## MAKE THE TABLE RUNNER

1. Trace each "GAME NIGHT" appliqué template onto the paper side of fusible web. Cut out 1/4" past drawn lines. Fuse shapes onto $\mathbf{K}$ fabric and cut out on the drawn lines.
2. Lay out "GAME NIGHT" letters on the $\mathbf{H} 7-1 / 2$ " $\times 40-1 / 2$ " rectangle, centering from left to right and top to bottom. Fuse letters in place and secure with a zigzag or other decorative stitch.

3. Lay out (13) assorted $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares and (14) $\mathbf{K} 1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles and sew into a row, referring to diagram for fabric placement. Sew K $2^{\prime \prime} \times 40-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips to top and bottom to make a pieced row. Make (2).


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4. Sew pieced rows to the top and bottom of the "GAME NIGHT" rectangle from step 2 to create the runner center.
5. Cut the $\mathbf{H} 8-1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ square in half diagonally twice, creating (4) triangles. Discard the top and bottom triangle.

6. Sew (1) K $4^{\prime \prime} \times 10-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip to (1) $\mathbf{H}$ triangle. Trim $\mathbf{K}$ strip even with triangle edge. Sew (1) K $4 " \times 14^{\prime \prime}$ strip to the adjoining triangle side. Trim both $\mathbf{K}$ ends even with remaining $\mathbf{H}$ triangle side to create (1) pieced triangle end. Make (2).

7. Sew the pieced triangle ends to short ends of the runner center.


## FINISHING

Layer runner top, batting and backing together to form quilt sandwich. Baste and quilt as desired. Bind using I 2-1/4" strips.

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## MAKING THE PENNANTS

1. Position the triangle template on a short end of (1) B 6 " $\times 14^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle. Cut along template lines to create the pointed end for the pennant.

2. Sew $\mathbf{K} 1-1 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 9-3 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ strips to opposite long sides of the $\mathbf{B}$ pennant, starting at the top edge. Sew (1) K 1-1/4" $\times 7-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip along the top edge. Sew (1) $\mathbf{K} 1-1 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 9^{\prime \prime}$ strip to the right triangle edge, extending beyond the fabric at both ends. Trim excess. Sew (1) K 1-1/4" $\times 9^{\prime \prime}$ strip to the remaining left triangle edge, extending beyond the fabric at both ends. Trim excess.

3. Repeat steps 1 and 2 to make (1) each pennant using Fabrics D, F and $\mathbf{G}$ and (4) pennants using Fabric A.


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4. Trace (2) each knight, rook, queen and king appliqué templates onto the paper side of fusible web. Cut out $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ past drawn lines. Fuse (1) of each shape onto $\mathbf{J}$ and $\mathbf{K}$ fabric and cut out on the drawn lines.
5. Position and fuse (1) each $\mathbf{J}$ and $\mathbf{K}$ knight templates on (1) A pennant, offsetting the $\mathbf{K}$ knight slightly so the $\mathbf{J}$ knight shows on the left side. Fuse letters in place and secure with a zigzag or other decorative stitch. Repeat to make (1) each rook, queen and king pennant tops.


## FINISHING

For each pennant, layer batting, backing right side up and pennant top right side down. Stitch around the pennant shape using a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowance and leaving a $5^{\prime \prime}$ opening along top edge for turning. Turn right side out, press raw edges in, and whipstitch opening closed. Topstitch 1/4" from outer edge of pennant and add additional quilting as desired. Repeat for each pennant.

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Templates are shown in reverse and at 100\%.

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
