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Cutting Notes: Mark and store your cutting pieces according to the block they have been assigned to, as this will make it much easier when you start piecing. Be sure to read the entire pattern before you begin. This pattern requires curved piecing techniques. For more information on curved piecing please visit your favorite quilting or tutorial website.

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## Piecing Instructions

1. Create the following units using curved piecing methods combining Template $A$ (cut from Fabric A) and Template B (cut from Fabrics B, D, F and H).
2. Pair Templates $A$ and $B$ right sides together. Pin both pieces of fabric together at each end of the template as well as in the middle of the template.
3. Using your fingers to smooth the curved edge as you go, slowly sew a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ curved seam to assemble the following units. Use the fabric combinations listed to complete these units:

3a. Combine Template A cut from Fabric A with Template B cut from Fabric B. Repeat to create (16) units using this fabric combination.
3b. Combine Template A cut from Fabric A with Template B cut from Fabric D. Repeat to create (8) units using this fabric combination.

3c. Combine Template A cut from Fabric A with Template B cut from Fabric F. Repeat to create (24) units using this fabric combination.

3d. Combine Template A cut from Fabric A with Template B cut from Fabric H. Repeat to create (16) units using this fabric combination.


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4. Using the curved units created in Steps $1-3$ as well as $5-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares cut from Fabrics A, C, E, G and I, complete the blocks in the following combinations:


4a. Use (4) curved pieces using Fabrics A \& B, (4) Fabric A 5-1/2" squares and (1) Fabric C 5-1/2" square to complete the block shown in the diagram. Repeat to create (4) blocks using this fabric combination.

4b. Use (4) curved pieces using Fabrics A \& D, (4) Fabric A 5-1/2" squares and (1) Fabric E 5-1/2" square to complete the block shown in the diagram. Repeat to create (2) blocks using this fabric combination.

4c. Use (4) curved pieces using Fabrics A \& F, (4) Fabric A 5-1/2" squares and (1) Fabric G 5-1/2" square to complete the block shown in the diagram. Repeat to create (4) blocks using this fabric combination.

4d. Use (4) curved pieces using Fabrics A \& F, (4) Fabric A 5-1/2" squares and (1) Fabric I 5-1/2" square to complete the block shown in the diagram. Repeat to create (2) blocks using this fabric combination.

4e. Use (4) curved pieces using Fabrics A \& H, (4) Fabric A 5-1/2" squares and (1) Fabric I 5-1/2" square to complete the block shown in the diagram. Repeat to create (2) blocks using this fabric combination.

4f. Use (4) curved pieces using Fabrics A \& H, (4) Fabric A 5-1/2" squares and (1) Fabric E 5-1/2" square to complete the block shown in the diagram. Repeat to create (2) blocks using this fabric combination.

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## Quilt Top Assembly

5. Create horizontal sashing rows using (4) Fabric K 2" $\times 15-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ sashing strips and (3) Fabric J 2" squares. Start and end each row with a sashing strip. Sew (1) Fabric J 2" square in between each sashing strip as shown in the quilt layout diagrams. Press seams toward the sashing strip. Repeat to create (3) horizontal sashing rows.
6. Lay out the quilt top according to the quilt layout diagrams. Place (1) Fabric K $2^{\prime \prime} \times 15-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ sashing strip in between each block in the block rows.
7. Sew together horizontal block rows as shown in the diagram. Press seams toward the sashing strips.
8. Sew all block and sashing rows together to complete the quilt top as shown in the quilt layout diagram.

## Finishing

15. With the backing fabric laying taut, place batting and then quilt top to form quilt sandwich.
16. Baste sandwich. Quilt as desired.
17. Bind with Fabric $\mathbf{A}$ to finish quilt.
