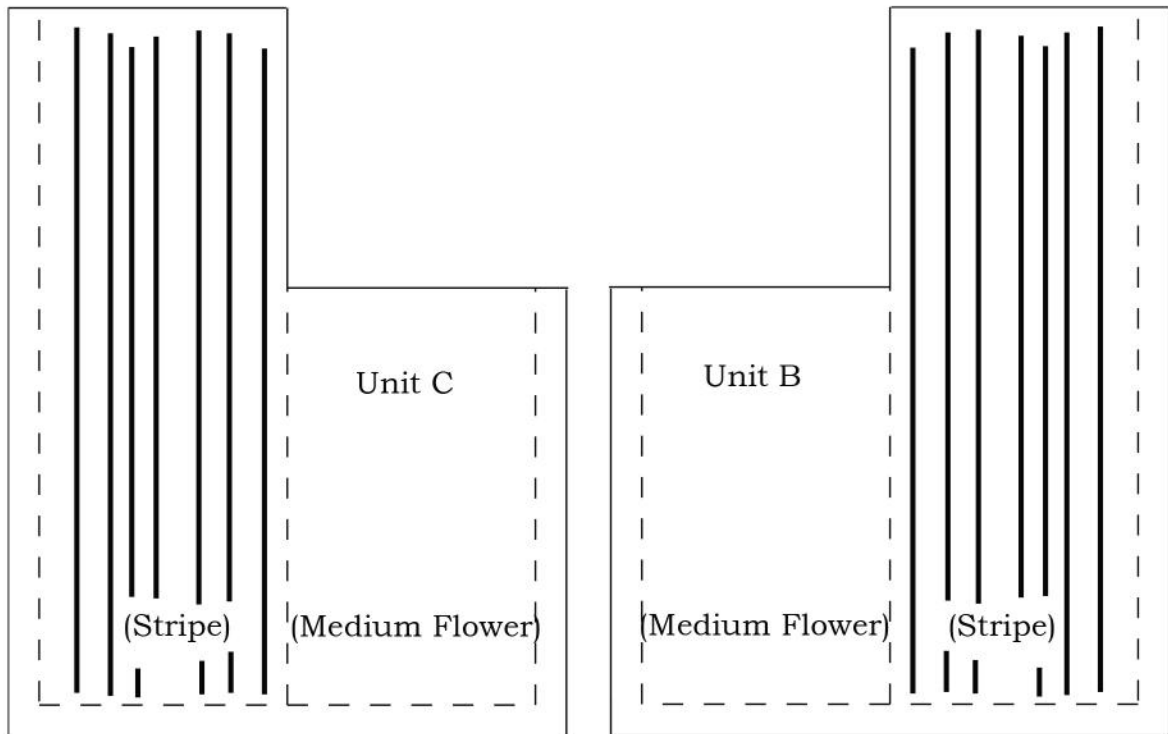

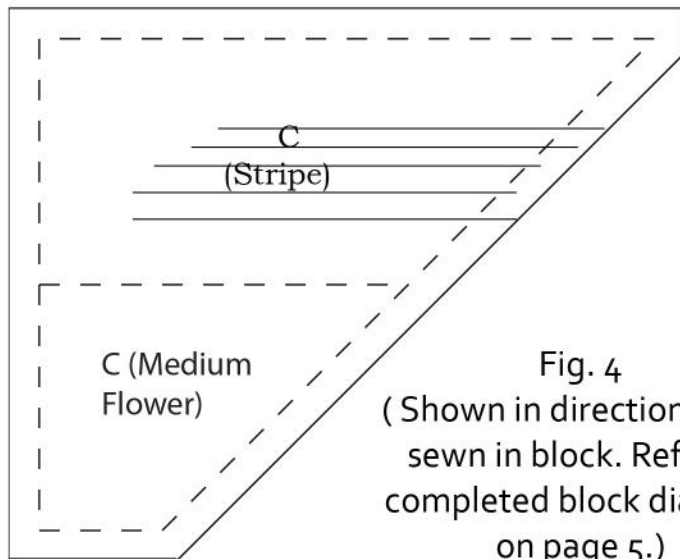
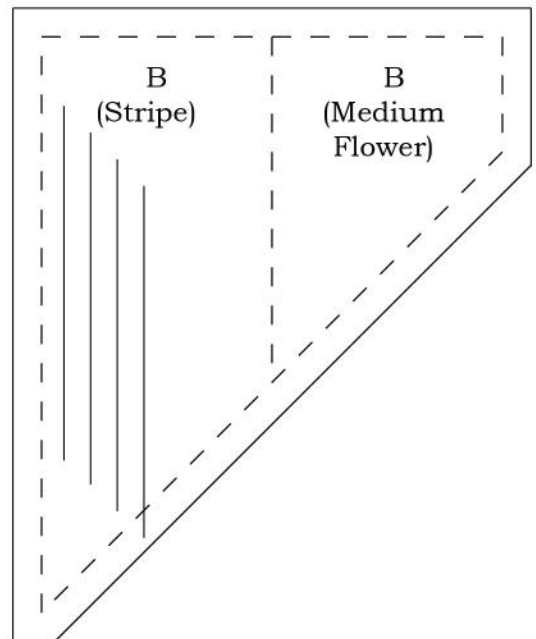

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## MAKE UNIT D —

- Mark the diagonal centers of the  $3 \frac{3}{8}$ " **Small Flower squares** on the wrong side of the fabric.
- Put one square on each side of  $6 \frac{1}{8}$ " **Teal Sprig rectangle** as shown below. ( Fig. 5 )
- Sew along the line and trim to a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam. ( Fig. 6 )
- Press seam up toward corner. ( Fig. 7 )
- Do the same to the other side of the rectangle to create a flying geese unit. ( Fig. 8 )
- Make 24 (48 for queen) units. Label and set aside.

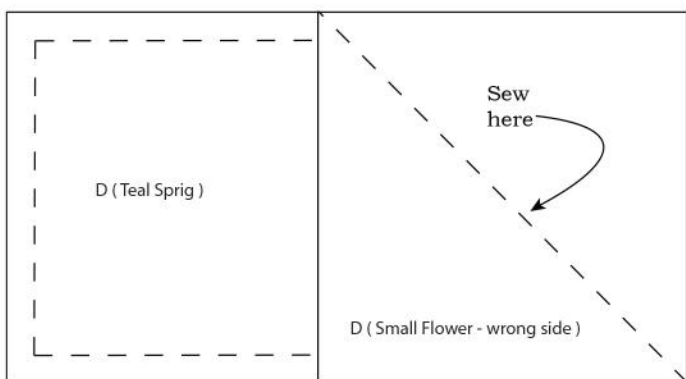

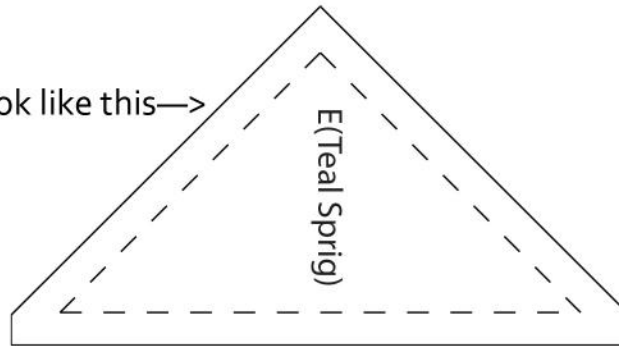
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## MAKE UNIT E —

- Cut the **UNIT E** out of template plastic.
- Trim the **Teal Sprig quarter square triangles** according to the template.
- Note: If you don't want to trim all those triangles with a template, you can just sew them into the the block as explained below and trim them off. The template is more exact. The trimming is easier. What kind of quilter are you??!!

Trimmed triangle will look like this—>



## ASSEMBLING THE BLOCK—

- Take **UNIT A** and sew a **UNIT B** and **C** to each side of the **Medium Flower** triangle as shown below. ( Fig. 9 & 10 )

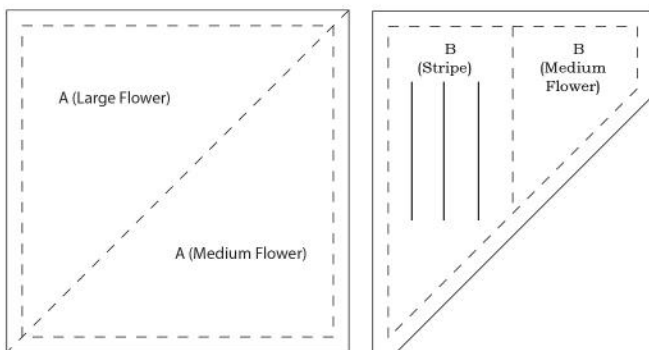

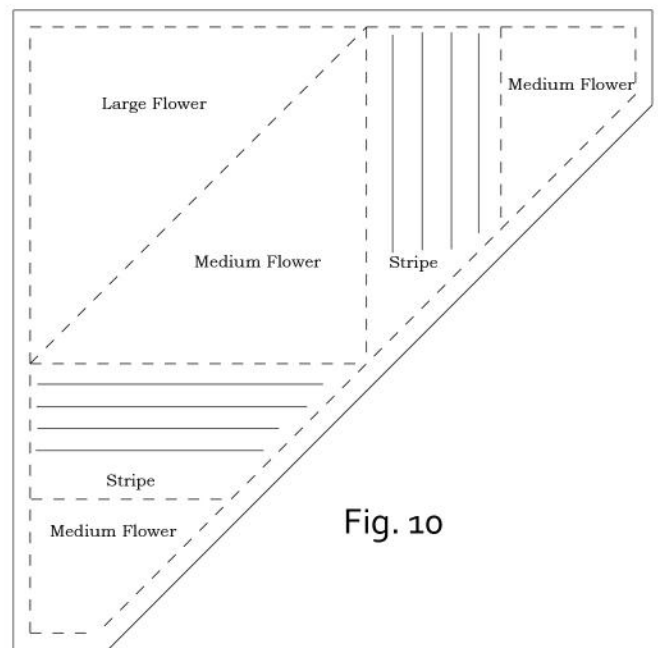

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## ASSEMBLING THE BLOCK cont'd—

- Sew the 5" Large Flower triangles to the **UNIT D** as shown below. ( Fig. 11 )
- Add **UNIT E** to each side as shown. Trim if necessary. ( Fig. 12 )
- Sew this section to the section previously made to complete the block. (Fig. 13 )

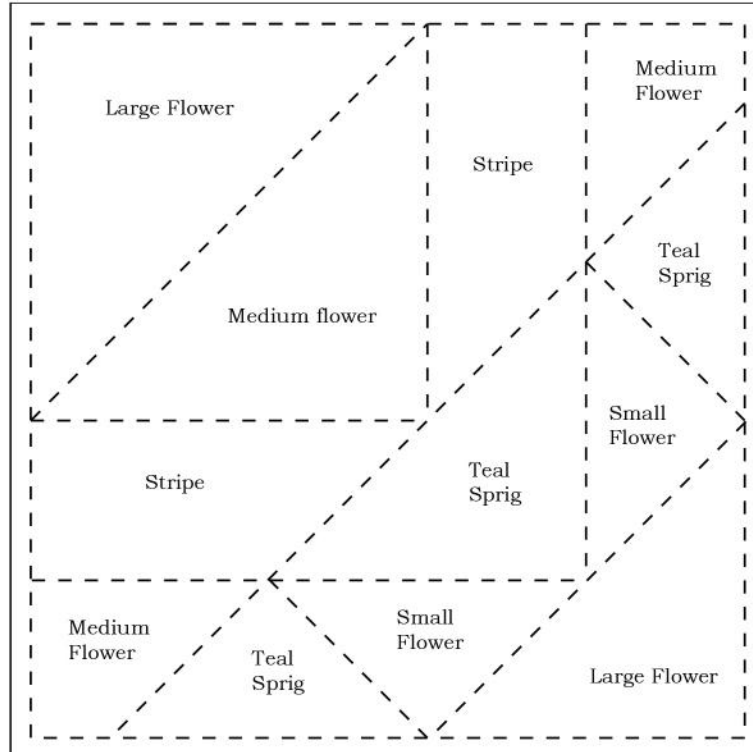
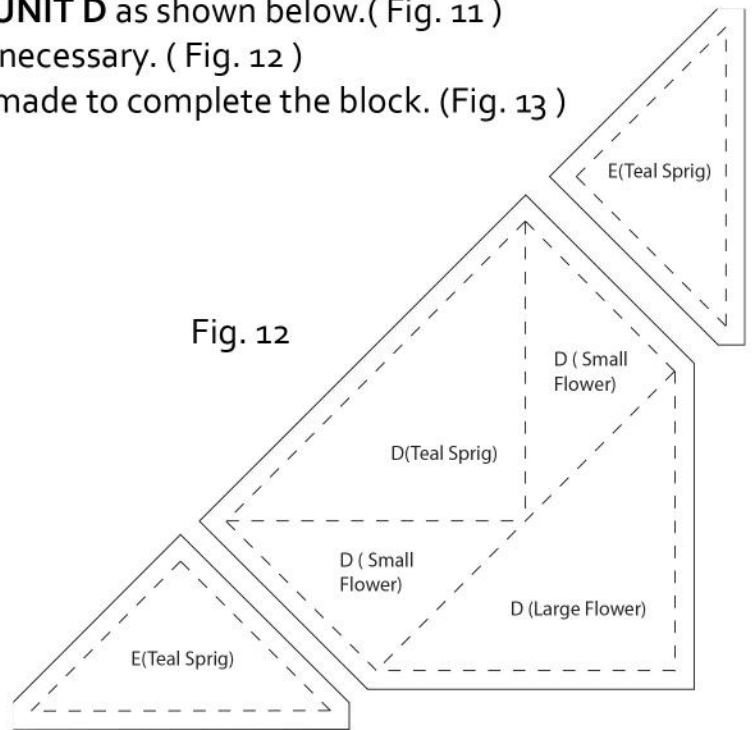
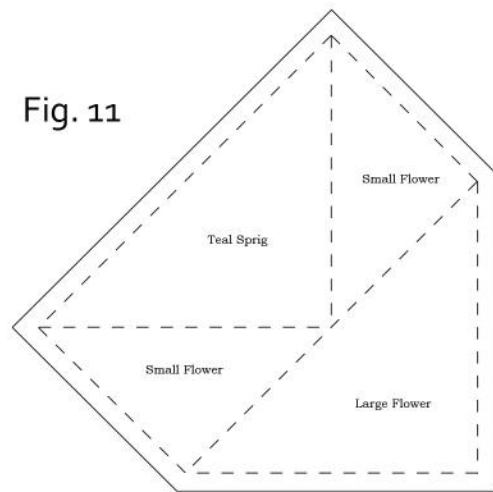

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## ASSEMBLING THE QUILT —

- Take 4 blocks and rotate them to that the stripes form a square in the middle as shown with the red line below. (Fig. 14 )
- Sew two blocks together twice and then sew those together to form the completed section.
- Make 6 sections (12 for queen).
- Sew three rows of two sections each for the twin quilt. Sew four rows of three sections for the queen quilt.
- Sew the rows together to make the center of the quilt.
- Measure the down the center from top to bottom and from side to side to check the measurements of the borders.
- Sew the borders one at a time to the quilt, first to the sides and then to the top and the bottom for each border.
- Create a quilt sandwich with the top, batting, and backing.
- Quilt as desired.
- Bind with the bias stripe.
- Enjoy!

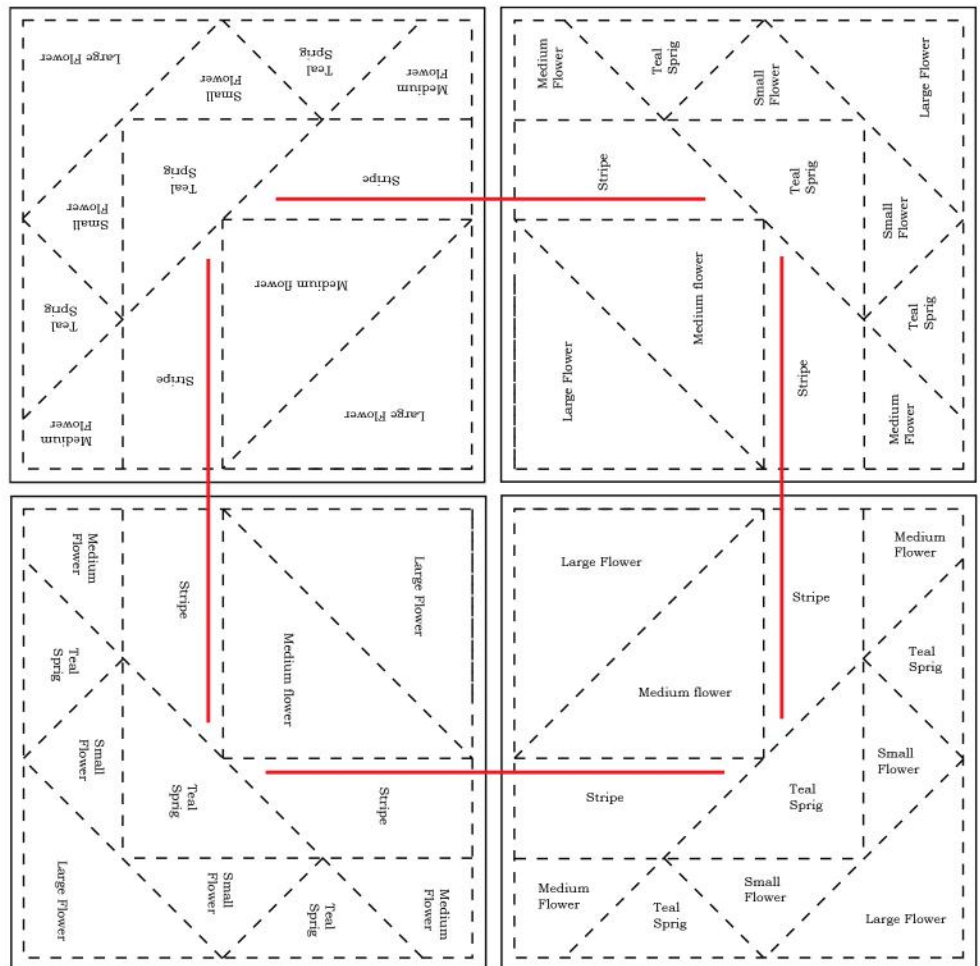
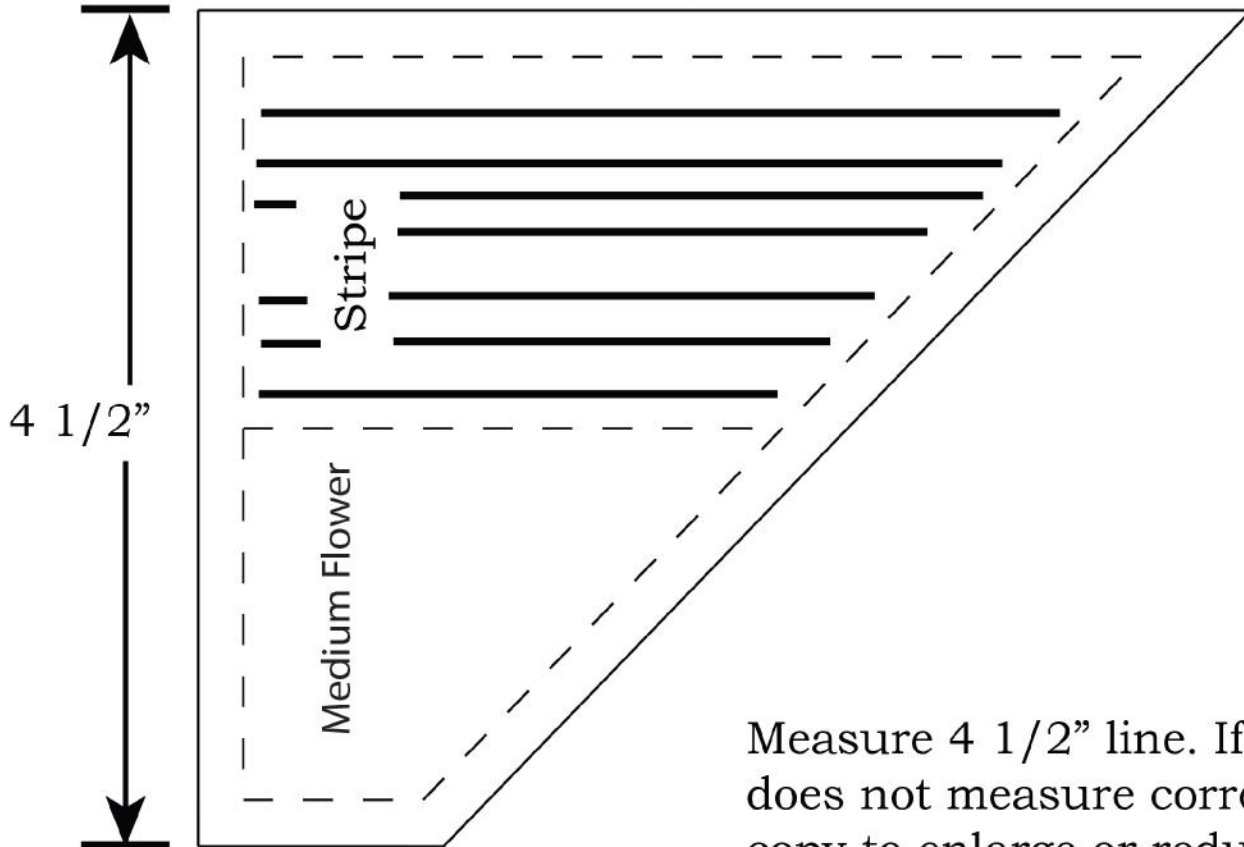


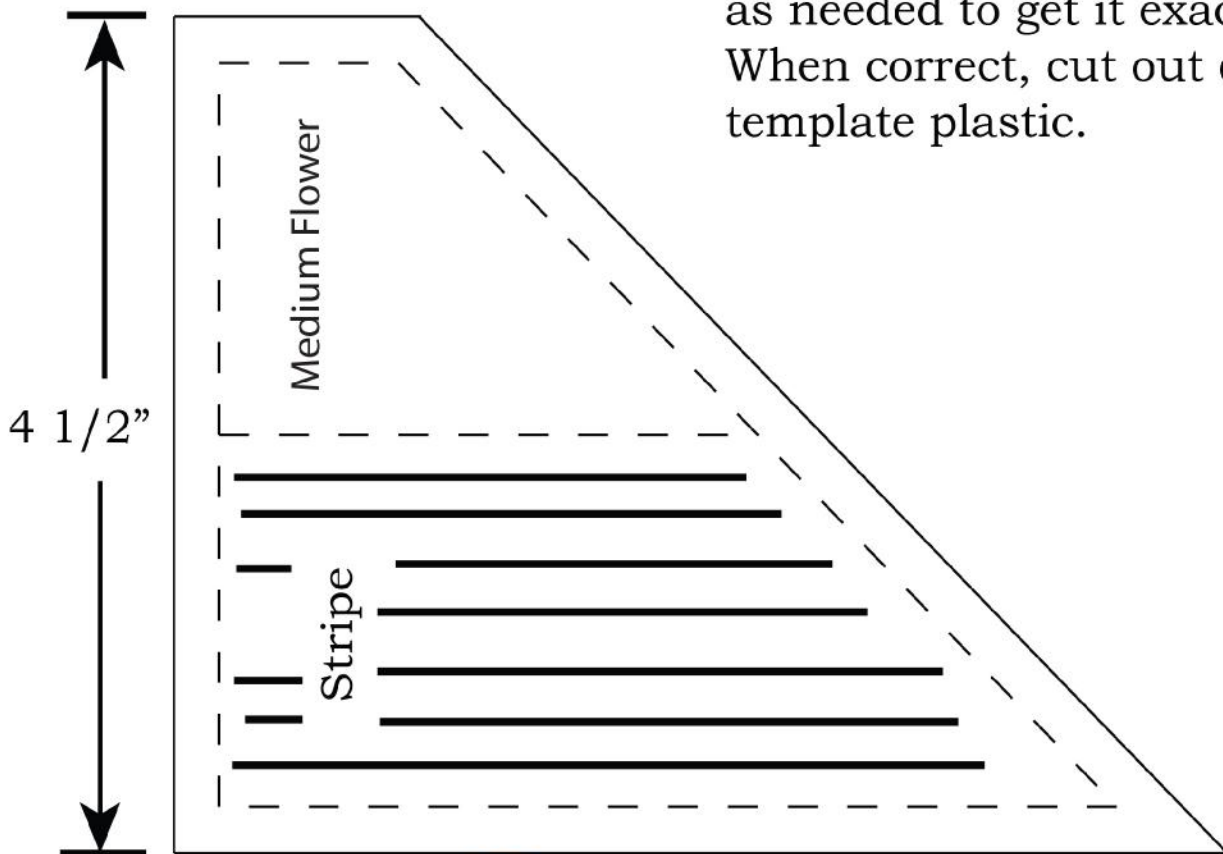

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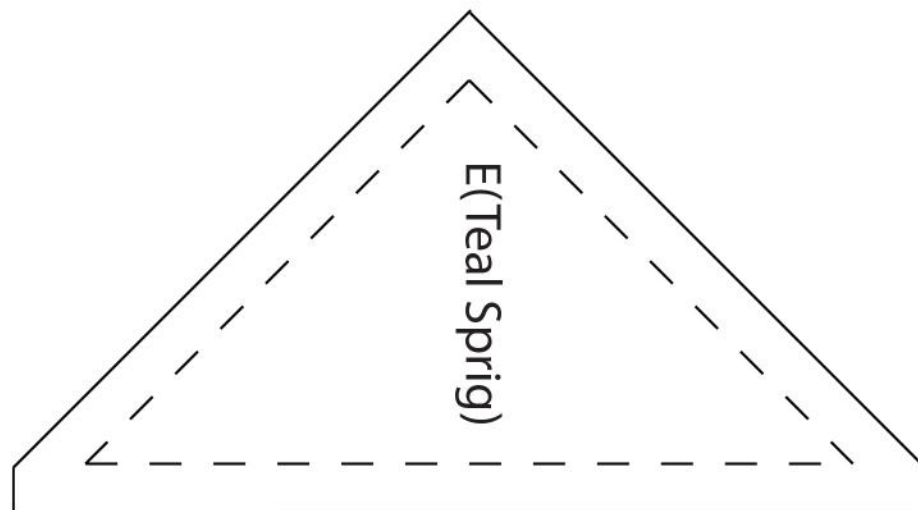


Measure 4 1/2" line. If it does not measure correctly, copy to enlarge or reduce as needed to get it exact. When correct, cut out of template plastic.



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This square should measure exactly one inch. If it doesn't, reduce or enlarge as necessary.
