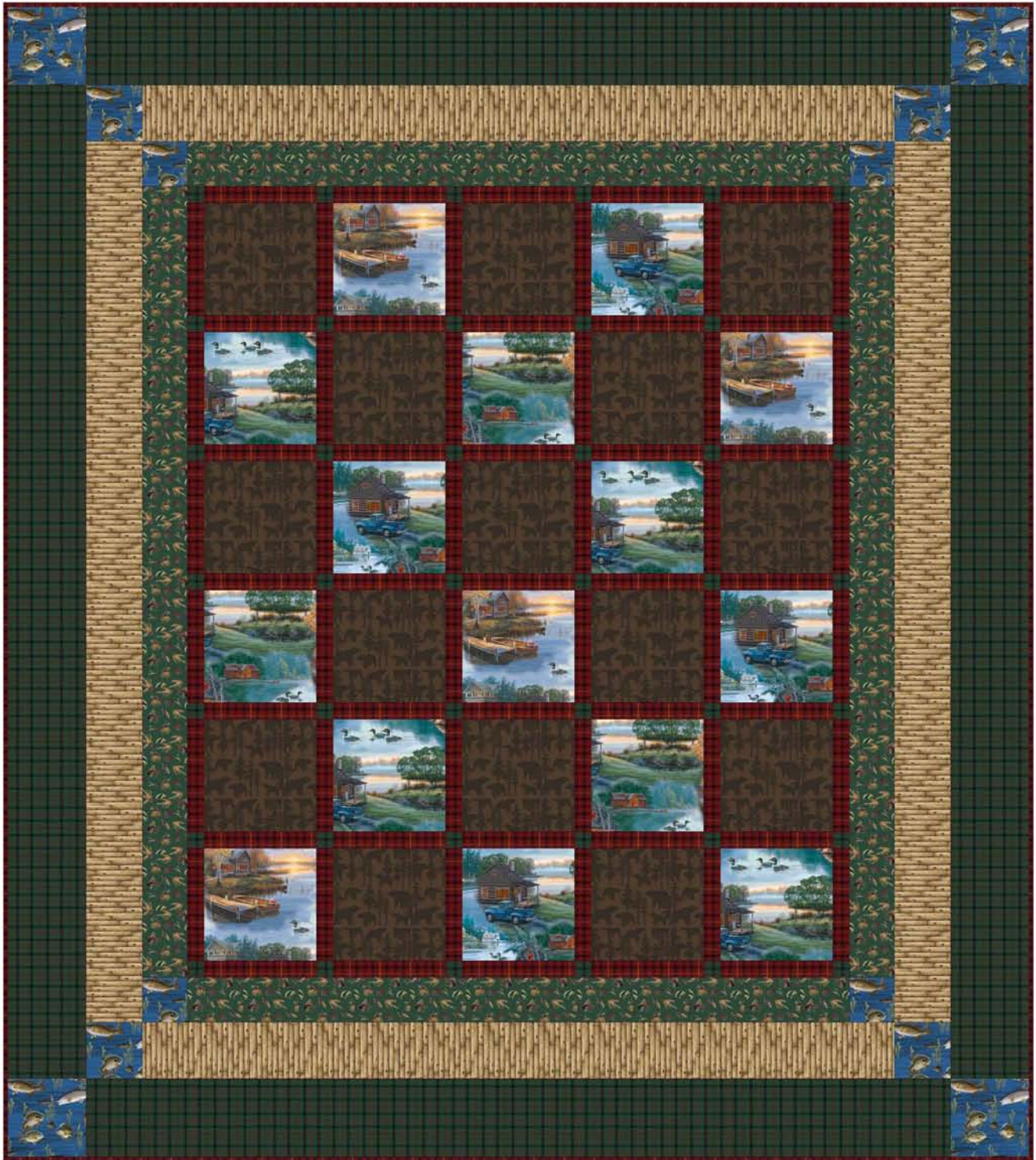


Bears in the Woods

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SAMPLE	KEY/ SKU	QTY	CUTTING FOR THE QUILT
	33214-X	1-1/2 yds +	If fussy cutting the blocks, figure yardage for 15 "motifs" that are 10 1/2" square
	33216-2	2-1/4 yds	Border #1 - Cut on length of fabric
	33217-2	2-7/8 yds	Border #3 and sashing cornerstones - Cut on length of fabric
	33217-4	1-3/4 yds	Sashing and binding
	33218-3	1-1/2 yds	Blocks - Note that fabric is directional.
	33219-1	2-1/2 yds	Border #2 - Cut on length of fabric. Note that fabric is directional.
	33220-X	3/8 yd	Border cornerstones. Note that fabric is directional.

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Cutting the quilt:

1. With the bear fabric, cut 5 strips 10 1/2" wide.
2. Cut into 15 - 10 1/2" squares for blocks.
3. In lake fabric, layout the yardage and fussy cut 15 motifs you like - 10 1/2" square for blocks.
4. In red plaid fabric, cut 4 strips 10 1/2" wide.
5. Cut into 71 strips - 2" wide for sashing.
6. In green fly fishing fabric, cut 2 lengthwise strips 4 1/2" wide to finish 78 1/2" long and 2 lengthwise strips to finish 67" long for borders. Allow extra length for seams and differences in piecing. Do not trim to length until center of quilt is finished.
7. In log cabin fabric, cut 2 lengthwise strips 5 1/2" wide to finish 88 1/2" long and 2 lengthwise strips to finish 77" long for borders. Allow extra length for seams and differences in piecing. Do not trim to length until center of quilt is finished.
8. In green plaid fabric, cut 2 lengthwise strips 7 1/2" wide to finish 102 1/2" long and 2 lengthwise strips to finish 91" long for borders. Allow extra length for seams and differences in piecing. Do not trim to length until center of quilt is finished.
9. In remaining green plaid fabric, cut enough strips 2" wide to cut 42 - 2" squares for cornerstones. In theory, this should be 10 strips, but it depends on how closely the border strips were cut.
10. In fish fabric, cut 1 strip 7 1/2" wide. Cut 4 - 7 1/2" squares for border cornerstones.
11. In fish fabric, cut 1 strip 5 1/2" wide. Cut 4 - 5 1/2" squares for border cornerstones.
12. In fish fabric, cut 1 strip 4 1/2" wide. Cut 4 - 4 1/2" squares for border cornerstones.

Assembling the quilt center:

1. Note that the bear fabric and the lake fabric are directional!
2. Sew a red plaid sashing strip to the left side of the bear and lake blocks. This can be chained pieced quickly. Press seams toward red plaid.
3. Make rows of five blocks each, alternating bear and lake blocks AND alternating rows beginning with a bear or lake block. (Refer to picture.)
4. Sew a sashing strip on the end of each row.
5. Sew 7 horizontal sashing rows beginning and ending with a 2" green plaid square. Alternate a red plaid strip with a green plaid square across the row. Make 5 plaid strips wide. Press seams toward red plaid.
6. Carefully matching seams sew a horizontal sashing strip to the top of each row.
7. Sew the rows together. Finish with the last sashing strip.



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Adding the borders:

1. Measure the center of the quilt vertically and horizontally. These will be the measurements that the borders will be based on.
2. Trim the longer fly fishing borders to the vertical measurement.
3. Mark centers and quarters of border and quilt center and sew to center on each side. Make sure that the centers and quarters meet in the same place on the border so the blocks don't "angle" or get out of alignment.
4. Trim the shorter fly fishing borders to the horizontal measurement. Add the fish cornerstones on each end. Sew to the top and bottom of the center.
5. Repeat for the remaining borders.

Finishing the quilt:

1. Create a sandwich of backing, batting and quilt top.
2. Quilt as desired.
3. Add the binding with 3/8" seam. Hand finish on back.
4. Add a label.
5. Enjoy!
