Constructing Pieced Blocks.

1. Flying geese unit. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of 1 (1 $1/2" \times 1 1/2"$) A square. Place square, right sides together, at a corner of 1 (1 $1/2" \times 2 1/2"$) E rectangle. Sew on drawn line. Trim 1/4" away from sewn line. Open and press to reveal A corner triangle. Repeat with another (1 $1/2" \times 1 1/2"$) A square on the same (1 $1/2" \times 2 1/2"$) E rectangle to complete 1 flying geese unit.









Repeat to make a total of 4 E/A and 4 G/A flying geese units.




2. Sew 1 E/A and 1 G/A flying geese units together to make a quarter block unit. Square to 2 1/2".



Repeat to make 4 quarter block units.

3. Arrange and sew 4 quarter units to complete 1 G block, as shown. Make 5 (4-1/2") square unfinished G blocks. Square to $4 \frac{1}{2}$ ".





4. Repeat steps 1-3 using $(1-1/2" \times 2-1/2")$ H rectangles in place of the G rectangles to make a total of 4 H blocks.





Quilt Assembly:

1. Sew 9 pieced blocks into 3 rows of 3 blocks each. Joing the blocks into rows and joing the rows to make a 9-patch unit. Square to 12 1/2".




2. Arrange and sew together 3 (2 1/2" x 28 1/2") F strips, 1 (2 1/2" x 28 1/2") C strip, 1 (2 1/2" x 28 1/2") D strip and 1 (2 1/2" x 28 1/2") C strip, and add to the bottom of the pieced block assembly made in step 1. This unit should measure 12 1/2" x 40 1/2".



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


3. Add to the right of the sewn assembly, made in step 2, 6 (2 1/2" x 40 1/2") strips in the order: F, B, F, D, F, C to complete runner top. Square to 24 1/2" x 40 1/2".



Note: The above runner orientation is for a vertical display. Please refer to the following diagram for orientation if a horizontal display is desired.





Finishing

Layer runner top, batting and backing together. Baste and quilt as desired. Attach binding to complete runner.
