

C		52214-5	1/2	(2) 5-1/4" x WOF strips. Subcut (12) 5-1/4" squares.
D		52214-6	1/2	(2) 5-1/4" x WOF strips. Subcut (12) 5-1/4" squares.
E		52216-4	1/2	(2) 5-1/4" x WOF strips. Subcut (12) 5-1/4" squares.
F		52216-X	1/2	(2) 5-1/4" x WOF strips. Subcut (8) 5-1/4" squares.
G		50087-68	1-1/4	(6) 2-1/2" x WOF strips for binding. (11) 1-3/4" x WOF strips. Subcut (18) 1-3/4" x 12-1/2" pieces and (18) 1-3/4" x 10" pieces.
H		25029S	1-1/8	(6) 5-1/4" x WOF strips. Subcut (44) 5-1/4" squares.
		Backing	3-1/2	60" square of batting

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
## MAKING THE BLOCKS

1. Sew **G** 1-3/4" x 10" pieces to opposite sides of (1) **A** 10" square. Sew **G** 1-3/4" x 12-1/2" pieces to the top and bottom. Make a total of (5) **A-G** blocks.


2. In the same way, make a total of (4) **B-G** blocks.

## MAKING THE SASHING UNITS

3. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of (1) **H** 5-1/4" square. Place the marked square right sides together on (1) **C** 5-1/4" square. Sew 1/4" on both sides of the drawn line. Cut on the drawn line and press both **C-H** HST units open.




4. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of one **C-H** HST unit. Place the marked unit right sides together on the second **C-H** HST unit, with colors opposite each other as shown. Stitch 1/4" on




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both sides of the drawn line. Cut on the drawn line and press both **C-H** hourglass units open. Square up to measure 4-1/2". Make the indicated number of each combination:



## ASSEMBLING THE QUILT

**5.** Noting orientation of units, sew together (1) each **C-H**, **D-H** and **E-H** hourglass unit. Make a total of (12) vertical pieced sashing units.

**6.** Noting orientation of units, sew together (3) each **C-H**, **D-H** and **E-H** hourglass units, and (4) **F-H** hourglass units into a horizontal sashing row. Make a total of (4) horizontal sashing rows.



**7.** Referring to the Quilt Assembly Diagram and noting orientation, lay out (2) **A-G** blocks and (1) **B-G** block alternating with (4) pieced sashing units. Sew the blocks and units into a #1 row. Make (2) #1 rows.

**8.** Lay out (2) **B-G** blocks and (1) **A-G** block alternating with (4) pieced sashing units. Sew blocks and units into a #2 row. Make (1) #2 row.

**9.** Lay out the #1 and #2 block rows alternating with horizontal sashing rows. Sew the rows together to complete the quilt top.


## FINISHING

**10.** With the backing laying taut, place batting and then quilt top to form the quilt sandwich. Baste the sandwich and quilt as desired.

**11.** Bind using the Fabric **G** strips to finish the quilt.
