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Table Runner Yardage and Cutting Instructions (All seam allowances are ¼ inch and included in measurements.)

Fabric Picture	Quantity	Fabric Number	Placement of Fabric	Cutting
	1/2 yard (Directional Fabric)	39761-X Multi	Blocks	Fussy cut 5 – 6 ½” blocks on point.
	1/2 yard (Directional Fabric) (Pieced Borders)	39762-1 Red	Second Border	First cut lengthwise 2 – 3” x 17 3/8” pieces for sides. Then cut (WOF) 3 – 3” strips. Join to make 2 – 3” x 52” top and bottom borders.
	1/2 yard (Directional Fabric) (Pieced Borders)	39764-2 Tan	Outer Border	First cut lengthwise 2 – 3 ½” x 17 3/8” pieces for sides. Then cut (WOF) 4 – 3 ½” strips. Join to make 2 – 3 ½” x 63” borders.
	1/3 yard	39765-1 Red	Setting Triangles  Corner Triangles	Cut 2 - 9 ¾” squares. Cut twice diagonally.  Cut 2 – 5 1/8” squares. Cut once diagonally.
	1/4 yard	39766-5 Green	Sashing	Cut 4 – 1 ½” strips. Recut 20 – 1 ½” x 6 ½” sashing pieces.
	1/4 yard (Pieced Borders)	39766-6 Sand	First Border	Cut 3 – 1 ½” strips. Join to make 2 – 50” x 1 ½” strips and 2 – 12 3/8” x 1 ½” strips.
	1/8 yard	39767-4 Gold	Cornerstones	Cut 1 – 2 5/8” strip. Recut into 3 – 2 5/8” squares. Cut twice diagonally. Yields 12 triangles. Cut 4 – 1 ½” squares.
	3/8 yard (Directional Fabric)	39764-3 Black	Binding	Cut 5 – 2 ¼” strips. Join for binding.

Also needed: 1 1/2 yards for pieced backing and quilt batting measuring 26” x 66”.

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## Making the Table Runner Center

Make one left unit.



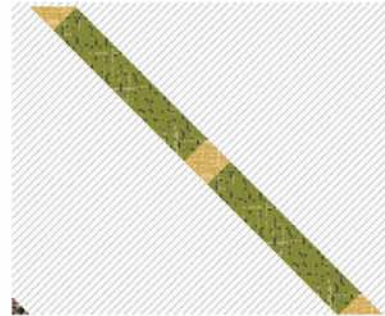
Make three center units.



Make one right unit.



Make four sashing strips.



Make two triangle end units.



Join units together alternating with sashing strips and finish with end triangle units.



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Adding Borders

For the first border add the top and bottom pieces first, then the sides.





Repeat for the second border.

For the outer border add the sides first and then the top and bottom pieces.

Make quilt sandwich. Quilt as desired. Join binding strips and add to quilt.

## Making Trivet

### Trivet Fabric Yardage and Cutting Instructions – Foundation Pieced

Fabric Picture	Quantity	Fabric Number	Placement of Fabric	Cutting
	Fat Quarter	39763-X Multi	Inside Basket  Backing	For A2 cut 1 – 8” x 6” rectangle.  Cut 1- 12” square.
	1/8 yard	39767-1 Red	Basket Handle and Stripes	For A1 cut 1” x 6”. For A3 & A4 cut 2 – 1” x 4”. For A5 & A8 cut 2 – 2” x 6”. For B1, B3, & B5 cut 3 – 1 1/2” x 9”.
	Fat Quarter	39764-2 Tan	Background for Basket	For A6 & A9 cut 2 – 3” squares. For A7 & A10 cut 2 – 2” x 6”. For B7 & B8 cut 2 – 4” x 6”.
	1/8 yard (Binding can be cut from table runner scrap.)	39766-5 Green	Basket  Binding	For B2, B4 & B6 cut 3 – 2” x 10”.  For binding cut 1 – 2 1/4” strip.

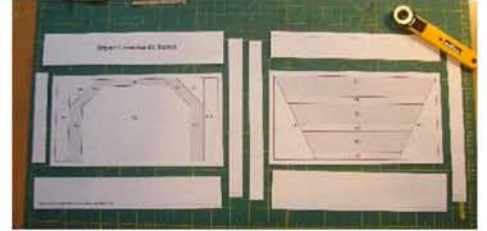
Additional Material Needed: Foundation Paper and Glue Stick and 12 inch square of Heat Resistant Quilt Batting.

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## Making the Trivet Block

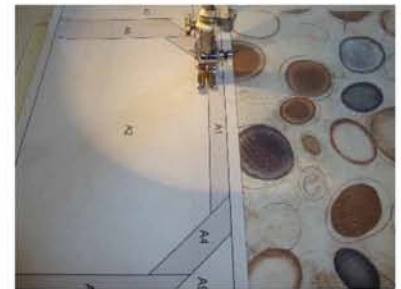
1. Print both parts of the foundation pattern. Each half of the pattern must measure 9 ½" x 5" including seam allowances. After printing foundation pattern trim pattern leaving the seam allowances.



2. Put the first A1 fabric piece on the back of the foundation paper using a dab from glue stick. You can check your fabric positioning by holding your foundation paper pattern with the fabric up to a light. Reposition as necessary.



3. Pin A2 on top of A1 with right sides together and stitch on the line on the front of the pattern. (No glue used beyond this point.)



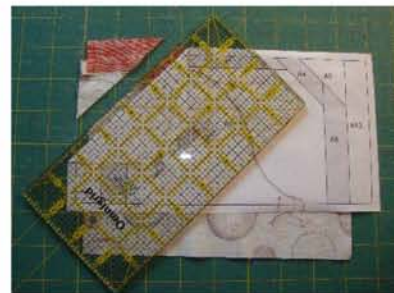
4. Press away from seam line. Fold paper back on the sewing line (A3). Trim leaving a quarter of an inch seam allowance. This will assist in aligning the next piece.

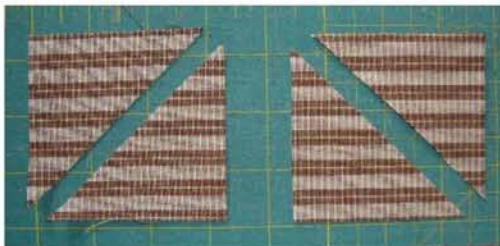
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- Using the same steps sew fabric pieces A3 and A4, A5 and A8. This completes the handle.



- Before sewing background pieces A6 and A9 cut the two squares diagonally as pictured. This makes the letters in the print read correctly. Press, fold, trim, and align each piece before sewing.



- Add the background pieces A7 and A10 in the same way. Press, fold, trim, and align each piece before sewing. This completes the top half of trivet.

- Using the B foundation and fabric pieces, construct the basket in the same manner as the top starting with B1 and continue to add pieces in numerical order. Cut B7 and B8 rectangles as pictured. (You may prefer to make your own template using clear plastic by tracing the foundation shapes B7 and B8. Remember to add the quarter inch seam allowance on the diagonal edge. This can make the letter alignment straighter.)

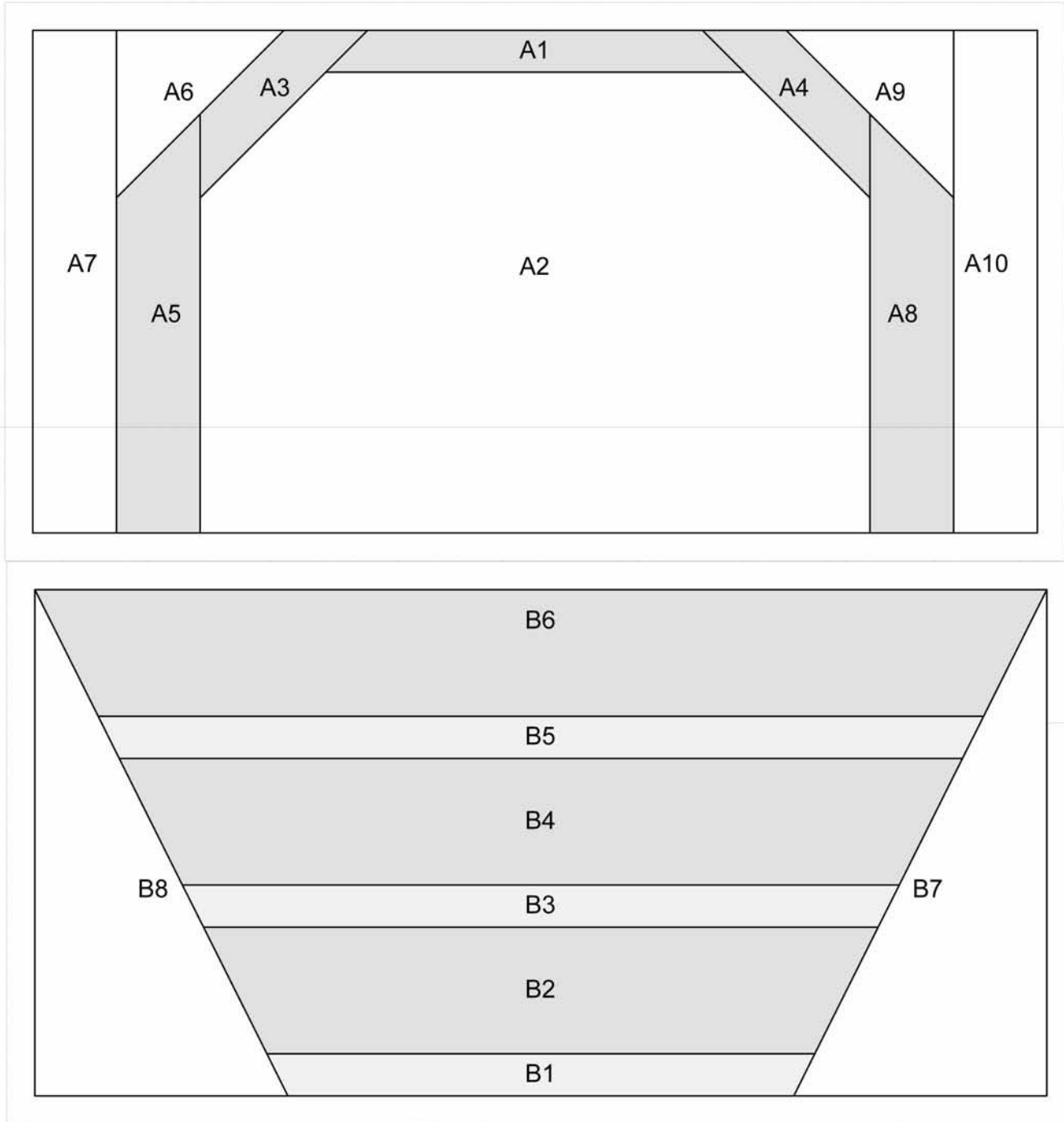


- Make quilt sandwich. Quilt as desired. Finish by adding binding.
