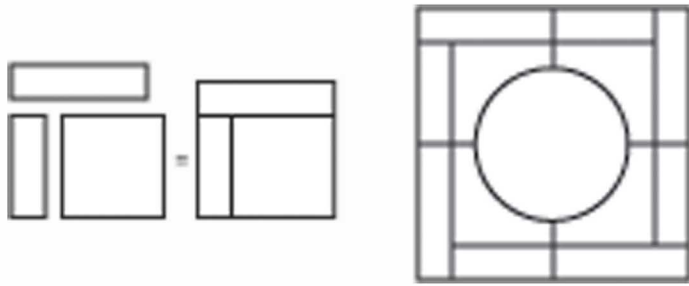


Diagram to show assembly of blocks as described Step 5

## Fabric Collection by Anna Griffin

Skill Level: Intermediate  
Finished Quilt Size: 60" x 60"  
Block Count & Size: 9 blocks 16" square

### Fabric Requirements:

Fabric A 1-1/4 yd SKU# 29253-2  
Fabric B 1-1/2 yd SKU# 29260-3  
Fabric C 2/3 yd SKU# 29262-1  
Fabric D 1-1/3 yd SKU# 29262-3  
Fabric E 2/3 yd SKU# 29258-2  
Fabric F 2/3 yd SKU# 29258-6  
Fabric G 3-3/4 yd SKU# 29259-3

### Cutting:

Fabric A (9) fussy cut 9" circles using the wavy (pinking) blade on your rotary cutter  
Fabric B (7) approximately 6-1/2" x width of fabric (wof) strips, fussy cut to match zig-zag pattern when the strips are sewn together end-to-end for borders. After joining strips recut into (4) 61-1/4" border pieces.  
Fabric C (3) 6-1/2" x wof strips, recut into (18) 6-1/2" squares  
Fabric D (3) 6-1/2" x wof strips, recut into (18) 6-1/2" squares  
(7) 2-1/4" x wof strips for binding  
Fabric E (8) 2-1/2" x wof strips, recut into (18) 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" pieces and (18) 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" pieces  
Fabric F (8) 2-1/2" x wof strips, recut into (18) 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" pieces and (18) 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" pieces  
Fabric G (2) pieces 64" x wof sew together selvage-to-selvage then cut to 64" square for backing

Fusible web for applique  
Wavy (pinking) blade for rotary cutter circles

### Sewing:

1. Sew a fabric F 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" strip to one side of a fabric D square. Sew a fabric F 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" strip to an adjacent side of the same fabric D square. Make 18
2. Sew a fabric E 2-1/2" x 6-1/2" strip to one side of a fabric C square. Sew a fabric E 2-1/2" x 8-1/2" strip to an adjacent side of the same fabric C square. Make 18.
3. Sew 2 D/F squares and 2 C/E squares together to make a Four Patch block. Make 9.
4. Following manufacturer's directions fuse then applique (use a tightly spaced running stitch on your sewing machine) each fussy cut fabric A circle to the center of each of the blocks made in steps 1 through 3.
5. Sew the blocks together in 3 rows of 3 blocks each, keeping the red/blue squares in the Four Patch in the same direction in each row. Sew the rows together.
6. Center and sew the 61-1/4" fabric B borders to each side of the quilt with an equal amount of border fabric overlapping at each end. Miter the corners and trim away excess fabric.

### Finishing:

7. Layer the quilt top, batting and backing. Baste, then quilt the layers together.
8. Sew the binding strips together end-to-end, fold over lengthwise and sew to quilt top. Turn binding to back of quilt and stitch in place.
