Subcut (2) $3-1 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 54^{\prime \prime}$ and (2) $3-1 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 48-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ borders. |

## ADDITIONAL MATERIALS

Thread to match fabrics
Basic sewing supplies

Sewing machine
Rotary cutter, ruler and mat

Template plastic

## Optional:

For turned under edge appliqué: freezer paper or other template paper.
For raw edge appliqué: paper backed fusible webbing.

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## APPLIQUÉ

1. Using your favorite appliqué method, prepare the appliqué pieces. Prepare raw edge appliqué stems in the same way as other raw edge pieces.
2. For turned edge appliqué stems, fold (1) I $1-1 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 5^{\prime \prime}$ strips in half lengthwise with wrong sides together. Sew $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ from fold. Trim raw edge $1 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ from stitching. Press stem flat with seam centered on one side. Make 8.


## CENTER BLOCK

3. Mark diagonal lines on (1) L 9-1/2" square. Align the dashed lines on the Center Block Pattern with the drawn lines on the fabric square and trace the design to the fabric.
4. Fuse, baste or pin (1) J Center Flower, (2) I Large Center Leaves, (4) I Small Center Leaves and (2) I Small Center Leaves reversed to position. Sew along the edge of the pieces.
5. Fuse, baste or pin the $\mathbf{K}$ Center Flower Circle
 to position on the flower. Sew along the edge of the circle. Make 1.

## TULIP SQUARE

6. Mark diagonal lines on (2) $\mathbf{L} 6-3 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ squares. Align the dashed lines on the Tulip Block Pattern with the drawn lines on the fabric square and trace the design to the fabric.
7. Fuse, baste or pin (1) I Stem A in place overlapping the tulip shape approximately $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$. For turned under appliqué, turn under the other end of the stem. Trim the end if needed.
8. Fuse, baste or pin (1) K Tulip, (1) I Large Leaf and
 (1) I Small Leaf to position. Sew along the edge of the pieces. Make 2.

9. Following steps 6-8 trace the Tulip Block Pattern in reverse to (2) $\mathbf{L} 6-3 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ squares. Pin, baste or fuse and sew (1) I stem reversed, (1) $\mathbf{K}$ tulip, 1 I Large Leaf reversed and 1 I Small Leaf reversed in place. Make 2.

## TULIP TRIANGLE

10. Mark a center line on (2) $\mathbf{L} 13-3 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ triangles. Align the dashed line on the Tulip Triangle Pattern with the drawn line and place the bottom dashed line along the edge of the fabric. Trace the design to the fabric triangle.
11. Fuse, baste or pin (1) I Stem B in place overlapping the tulip shape approximately $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$. For turned under appliqué, turn under the other end of the stem. Trim the end if needed.
12. Fuse, baste or pin (1) G Tulip, (2) E Tulips, and (1) I Large Leaf to position. Sew along the edge of the pieces. Make 2.
13. Following steps 10-12, trace the Tulip Triangle Pattern in reverse to (2) L 13-3/4" triangles. Pin, baste or fuse and sew (1) I stem B reversed, (1) G tulip, (2) E tulips and 1 I Large Leaf reversed. Make 2.


## BORDER RECTANGLE

14. Mark the center lines on (4) $\mathbf{L} 4-1 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 10-5 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles. Align the dashed lines on the Border Rectangle Pattern with the drawn lines on the fabric rectangle and trace the design to the fabric.
15. Fuse, baste or pin (1) J Border Flower, (2) I Large Leaves and (2) I Small Leaves to position. Sew along the edge of the pieces.
16. Fuse, baste or pin the $\mathbf{K}$ Border Flower Circle to position on the flower. Sew along the edge of the circle. Make 4.

## PATCHWORK BORDERS

17. Sew (1) H 2-3/4" triangle and (1) H 5" triangle to opposite sides of (1) G 3-1/8" square. Make 1.
18. Sew (2) H 5" triangles to opposite sides of (1) $\mathbf{K} 3-1 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ square. Make 2.
19. Sew (2) H 5" triangles to opposite sides of (1) D 3-1/8" square. Make 1.
20. Sew (1) H 5" triangle and (1) L 2-3/4" triangle to opposite sides of (1) D 3-1/8" square. Make 1.
21. Sew the triangle/square units in steps 17-20 together matching seams. Sew (1) H 2-3/4" triangle and (1) L 2-3/4" triangle to corners to make top and bottom patchwork units. Make 4.

22. Repeat step 17, using (1) K 3-1/8" square.
23. Repeat steps 18-20. Make the number indicated.
24. Sew the triangle/square units in steps 22-23 together matching seams. Sew (1) H 2-3/4" triangle and (1) L 2-3/4" triangle to corners to make side patchwork units. Make 4.

25. Sew (2) top and bottom patchwork units to ends of (1) border rectangle to make top and bottom patchwork borders. Borders should measure 4-1/4" x 48-1/2" including seam allowances. Make 2.
26. Sew (2) side patchwork units to ends of (1) border rectangle to side patchwork borders. Borders should measure $4-1 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 41^{\prime \prime}$ including seam allowances. Make 2.

## QUILT CENTER ASSEMBLY

27. Following the Quilt Layout on page 7, sew (1) D 7-1/4" triangle to each side of the center block to make the center unit. Make 1.
28. Sew (2) $\mathbf{A} 7-1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ triangles to short sides of (4) tulip triangles to make a rectangle unit. Make 4. Sew (2) rectangle units to sides of center unit noting orientation of tulip appliqués and center flower appliqué.
29. Sew (2) tulip squares to ends of (2) remaining rectangles again noting orientation of tulip appliqués. Make 2. Sew to top and bottom of quilt.
30. Sew (2) F 13-3/4" triangles to (1) C 13-3/4" triangle. Sew (2) C 7-1/4" triangles to sides of $\mathbf{F}$ triangles to make a $\mathbf{C / F}$ rectangle unit. Make 4 . Sew (2) $\mathbf{C} / \mathbf{F}$ rectangles to sides of quilt.
31. Sew (1) $\mathbf{F} 7-1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ triangle to (1) $\mathbf{G} 7-1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ triangle to make an $\mathbf{F} / \mathbf{G}$ square. Sew to ends of (2) $\mathbf{C / F}$ rectangle units noting placement of fabrics. Sew to top and bottom of quilt.

## BORDERS

32. Sew (1) B $2^{\prime \prime} \times 38^{\prime \prime}$ border to each side of the quilt. Sew (2) B $2^{\prime \prime} \times 41^{\prime \prime}$ borders to top and bottom of quilt.
33. Sew (1) side patchwork border to each side of the quilt. Sew (2) top and bottom patchwork borders to quilt.
34. Sew (1) A 3-1/4" $\times 48-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ border to each side of the quilt. Sew (2) A 3-1/4" $\times 54^{\prime \prime}$ borders to top and bottom of quilt.

FINISHING: Layer quilt top, batting and backing together to form quilt sandwich. Baste and quilt as desired. Bind using D 2-1/4" strips.
