Making ships in a bottle can be tricky...unless you are a quilter!

Our bottles and ships are turned edge appliqué which can be attached by hand or machine.

The sails are half square triangle units. Can't get much easier than that! But don't tell anyone, let's make them think it was very difficult!!!

Yardages are based on 40" wide fabric. All seams are 1/4" unless other wise noted.

Additional tools: 3 - 4 sheets of template plastic 8-1/2" x 11" and some strong tape for attaching the templates together. You will also need an erasable marker of your favorite kind and a fine pen that will write on template plastic. Please read the instructions all the way through before starting this or any other project!!




Making the templates

Make templates before cutting fabric! All the templates include seam allowance as needed.

Making the "whole cloth" bottles:

- 1. Take the (9) 16 1/2" x 12 1/2" background rectangles and starch or size very well.
- 2. With an erasable marker of some sort, mark 2 1/4" from the top and the bottom edges and from the right edge and mark 1/4" away from the left edge as shown in the diagram below for all nine rectangles. Set 5 aside.
- 3. Cut out the whole cloth bottles. Starch well. Turn under the 1/4" seam allowances, clipping as necessary, and press well.
- 4. Lay out on the background rectangles as shown below.
- 5. Stitch around the bottle by hand or machine.
- 6. Turn under 3 sides of the "cork" (bottle top).
- 7. Apply to the top of the bottle neck, extending the side that has not been turned under into the seam.
- 8. Stitch the cork down.
- 9. Make 4: Two aqua and two tan. Set aside.







Making the Sailing Ships:

- 1. There are 5 sailing ships. They are all made the same way, only the color of the sails changes.
- 2. Use 5 sail fabric 3" squares and 5 aqua 3" squares for each sailboat.
- 3. Mark on the wrong side of the aqua squares from corner to corner. Mark a scant 1/4" away from the center line on each side. Sew on each side of the lines and cut apart down the center line.
- 4. Press to the dark and trim to a perfect 2 1/2" square.
- 5. Make 10 units.
- 6. Make 5 of each of the following 2-1/2" square units: B/L, D/L, G/L, H/L, J/L.






- 7. Turn under the diagonal ends of the boat and press. Line up the top edge of the boat with the top edge of the bottle corners. Sew to the bottle corners along the line marked on the template either by hand or machine. Press. Trim away excess.
- 8. Make 5 units.



- 9. Assemble the sailboats as shown below. Mix up the sail placement on the top row of the sails. See the quilt illustration for some choices.
- 10. Make 5 units.






- 11. Using the $5 16 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " background pieces that you set aside before, attach the sailboats in the same manner you attached the whole cloth bottles.
- 12. Add the corks.
- 13. Press well.
- 14. Make 5 units.
- 15. Sew the nine bottle units together as shown in the illustration.
- 16. Measure from top to bottom of the quilt center. It should measure 36 1/2".
- 17. Trim the 2-1/2" strip you cut from the background fabric to your measurement. Sew to the left side of the quilt center.
- 18. Sew 2 of your 1-1/4" background strips together. Make 2.
- 19. Measure from side to side of your quilt center. Trim both 1 1/4" strips to this length. It should measure 50-1/2".
- 20. Sew to the top and the bottom of your quilt center.
- 21. Press seams away from center.
- 22. Set center aside while you make the borders.


Making the borders:


- 23. To cut the border pieces, follow the layouts as illustrated below.
- 24. Remember to cut right and left templates #2!







- 25. Sew a right template #2 triangle to the side of a template #1 triangle.
- 26. Press to the side triangle.
- 27. Add a left template #2 triangle to the other side of #1 triangle.
- 28. Press to the side triangle.
- 29. Make 28 green units and 28 blue units. Square to 6-1/2" 3-5/8"










- 30. To make a border block, sew units together as shown below.
- 31. Make 14 border blocks.



- 32. Take 2 sets of 4 border blocks and sew together.
- 33. Take 2 sets of 3 border blocks and sew together.
- 34. Sew 1 set of three border blocks to each side of the quilt center.
- 35. Add a 6-1/2" square of focus fabric to each end of the 4 border block sets.
- 36. Sew to the top and the bottom of the quilt.
- 37. Make a guilt sandwich. Quilt as desired. Bind. Enjoy!
