С	A A	53921-5 linen	1/4	(1) 3-1/4" x 42" strip, subcut (10) 3-1/4" squares, then cut each square diagonally in half twice to make (40) QSTs.
D		53922-3 black	1/4	(2) 2-7/8" x 42" strips, subcut (20) 2-7/8" squares. then cut each square diagonally in half once to make (40) HSTs.

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
MAKE THE BLOCKS

- **1.** Sew together (1) each **B** and **C** QSTs along short edges, noting orientation. Make (40) **B-C** units.
- **2.** Sew (1) **D** HST to (1) **B-C** unit along long edges to make a **B-C-D** block. Square up to measure 2-1/2" square. Make (40).

MAKE THE QUILT CENTER

- **3.** Trace the Eiffel Tower template onto the paper side of fusible web. Cut out 1/2" past the drawn line and fuse to the wrong side of **Fabric H**, following manufacturer's directions. Cut out on the drawn line.
- **4.** Fuse the Eiffel Tower onto the **A** 15-1/2" \times 19-1/2" rectangle, centering it. Use a zig zag or other decorative stitch to secure the applique in place. Trim **A** rectangle to measure 14-1/2" \times 18-1/2".
- **5.** Sew **F** 1" x 18-1/2" strips to opposite sides of the quilt center. Sew **F** 1" x 15-1/2" strips to the top and bottom.
- **6.** Sew **G** 1" \times 19-1/2" strips to opposite sides of the quilt center. Sew **G** 1" \times 16-1/2" strips to the top and bottom.






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ASSEMBLE THE QUILT

- 7. Noting orientation, sew (10) B-C-D blocks into a row. Make (4).
- **8.** Sew block rows to opposite sides of the quilt center. Sew the remaining block rows to the top and bottom.
- **9.** Sew **F** 1-1/2" \times 24-1/2" strips to the opposite sides of the quilt. Sew **F** 1-1/2" \times 22-1/2" strips to the top and bottom.
- **10.** Sew **E** 3" \times 26-1/2" strips to the opposite sides of the quilt. Sew **E** 3" \times 27-1/2" strips to the top and bottom.



FINISHING: Layer quilt top, batting and backing together to form quilt sandwich. Baste and quilt as desired. Bind using **H** 2-1/4" strips.
