

Fabric and cutting requirements for Table-runner:

Fabric Picture	Quantity	Fabric Number	Placement of Fabric	Cutting
	1/3 yard	38978-3 Blue	Second Border	Cut three strips 2 ½". Recut 1 strip into 2 - 18 ½" pieces. Recut 2 strips 40 ½" long.
	3/4 yard	38979-3 Blue	Sky	Cut five 4" strips. Recut 18 – 4" x 10" rectangles. Cut one 5" strips. Recut 6 – 5" squares.
	1/4 yard	33762 A -1 Red	First Border	Cut four strips 1 ½". Recut 2 strips into 4 – 12 ½" pieces. And 2 strips 40 ½" long.
	1/4 yard	38979-4 White	Forrest Floor	Cut one strip 5". Recut into 6 – 5" squares and 3 – 2" x 5" rectangles.
**************************************	1 1/4 yards	38978 – 4 White	Backing Tree A	First cut backing 22" x 48". Cut three 5" x 8" rectangles.
	1/4 yard	38977-2 Green	Tree C	Cut one strip 5". Recut into 3 - 10" rectangles.
	3/8 yard	33762A-2 Green	Tree B Binding	Cut one strip 5". Recut into 3 - 12" rectangles. Cut 3 – 2 1/4" strips.

- Need 9 sheets of <u>legal</u> size paper for printing foundation piecing patterns.
 - Quilt Batting or Fusible Fleece approximately 1 1/4 yards.

Note about printing: Adjust printer to print on legal size paper. The each of the tree block sections should measure 4 ½ by 12 ½ inches.

Fabric requirements and cutting instructions for placemats:

The center blocks are foundation pieced. Extra fabric is included.

Fabric Picture	Quantity	Fabric Number	Placement of Fabric	Cutting
	1⁄4 yard	38979-4 White	Forrest floor	Cut two strips 3 1/2. Recut into 8 – 3 ½" squares and 16 – 2 ½" x 3 ½" rectangles.
	1 yard	38979-3 Blue	Sky	Cut eight 3" strips. Recut 48 – 3" x 6 ½" rectangles. Cut two 3 ½" strips. Recut 16 – 3 ½" squares.
	1/4 yard	38977-2 Green	Trees C	Cut two strips 3 ½". Recut into 8 - 6 ½" rectangles.
	³ ⁄ ₄ yard	33762 A -2 Green	Trees B Binding	Cut two strips 3 ½". Recut into 8 - 6 ½" rectangles. Cut 7 – 2 ¼" strips for binding.
	1 3/4 yard	38978-4 White	Trees A Backing	Cut two strips 3 ½". Recut into 8 - 6 ½" rectangles. Cut 4 pieces 15" x 20".
	3/8 yard	33762A-1 Red	First border	Cut 9 strips -1 1/4".
	1/2 yard	38978-3 Blue	Second border	Cut 4 - 2 ½" strips. Cut 3 – 1 ¼".

- Need 16 sheets of paper for printing foundation piecing patterns.
- Quilt Batting or Fusible Fleece for four placemats approximately 2 yards.



Sewing instructions for Table Runner:

Constructing the Block

- After printing foundation patterns trim each section leaving the seam allowance. You will be chain piecing so put all the B's patterns together with appropriate fabrics. Repeat for A and C.
 Refer to pictures for hints on how to sew each tree.
 - a. Hint: Sewing with smaller stitches and larger needle will make it easier to remove paper after joining the blocks.
 - b. Hint: Remember tape can fix a torn paper foundation. (In case you have to unsew.)



- 1. Place the wrong side of the fabric on the back of the foundation pattern. Sew on line as indicated in picture 1. This will make joining the next piece easier. Sew the first seam on all B trees. Chain piece for all three trees.
- 2. Fold paper back on the sewing line. Trim leaving a quarter of an inch seam allowance on all three trees.
- 3. Position sky rectangle (B2) right side toward tree as indicated. Sew on the previously stitched line. Sew all three trees. Press away from tree.
- 4. Trim all three trees even with seam allowance as pictured.
- 5. Fold paper back on the sewing line and trim leaving a quarter inch seam allowance. Place sky rectangle (B3) even with seam allowance. Stitch all three trees on the pattern line. Press and trim as before.


Sewing instructions for Table Runner cont.:

- 6. Place Forest Floor fabric square as pictured. Stitch on line. Press, then trim. Do the same for all three B trees.
- 7. Press and trim. Do not remove the paper until after joining all the three trees together.


 Hint: Spraying paper lightly with water will make it easier to tear off paper.
- 8. Repeat for A and C trees. Attach the Sky rectangles as you did for the Forest Floor.
- 9. Assemble the tree section as pictured. Make three blocks.
- 10. Attach the red stripe sashing to blocks and join blocks as pictured. Press and trim. Then add the side borders.
- 11. Repeat for second border sewing the sides first, then the top and bottom.
- 12. Make sandwich. Quilt as desired. Trim and add binding.



Topiary Trio 3




This is the top half of the piece, cut out and tape to the bottom piece on next page for complete template.




Pattern for "Topiary Trio 3" as 12.000 by 12.000 (inches) block, printed from EQ7!


This is the bottom half of the piece, cut out and tape to the top piece on previous page for complete template.




This is the top half of the piece, cut out and tape to the bottom piece on next page for complete template.



Sewing instructions for Placemats:



Constructing the Block

Sewing instructions for Placemats cont.:

- 1. Place the wrong side of the fabric on the back of the foundation pattern. Sew on line as indicated in picture 1. This will make joining the next piece easier. Sew the first seam on all B trees. Chain piece for all eight trees.
- 2. Fold paper back on the sewing line. Trim leaving a quarter of an inch seam allowance on all eight trees.
- 3. Position sky rectangle (B2) right side toward tree as indicated. Sew on the previously stitched line. Sew all eight trees. Press away from tree.
- 4. Trim all eight trees even with seam allowance as pictured.
- 5. Fold paper back on the sewing line and trim leaving a quarter inch seam allowance. Place sky rectangle (B3) even with seam allowance. Stitch all eight trees on the pattern line. Press and trim as before.
- 6. Place Forest Floor fabric square as pictured. Stitch on line. Press, then trim. Do the same for all eight B trees.
- 7. Press and trim. Do not remove the paper until after joining all the six trees together.

 Hint: Spraying paper lightly with water will make it easier to tear off paper.
- 8. Repeat for A and C trees. Attach the Sky rectangles as you did for the Forest Floor.
- 9. Assemble the six tree section as pictured. Make four of these placemat centers.
- 10. Attach the first border to the top and bottom. Press and trim. Then add the side borders.
- 11. Repeat for second border.
- 12. Make four quilt sandwiches. Quilt as desired. Trim and add binding.
