## FLYING GEESE UNITS

1. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of (1) $\mathbf{J} 2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square. Place square, right sides together, at a corner of (1) B 2-1/2" $\times 4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle. Sew on drawn line. Trim 1/4" away from sewn line. Open and press to reveal J corner triangle. Repeat with another J square on the opposite corner of the same B rectangle. Make (32).

2. Using J, make a total number of flying geese units in the following fabric combinations:

Make (28)


Make (16) of each.


Make (12) of each.


Make (4) of each.



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3. Sew (16) flying geese units, as shown. Make (4).


Make (4)
4. Sew (8) flying geese units, as shown. Make (8).


Make (8)

## TRIANGLE BLOCK

5. Noting rotation, sew (1) eight-flying geese unit to the right, short side of (1) E triangle.
6. Sew (1) eight-flying geese unit to (1) $\mid 4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square.
7. Sew units from Steps 5 and 6 together.
8. Sew (1) E 5-1/2" $\times 26-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip to the right side and (1) E $5-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 33-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip to the bottom of sewn unit made in Step 7 to complete Block 1. Repeat Steps 5-8 to make (4) total.


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9. Sew triangle blocks to opposite sides of (1) sixteen-flying geese unit. Make (2) block rows. Sew the remaining sixteen-flying geese units to opposite sides of (1) I 4-1/2" square to make a sashing row. Sew the block rows to opposite sides of the sashing row to complete the quilt center. Trim quilt center along outer edges, aligning the ruler $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ outside of the flying geese units indicated in the diagram.
note: begin stitching rows from the center of the quilt, as outside of the rows will not match.
OVERAGES ALLOWED FOR SQUARING UP THE QUILT.

10. Inner Border 1: Measure the quilt center lengthwise across the center. Cut (2) I 3-1/2" strips to that length and sew to opposite long sides of quilt center. Measure the quilt center widthwise across the center, including borders just added. Cut (2) I 3-1/2" strips to that length and sew to remaining long sides of the quilt.
11. Inner Border 2: In the same way, measure, trim and add B $10-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips to the quilt.
12. Outer Border: In the same way, measure, trim and add I $3-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips to the quilt.

FINISHING: Layer quilt top, batting and backing together to form quilt sandwich. Baste and quilt as desired. Bind using I 2-1/2" strips.
