

А		COUNTRY MOUSE 53473-5 Grape	2 ⁵⁄s	<ul> <li>(5) 5" x WOF strips. Subcut (40) 5" squares; cut each square once diagonally to make (80) HST for Block Assembly.</li> <li>(20) 3" x WOF strips. Subcut the following: <ul> <li>(200) 3" squares. Leave squares whole for Block Assembly.</li> <li>(80) 3" squares; cut each square once diagonally to make (160) HST for Block Assembly.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>


#### **BLOCK ASSEMBLY:**

1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of (200) 3" Fabric A squares.

2. Place each Fabric A square with (1) 3" Fabric B square, RST and edges aligned.

**3.** Sew a ¼" away from either side of the drawn diagonal line on each set of squares. Then, cut along the drawn diagonal lines creating a total of (400) HST units.


**4.** Trim HST units to measure 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished.



**5.** Arrange (5) HST units, (2) 3" **Fabric A** HST, (1) 5" **Fabric A** HST and (1) 9" **Fabric B** HST to form a block. Ensure HST units are oriented correctly before proceeding.

**6.** Sew the block together as shown in the diagrams below. Please note that triangles have been slightly oversized to allow for trimming. Ensure there is a  $\frac{1}{2}$ " seam allowance between the HST unit corners and the long diagonal edge of the block during assembly as indicated with black circles. Arrows indicate pressing instructions. Once complete, the block should measure 8  $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 8  $\frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished.

7. Repeat to create (80) identical blocks.






#### QUILT ASSEMBLY:

8. Arrange blocks in an 8 x 10 grid. Ensure all blocks are turned correctly by referencing the diagram.

9. Sew blocks into (10) horizontal rows. Alternate the direction in which you press the seams in each row.

**10.** Sew horizontal rows together, using pins to align and nestle seams. Press seams downward. Once complete, the quilt top should measure 64 ½" x 80 ½" unfinished.



#### **FINISHING THE QUILT:**

**11.** Sandwich the quilt top with batting and backing. Baste quilt layers together using your preferred method.

- 12. Quilt as desired.
- **13.** Bind quilt using (8) 2 ¼" x WOF **Fabric C** strips.
