

1/4" Seam Allowance Check

Even if you use a ¼" foot, your seam allowance may not be accurate!

To check if your seam is accurate, cut three 1½" x 3" pieces from scrap fabric.

Sew the pieces together along the 3" side, using what you believe is a 1/4" seam.

Press away from the center piece.

Measure.

The center piece should be exactly 1" wide.



If, when you measure, the center is less than 1", your seam allowance is too large.

If it's more than 1", your seam allowance is too small.


Refer to your machine owner's manual for instructions on changing your needle position.

Repeat the test until your center strip measures exactly 1".


Blocks:

Make 16

- 1. Use the technique sheet on page 6 to make Quick HST's using one fabric E and one fabric I $7\frac{3}{4}$ " square. Make 32 HST blue units. HST units should measure $3\frac{1}{4}$ " square.
- 2. Repeat step 1 using fabric C and G 73/4" squares. Make 64 HST yellow units.
- 3. Repeat step 1 using fabric B and fabric F 73/4" squares. Make 128 HST white units.




- 4. Stitch one fabric A $2\frac{1}{4}$ " x WOF strip and one fabric B $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip together to make a stripset. Make four stripsets. Slice into (64) $2\frac{1}{4}$ " pieces.
- 5. Stitch one fabric B $2\frac{1}{4}$ " x WOF strip and one fabric H $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip together to make a stripset. Make four stripsets. Slice into (64) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " pieces.
- 6. Combine the units to make (64) four patch units. Square to 31/4".







- 7. Stitch two blue HST units together with two fabric E $3\frac{1}{4}$ " squares to make a four-patch unit. Make 16 units. Unit should measure 6" square.
- 8. Use the technique sheet on page 7 to make quick corners using the fabric B $3\frac{1}{4}$ " squares, fabric D $3\frac{1}{4}$ " squares and fabric C $3\frac{1}{4}$ " x 6" rectangles. Trim to $3\frac{1}{4}$ " x 6". Make 64 of each unit. Sew the units together in pairs. Unit should measure 6" square.



9. Combine the units from step 6 along with the yellow and white HST's as shown. Make 64. Square to 6".



10. Combine all the units as shown to make the blocks. Make sixteen blocks. Square to 17".





Assembly:

- 11. Use the assembly diagram on page 5 to stitch the blocks together with the fabric B $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 17" rectangles and the fabric D $2\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.
- 12. Stitch eight fabric D 2" x WOF strips together in pairs. Add to the quilt, mitering corners.
- 13. Cut two fabric J $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips in half. Add a whole strip to each end of each piece to make a $2\frac{1}{2}$ strip length. Add to the quilt, mitering corners.



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Finishing:

- 14. Layer, baste and quilt as desired.
- 15. Bind with ten fabric J 21/2" x WOF strips.




Assembly Diagram






Quick Half-Square Triangles (HST)

Layer two sqaures, right sides together, aligning raw edges, with the darker square on the bottom. Place the Quick HST paper on top and pin in place.




Stitch on all the dotted lines beginning at "start" and finishing at "end".




Press.

Cut the outside edge of the square to remove excess.



Cut on the solid lines to separate the HST units. Clip corners off.



Flip over and press fabric triangle outward. Carefully remove paper.

Use HST's as directed in the pattern.




Quick Corners

Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the small squares (black line).


Layer one square, right sides together, on top of the unit/square/rectangle.

Stitch on the drawn line (red line).

Cut away excess, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance.



Press triangle outward.



Repeat as instructed in pattern.



Make 28 copies
