

Dresden Petals

Finished Size: 56" x 56"

Finished Block Size: 14" x 14"

Materials List:

Fat eighths of 16 -20 assorted 1930's reproduction prints

3-1/2 yards white or neutral background fabric

1/2 yard red print for binding

60" square piece of batting

60" square backing fabric

Cutting Instructions:

- 1. From the assorted 1930's prints, cut 256 Piece A using the template provided
- 2. From the background fabric, cut (16) 15" squares and (16) 2-1/2" circles using Template B
- 3. From the red print, cut (6) 2-1/4" strips

Sewing Instructions

- 1. Sew four sets of four petals together for each block, backstitching at the bottom to secure and sewing to the line marking the beginning of the curve. Complete the unit by joining the four pieces together to make a circle.
- 2. Fold the background blocks in half both horizontally and vertically and press lightly to find the center of the sides.
- 3. Lay the Dresden Petals unit on the background block, centering the side seams on the pressed centers of the block.



- 4. Clip the curved edge and turn under. Using your favorite method, applique the blocks in place by hand or machine.
- 5. Applique the circle to the center of the motif, again using your favorite method.
- 6. Trim the blocks to measure 14 1/2" and join them together in rows of four blocks. Sew the rows together to complete the quilt top.
- 7. Layer backing, batting and quilt top and quilt as desired.
- 8. Trim the top and bind with the red strips.
