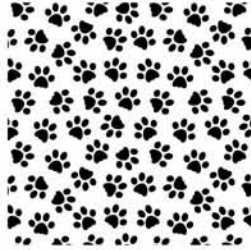
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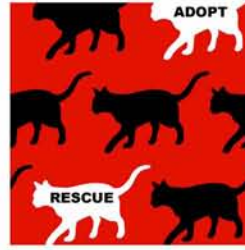

## Fabric Requirements:

4 blocks 39410-X Multi Cat Blocks  
1/4 yard 39411-1 Red  
1/4 yard 35558A-3 Black Paw Print  
1/2 yard 39412-3 Black (includes binding and backing)

## Cutting:

Note: All seams are 1/4" wide

39410-X Multi Cat Blocks

Cut (4) blocks with 1/4" of black around each for seam allowance

39411-1 Red Adopt a Cat print

Cut (2) 14 3/4" x 2 1/2" strips for side outer border

Cut (2) 12 1/2" x 2 1/2" strips for top and bottom outer borders

35558A-3 Black Paw Print

Cut (2) 1 5/8" x 6" strips

Cut (1) 9 1/2" x 1 5/8" strip

Cut (4) 12 1/2" x 1 5/8" strips

39412-3 Black word print

Cut (4) 2 1/2" x 2 1/2" blocks for cornerstones

Cut (2) 2 1/4" x Width of Fabric (WOF) strips for binding

Remaining fabric is for backing

# Cat Crate Quilt

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## Assembly:

*Note: The strips between and around the blocks are generous in length because each block may be slightly different in width or length so you will need to adjust accordingly.*

All seams are 1/4" wide.

1. Take 2 Cat blocks and join to (1) one 1 5/8" x 6" strip paw print. Trim excess length if necessary, Repeat for the other cat block pair.
2. Take the 9 1/2" x 1 5/8" strip and join in-between the 2 rows of cat blocks. Trim excess length if necessary.
3. Take (1) 12 1/2" x 1 5/8" strip and attach to one side and then (1) to the other side. Trim excess length if necessary.
4. Take (1) 12 1/2" x 1 5/8" strip and attach to the top and (1) to attach to the bottom.
5. Take (2) 14 3/4" x 2 1/2" red adopt a cat strips and attach them to each side of the center block.
6. Take (2) black word print squares and attach them to each end of (1) 14 3/4" x 2 1/2" red adopt a cat strip. **\*\*Make sure your length of red strip matches your block center panel width before sewing!!**  
Repeat for the bottom.



7. Take the top, batting and backing and quilt as desired.
8. Take the (2) strips for the binding and join together. Bind off the edges of your quilt and you are ready to donate the quilt to your favorite shelter.

# Cat Crate Quilt

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## Bonus Cat Toy

### Fabric:

Leftover scraps from the crate quilt  
Fiber fill  
catnip (optional)  
2 buttons

### Cutting and Assembly:

Cut out fish following the template at right.  
Using 2 small pieces of the fabric of your choice, put right sides together and cut out the fish.

Stitch using a 1/4" seam all around leaving the center of the tail open for turning.

Clip all curves and trim the seam allowance so that it will be smoother and easier to turn.

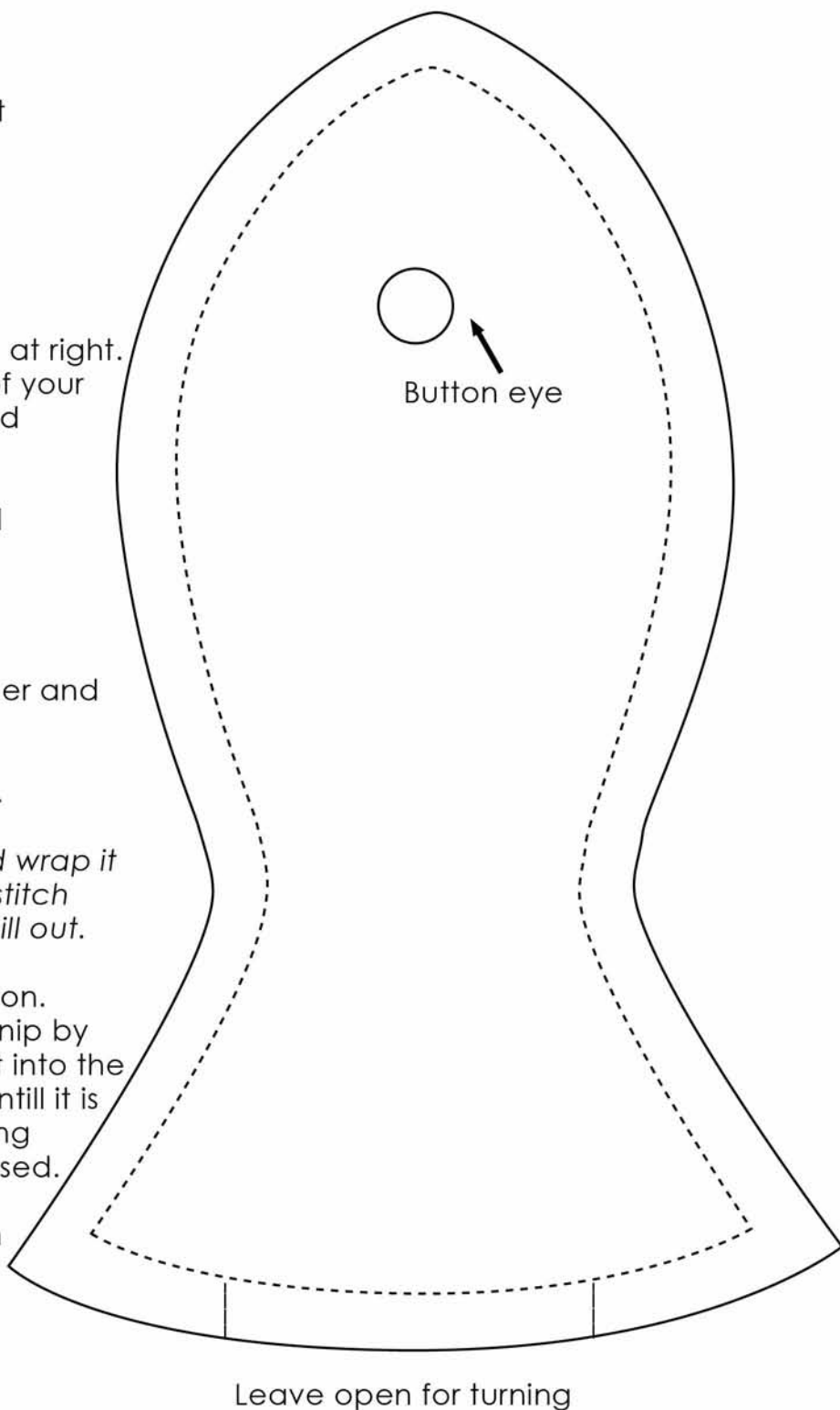
Turn to the right side and press flat.

#### *Optional:*

*Take a small amount of catnip and wrap it in a small amount of fabric. Hand stitch together so the catnip does not spill out.*

Take fiber fill and fill the head portion.  
At this point you can add your catnip by wrapping in fiber fill and inserting it into the fish. Continue to fill with the fiber until it is fat and full. Carefully turn in opening seam allowance and slip stitch closed.

Take the buttons and sew on each side of the fish by sewing through from side to the other.



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
