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## Cutting Instructions:

Fabric A: Golf/Tennis/Baseball - Multi

- Cut two $6 \frac{1 ⁄ 2 " \prime}{2}$ squares from the golf section (A-1).
- Cut two $6 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ " squares from the tennis section $A-2$ ).
- Cut two $61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares from the baseball section A-3).

Fabric B: Volleyball/Football/Basketball/Soccer - Multi

- Cut one $6 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ square from the volleyball section ( $B-1$ ).
- Cut three $6 \frac{1 / 2 "}{}{ }^{\prime \prime}$ squares from the basketball section ( $B-2$ )
- Cut three $6 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares from the football section (B-3).
- Cut two $6 \frac{112 "}{}{ }^{\prime \prime}$ squares from the soccer section (B-4).

Fabric C: Lime

- Cut four $81 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into fifteen $81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares.

Fabric D: Palette - Cherry

- See instructions to cut three basketballs.

Fabric E: White

- See instructions to cut three soccer balls.
- See instructions to cut three football accents.
- See instructions to cut two volleyballs.
- See instructions to cut four baseballs.

Fabric F: Palette - Vine Black

- Cut five $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into thirty $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 6 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ strips.
- Cut eight $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into thirty $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 8 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ strips.
- Cut five $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips for the binding.
- See instructions to cut the three sets of soccer ball accents.

Fabric G: Palette - Saddle

- See instructions to cut three footballs.
- See instructions to cut four bats.

Fabric H: Palette - Ash

- Cut three 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut two $2^{\prime \prime} \times 481 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips.
- Cut three 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut two $2^{\prime \prime} \times 431 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips.

Backing: Palette - Ash

- Cut two 51 " $\times$ WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to $51^{\prime \prime} \times 59$ " for the pieced back.


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## Block Assembly:

1. Sew one $1 \frac{1}{1 / 2 \prime} \times 6 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ Fabric F strip to each side of one $6 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ Fabric A-1 square. Sew one $1 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 8 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the $6 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A-1 square to make one Block One (Fig. 1). Repeat to make a second Block One.
2. Repeat Step 1 and use Figures 2 through 7 for fabric identification and location to make the designated number of Blocks.

3. Following the manufacturer's instructions, trace the listed number of each template onto the paper side of the fusible web. Roughly cut out each template about $1 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ outside the drawn lines.
4. Press each template onto the wrong side of the fabrics as listed on the templates. Cut out each template on the drawn lines.

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5. Refer to Figure 8 to arrange and press one Fabric E soccer ball and one set of Fabric F soccer ball accents onto one $81 / 2$ Fabric $C$ square
6. Finish the raw edges of each shape with a decorative stitch such as a buttonhole or satin stitch to make one Block Eight.
7. Repeat Steps 5-6 to make three Block Eights total.

8. Repeat Steps 5-6 and used Figures 9 through 12 to make the designated number of Blocks. Note: Block Twelve has three blocks with the bat in one direction and one block with the bat in opposite direction. Refer to the quilt photo for placement.

Quilt Assembly - Refer to the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top:
9. Sew one Block One, one Block Eight, one Block Six, one Block Nine and one Block Four together in that order to make Row One.
10. Sew one Block Ten, one Block Three, one Block Twelve, one Block Five and one Block Eleven together in that order to make Row Two.
11.Sew one Block Two, one Block Nine, one Block Seven, one Block Eight and one Block Six together in that order to make Row Three.
12. Sew one Block Twelve, one Block Five, one Block Ten, one Block Three and one Block Twelve together in that order to make Row Four.
13. Sew one Block Seven, one Block Eight, one Block Two, one Block Nine and one Block One together in that order to make Row Five.

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14. Sew one Block Ten, one Block Six, one Block Twelve, one Block Five and one Block Eleven together in that order to make Row Six.
15. Sew the six rows together in numerical order to make the Center Block.
16. Sew one 2" $\times 481 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric H strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew one $2^{\prime \prime} \times 431 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.
17. Layer and quilt as desired.
18. Sew the five $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF Fabric F strips together, end to end with $45^{\circ}$ seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half, lengthwise with wrong sides together, and press.
19. Bind as desired.
