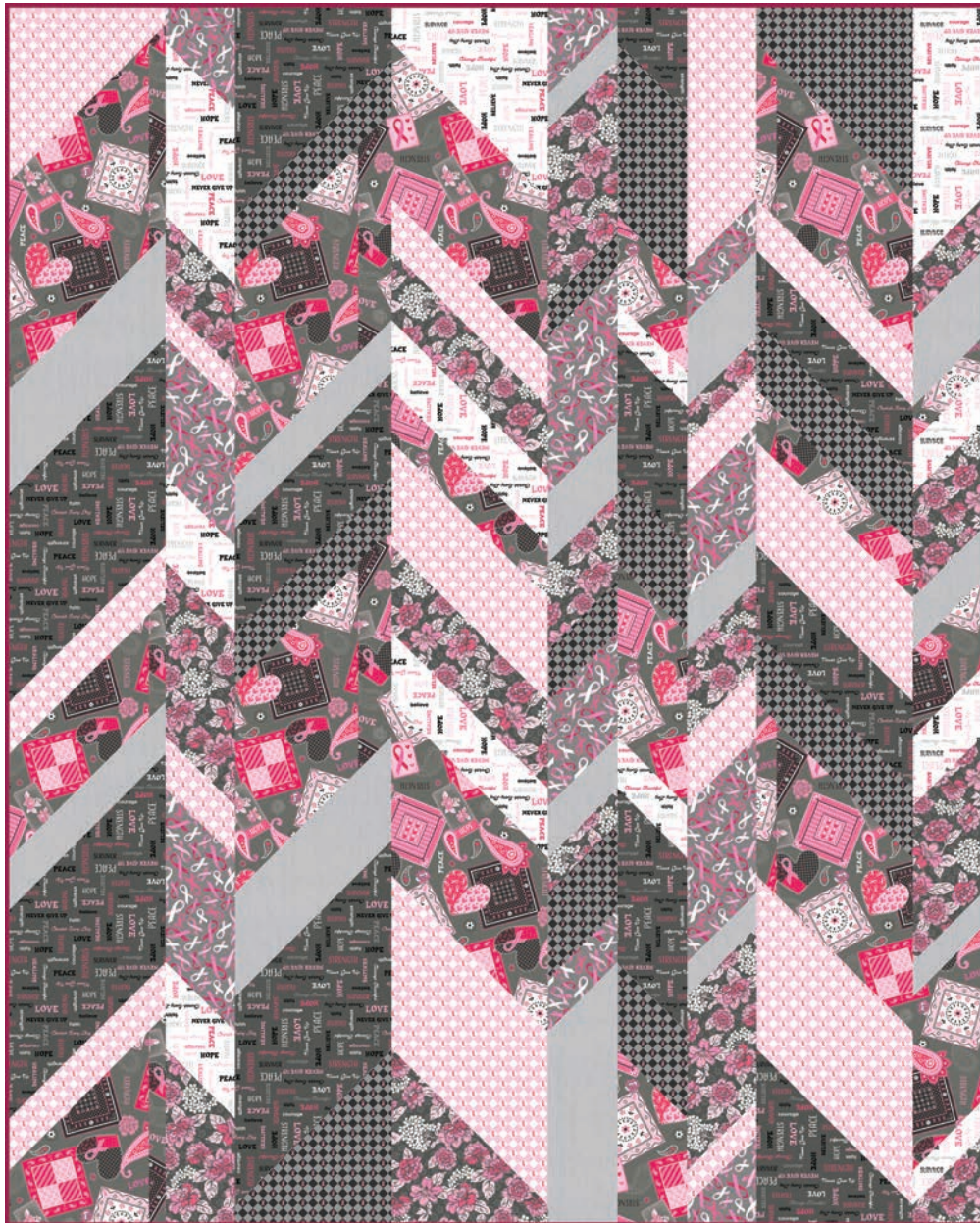









A		53211-3 White	3/4	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• (2) 9-1/2" x width of fabric (WOF) strips.</li><li>• (1) 4 1/2" x WOF strips.</li></ul>
B		53208-2 Charcoal	1-1/4	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• (4) 9-1/2" x WOF strips.</li></ul>
C		40171-109 Grey-White	5/8	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• (1) 9-1/2" x WOF strip.</li><li>• (1) 4 1/2" x WOF strip.</li></ul>
D		53210-2 Charcoal	7/8	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• (3) 9-1/2" x WOF strips.</li></ul>
E		53212-6 Grey	3/8	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• (2) 4 1/2" x WOF strips.</li></ul>
F		53210-3 White	5/8	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• (1) 9-1/2" x WOF strip.</li><li>• (1) 4 1/2" x WOF strip.</li></ul>
G		53209-2 Charcoal	3/4	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• (1) 9-1/2" x WOF strip.</li><li>• (2) 4 1/2" x WOF strips.</li></ul>
H		53211-2 Charcoal	5/8	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• (1) 9-1/2" x WOF strip.</li><li>• (2) 4 1/2" x WOF strips.</li></ul>
I		40171-92 Plum-Fuchsia	5/8	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• (7) 2 1/2" x WOF strips for the binding.</li></ul>
		Backing	3-3/4	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• (2) 64" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together and trim to 64" x 78" for the pieced back.</li></ul>
		Batting		<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• 64" x 78"</li></ul>

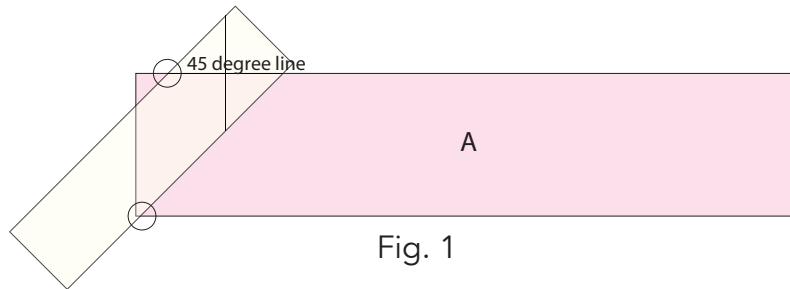

## PATTERN NOTES:

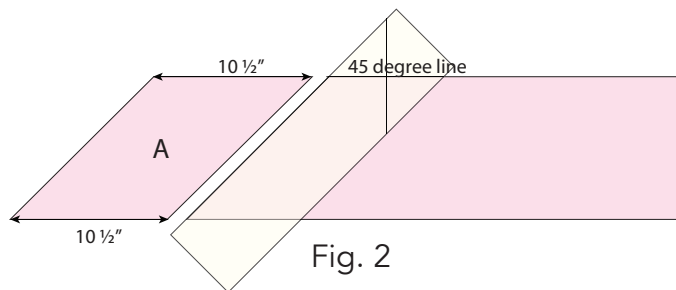
This quilt is made from pieces cut at a 45-degree angle and then sewn into columns. Follow the instructions below on how to cut the various pieces from the strips. Pay attention to the direction of each parallelogram before cutting. Please note, in some cases you will need to cut the 4-1/2" wide pieces from the remaining fabric after cutting the larger pieces from a 9-1/2" strip. Following the cutting diagrams on Pages 3-4 for the key measurements for each piece. For the example below, we will be cutting (1) 10-1/2" parallelogram from Fabric A and (1) End Unit from Fabric B.

## Quilt Top Assembly

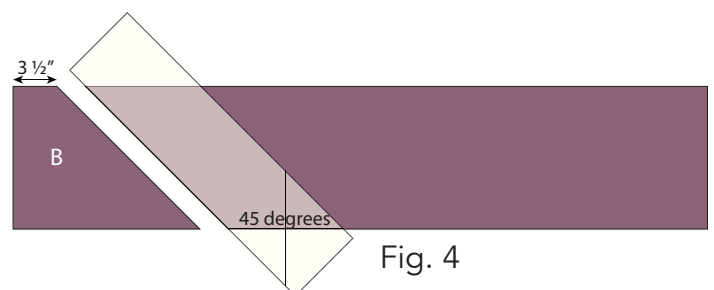
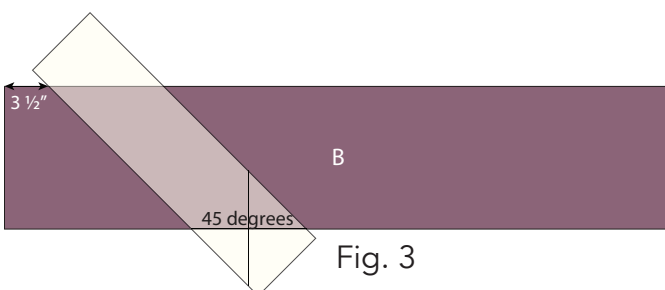
1. Place a ruler with a 45-degree line on the long side of (1) **A** 9-1/2" strip aligning with the lower left corner. Cut along the 45-degree line to create the first side of the right leaning parallelogram (**Fig. 1**).



2. Measure 10-1/2" from the top corner along the long edge of the fabric and mark. Place the ruler on the long side of the fabric at this mark, aligning the 45-degree line with the long edge of the fabric. Make a cut to create the second side of the parallelogram to make (1) **A** 10-1/2" right leaning parallelogram (**Fig. 2**).



3. Refer to **Figures 3-4** to cut (1) left leaning **B End Unit**.





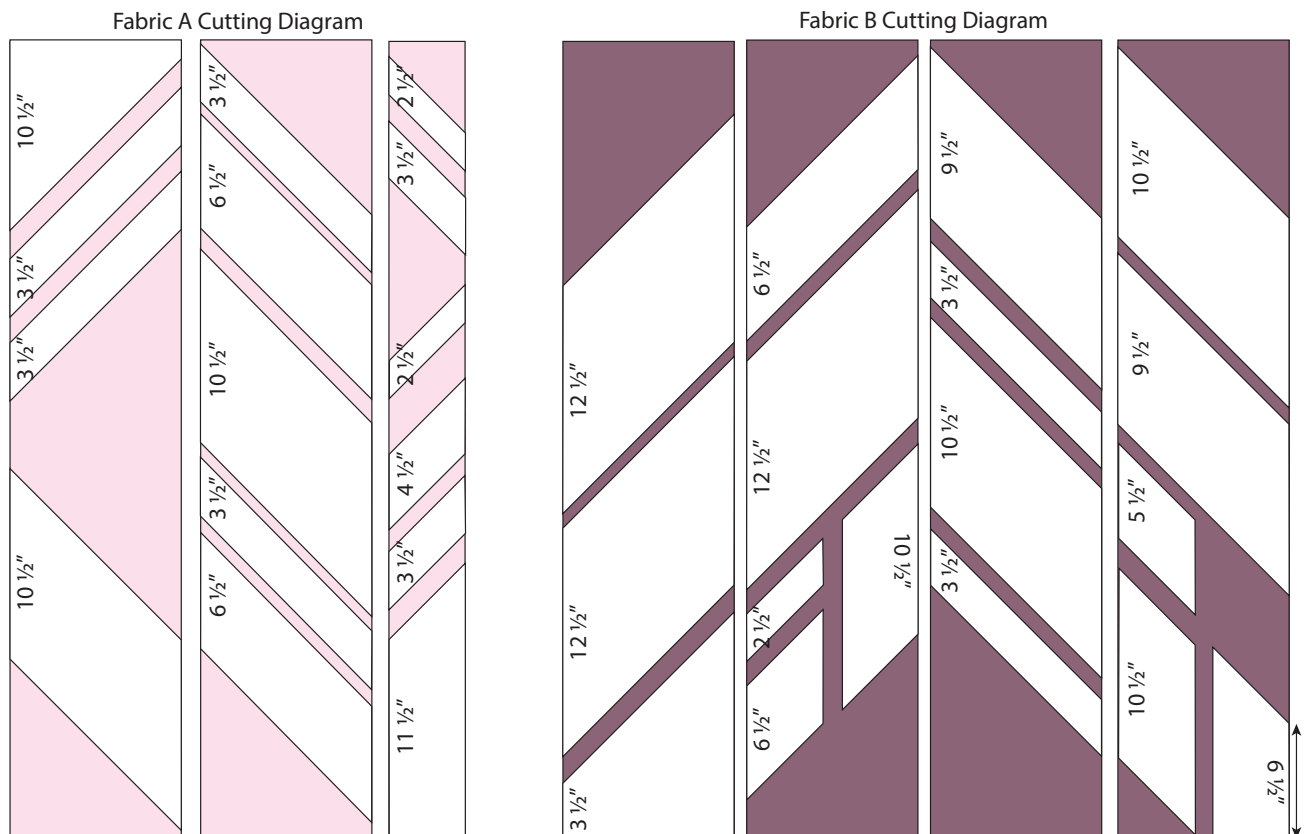

4. Follow the cutting diagrams on **Pages 3-4** for fabrics **A** to **H** to cut the remaining pieces.
5. Refer to the **Quilt Layout** to sew the assorted pieces into (9) **Columns**. Each column should measure approximately 70-1/2" long. This measurement may vary due to the bias nature of the shapes. If your strips vary in lengths, just trim them to all to measure the same length.
6. Sew together the (9) **Columns**, lengthwise and in numerical order from left to right, to make the quilt top.

## Finishing

7. Layer and quilt as desired.
7. Sew the (7) 1 2-1/2" x WOF strips together end-to-end with 45-degree seams to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
8. Bind as desired.

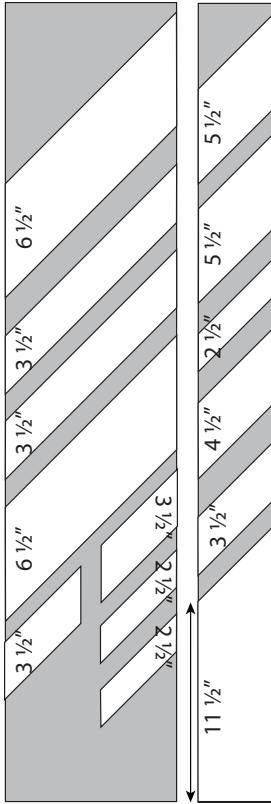




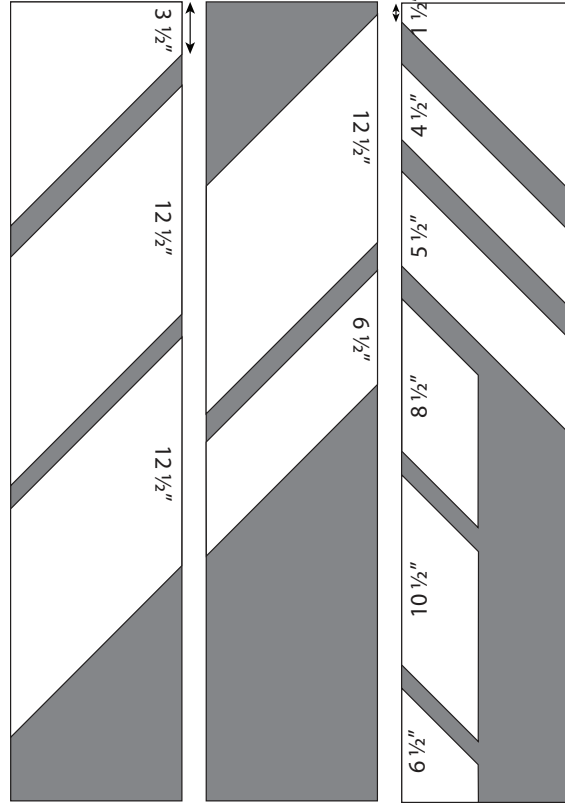

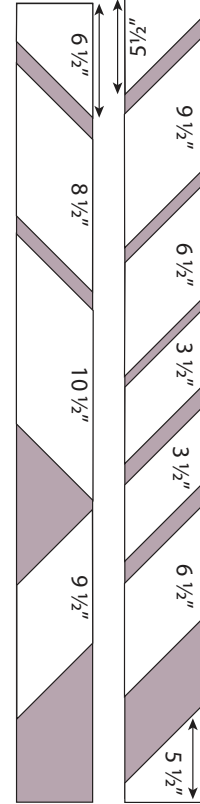
Fabric C Cutting Diagram



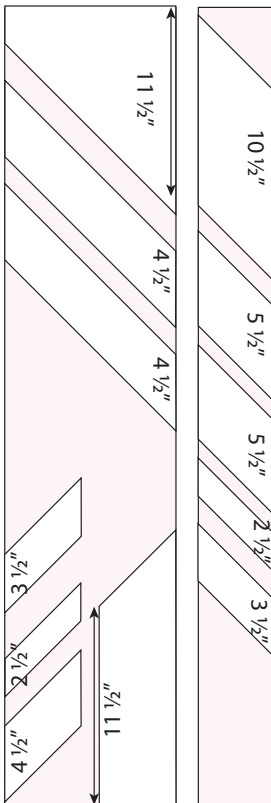
Fabric D Cutting Diagram



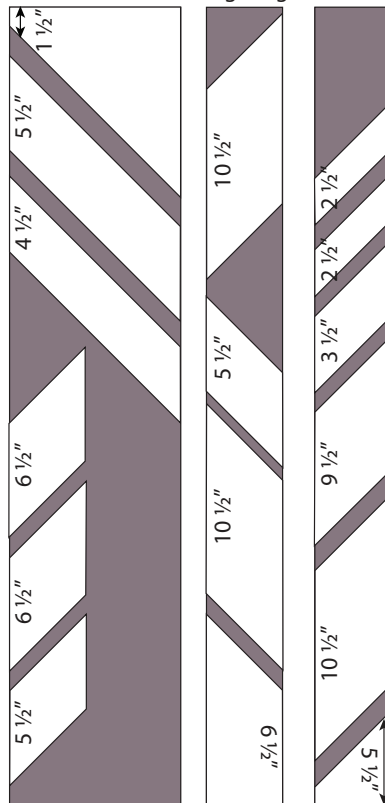
Fabric E Cutting Diagram



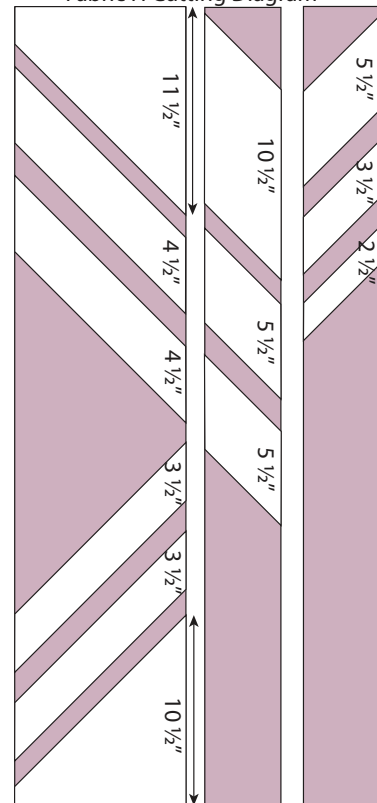
Fabric F Cutting Diagram
