


Materials requirements:

- -Various Large Prints: 1/2 yard of each of 6 prints (model shows 39521-1 Navy, 39521-2 Citron, 39521-3 Wood, 39522-4 Cream, 39522-5 Pink, and 39422-6 Blue)
- -Various Small Prints: 1/4 yard of each other print besides 39526-4 Cream
- -39526-4 Cream: 2 yards
- -39542-7 Red: 1 yard for binding
- -Additional Print Fabric: 4 yards for pieced backing
- -Batting: 58" X 78"

Cutting instructions:

1. From small-scale prints, cut (72) 2 1/2" squares.

To make the quilt as shown, cut the following:

Red-reading prints (39523-1 Navy, 39523-5 Blush, 39524-7 Red, 39525-7 Red, 39526-7 Red): (15)

total squares

Green 39526-8: (9) squares Citron 39524-2: (13) squares Turquoise 39526-6: (11) squares

Navy prints (939524-1 Navy, 39525-1 Navy): (13) total squares


2. From large-scale prints, cut (17) 10.5" squares (Block B)

To make the quilt as shown, cut the following:


- (3) squares each from 39521-1 Navy, 39521-2 Citron, 39521-3 Wood, 39522-5 Pink, and 39522-6 Blue
- (2) squares from 39522-4 Cream

Piece the square-in-square blocks (Block A):


1. From (2) 2 1/2" squares and (1) 1" by 2 1/2" rectangle, piece a rectangle measuring 2 1/2" by 5". (Diagram 1)



2. From (2) 2 1/2" by 5" pieced rectangles and (1) 1" by 5" rectangle, piece a square measuring 5" by 5". (Diagram 2)




3. Sew two 5" by 3 1/4" cream rectangles to opposite sides of this 5" by 5" square to create a rectangle measuring 5" by 10 1/2". (*Diagram 3*)






4. Sew two 10 1/2" by 3 1/4" rectangles to opposite sides of this 4" by 10 1/2" rectangle to create a 10 1/2" by 10 1/2" square. (Diagram 4)



5. Repeat to create (18) total square-in-square blocks (Block A).

Piece the blocks together and finish the quilt:

- 1. This pattern refers to the square-in-square blocks as *Block A* and the solid fabric blocks as *Block B*.
- 2. For rows 1, 3, 5, and 7, alternate blocks as follows: A-B-A-B-A; stitch together along short edges. (*Diagram 5*)




3. For rows 2, 4, and 6, alternate blocks as follows: B-A-B-A-B; stitch together along short edges. (Diagram 6)

4. Lay out rows 1-7 in order and stitch together along long edges. (Diagram 7)



5. Layer, baste, and quilt as desired. Bind using your favorite method.
