



Cutting guide: Cut 5 triangles out of the 7" strip.

Assembling the Quilt:

Center Section

- Sew the pink border strips and then the stripe border strips to the Center Section. Press seams out.
- Preparing the Circles: The circles can be raw edge fused, pieced or appliquéd to the center. The following directions are for freezer paper circles, machine sewn to center section.
 - a. Cut from freezer paper: 4 10" circles; 5 8" circles; 4 5" circles;
 13 2" circles. (I stack 3 or 4 layers of freezer paper together,
 trace the circle on top layer, then pin and cut with scissors
 specifically for cutting paper.)
 - Iron the freezer paper circles to the wrong side of fabric. (Three sizes for each of the indicated fabrics and one middle size circle from main fabric
 - c. Cut out fabric circles leaving at least a ½" seam allowance.
 - d. Sew using basting (long) stitch length around each circle1/4" away from edge of circle, leaving thread tails for pulling.
 - e. Pull thread, gathering fabric evenly around the freezer paper. Press the edge, ironing out any pleats.
- 3. Sew the pink and blue 2" circles to the center of each of the other circles

Sewing the Circles:

- a. Pin the circle in place.
- Then machine stitch around the edge of the circle using small stitches.
- Turn over and cut away the fabric inside the stitching line leaving
 inch seam.
- d. Pull out paper by gentle pulling until you find the bias and the paper comes away from the seam.

5. Place the rest of the circles on the center section according to the placement guide or place center section on your design wall and arrange circles to your liking. Sew in place following the previous directions in #4.

Pieced Border Instructions


1. Sew two blue triangles to one green square. Make 10.



2. Sew one blue triangle to one green triangle. Make 4.



3. Sew one green triangle to one blue triangle. Make 4.



4. Assembly top and bottom border. Make two of the following: Sew two triangle sections to 3 large triangles. Sew a #2 section to one end and a #3 section to the other end with the green triangle facing out as shown. Sew a blue square to each end. Press.



- Side borders. Sew 3 triangle sections to 4 large triangles. Add the smaller triangle sections to each end.
- 6. Sew the side borders to the center section matching seams. Press.
- 7. Sew the top and bottom sections to the center section. Press.



Finishing the Quilt

- Divide backing into 2 lengths. Join panels lengthwise, Seam will run horizontally.
- 2. Layer backing, batting, and quilt top. Use temporary fabric spray adhesive for basting. Quilt as desired.
- 3. Join 2 ¼ "wide strips into 1 continuous piece for straight-grain French-fold binding. Fold lengthwise and press. Trim and square quilt. Sew binding to quilt with a quarter inch seam. Either hand stitch in place; or turn, press, and machine stitch in the ditch.
