

#### Fabric Requirements

40245-x 2.5 yards 40246-1 1/2 yard

40247-3 1 yard 40249-3 3/4 yard

40250-6 1 yard 40251-6 1 yard

40252-1 3/4 yard 40252-5 1/2 yard

White fabric 31835 5/8 yard Black fabric 29003 5/8 yard

### Sewing Instructions

1) For the center blocks fussy cut six  $7.5 \times 7.5$  inch squares from the green horse print. Then cut six  $8.75 \times 8.75$  inch squares of the black and white diamond print. Cut each of the black and white squares in half diagonally twice so you will have

4 triangles from each square. Sew the triangles onto the sides of the green squares, press and trim the block down to 10 3/8 inches. Make 6.





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Sewing Instructions cont.

2) Cut fabric for the flying geese units. From the Orange floral print cut six -11 3/8 x 11 3/8 inch squares. Cut 24 - 6 x 6 inch squares from the green and black diamond print. From the pink and black granny square print cut six -11 3/8 inch x 11 3/8 inch squares. Finally cut 24 - 6 x 6 inch squares of the small white floral. To make the flying geese units I make 4 at a time. This is the way I do it.

Lay the large block face up, and then lay two of the smaller squares face down in opposite corners. Draw a diagonal line on the backs of the smaller squares and sew with a ¼ inch seam on each side of the drawn line. Cut along the drawn line and press blocks.



Place another small square on the triangle block face down in the corner. Draw another diagonal line and sew a ¼ inch seam on either side of the drawn line. Cut along the drawn line. Do the same thing with the other triangle and you will have 4 flying geese units. Trim each Goose to 10 ½ inch x 5 ½ inch. You will have a total of 48 geese (24 orange and green and 24 pink and white).

Sewing Instuctions cont.

3) To make the saw tooth border cut  $20 - 5 \frac{1}{2} \times 5 \frac{1}{2}$  inch squares of both the white and black fabric. Layer the black and white squares and sew all around the outside of the squares with a  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch seam. Cut square in half diagonally twice and press the seam towards the black fabric. Trim each half square triangle to 3 inches. Sew the blocks together in 5 rows of 16 half square triangles.





- 4) Piece four of the flying geese units to either side of the center blocks. Sew saw tooth half square triangle blocks to the bottom of 5 of the flying geese rows. Sew on the final row of flying geese. Now all you have to do is the sashing and borders!
- 5) Cut the sashing; seven (width of fabric) strips 2 ¾ inch wide. Attach to body of quilt.
- 6) Cut border fabric; eight (width of fabric strips 8 inches wide. You will need to piece these long strips of fabric.
- 7) Quilt as desired and bind the quilt with eight 2½ inch strips of double fold binding.
