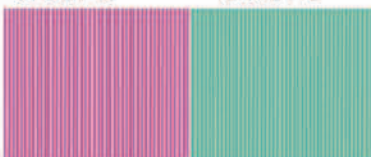
Border #1 - Cut lengthwise borders 2 @ 1" x 58 1/2"

Border #3 - Cut lengthwise borders 2 @ 1" x 62 1/2"
2 @ 1" x 44 1/2"

Border #5 - Cut lengthwise borders 2 @ 1" x 67 1/2"
2 @ 1" x 49 1/2"

ALLOW EXTRA FOR MITERS & DIFFERENCES IN PIECING!

Note: Size or starch heavily to stabilize the narrow strips.

Background of flowers - Cut 6 strips 9 1/2" wide x WOF.
Cut 24 - 9 1/2" squares from strips.

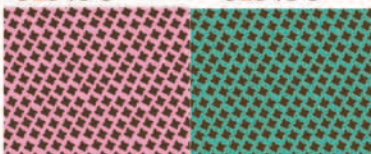

Flower petals - Using template, cut 48 petals.

Flower petals - Using template, cut 24 petals.

Flower centers - Using template cut 24 - quarter circles or 6 - whole circles. (See instructions.)
Binding - Cut 7 strips 2 1/2" wide x WOF. Join with diagonal seams.
Fold in half and press well.



Additional supplies needed:

Template plastic, Fusible web, Spray sizing or starch

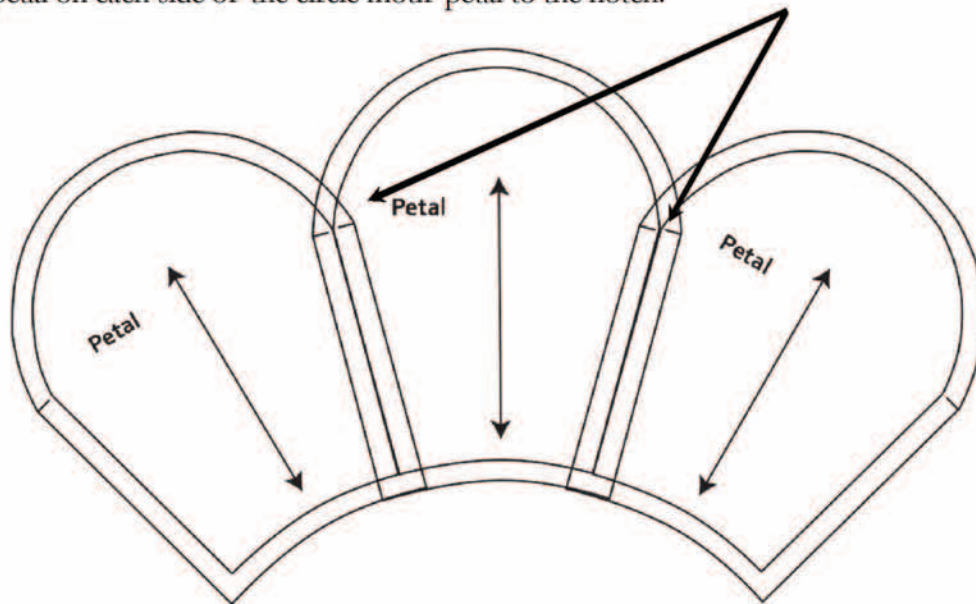
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Every year gardeners from all over the world travel to London to see the Chelsea Flower Show. This year it was all about green living. The wonderful flowers in the Chelsea Collection by Whistler Studios bring an equally contemporary garden into your quilt and your home. Who wouldn't want to curl up in this flower bed!

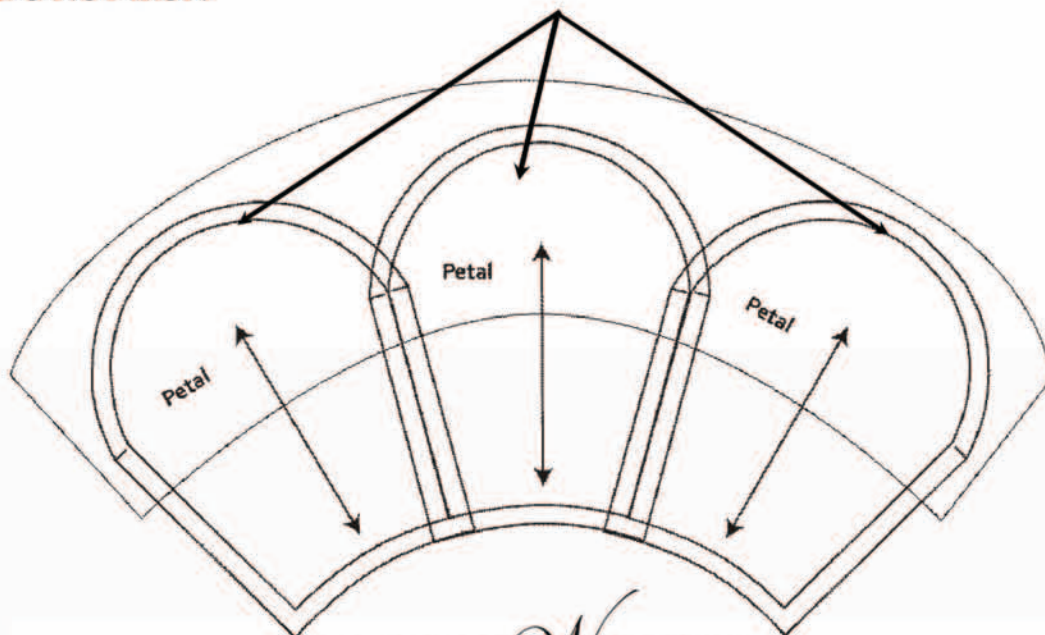
Making the quilt:

Note: Check scale of templates when you print them out. The straight edge of the quarter circle should measure 5" including the seam allowances. Adjust as necessary.

1. Cut the petal shape and quarter circle out of template plastic. Notch as indicated. *(Template is on page 5)*
2. Sew a dotted petal on each side of the circle motif petal to the notch.



3. Cut a strip of fusible web bigger than the top of the petals. Lay the FUSE side on the right side of the petals.
4. Carefully sew along the top curves of the petals down to where the seams stopped at the notches. Clip into the corners. DO NOT IRON.

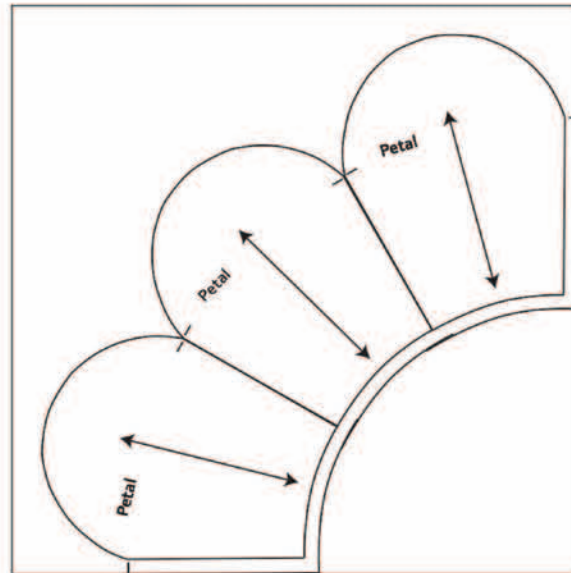


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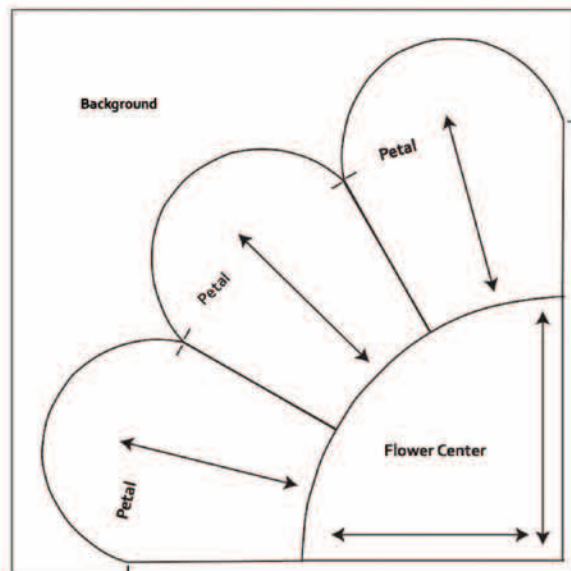
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5. Trim the fusible even with the petals and turn right side out. The fuse side of the fusible web should be on the outside of the piece now. Finger press well.
6. Lay the edges of the petals along the sides into the corner of the 9 1/2" background square. Fuse petals to square. (You can iron now!)
7. Trim the background away from behind the petals.



8. Using the same technique as the petals, finish the edge of the quarter circle.
9. Carefully line up the edges of the quarter circle with the petal edges, overlapping 1/4" and fuse into place.
10. Make 4. Sew together to form flower. See picture of finished quilt.



Alternate method:

- a. Make 4 sets of petals.
- b. Sew sides together to form a circle.
- c. Instead of a quarter circle, make a whole circle.
- d. Finish the edge of the circle.
- e. Center the circle in the petals and fuse into place. Make 6.

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11. Top-stitch around the edge of the petals, using a decorative stitch if desired.
12. Make 6 complete flower blocks.
13. Sew three rows of two flowers each.
14. Join the rows to complete the quilt center.
15. Add the borders in numerical order, mitering the corners.

Alternate method:

- a. Allow extra yardage for borders 1-5 for this method.
- b. Make strip sets of the borders.
- c. Add to quilt edges, mitering all the corners. It is harder to make the corners meet in this method, but you only have to miter once in each corner.

Finishing the quilt:

1. Make a sandwich of the backing, batting, and quilt top.
2. Quilt as desired.
3. Trim and square up quilt.
4. Add binding around edge.
5. Enjoy your new garden...without mud!
