
Sewing Instructions:

1. Fold the Template 1 and 2 pieces in half and gently finger press at the fold to mark the center of each piece.

2. Pin the Template 2 pieces right sides together (with template 2 on top) to the Template 1 pieces according to the chart below, matching ends and centers. Slowly sew the curved seam, easing the Template 1 pieces to match the curved raw edge of the Template B pieces. Press towards the Template 2 pieces and trim the blocks to 6 1/2" square.

3. Press the seam allowances on the long edges of the Template 3 pieces to the wrong side. Pin Template 3 as shown, and appliqué them right side up on the following blocks:




4. Sew the **Fabric A** 24 $1/2" \times 36 1/2"$ rectangles together to make a piece 24 $1/2" \times 72 1/2"$. Sew the **Fabric B** 6 $1/2" \times 36 1/2"$ rectangles together to make a piece 6 $1/2" \times 72 1/2"$.

Finishing

5. Sew the blocks together into horizontal rows as shown in the layout diagram, paying close attention to the orientation and placement of each block. Sew the rows into the quilt center. Sew the **Fabric A** and **Fabric B** rectangles to the sides of the quilt center as shown on pg 3, and press.







6. Make a backing approx 68"x 80" from **Fabric M**.

7. Layer the backing right side down, batting, and quilt top right side up. Baste the layers together and quilt as desired. Trim excess batting and backing even with the quilt top.

8. Piece the 2 1/4" x WOF **Fabric L** strips using diagonal seams to make a continuous binding. Sew the binding around the quilt top. Turn the binding to the back and secure in place by hand or machine. Label and enjoy.
