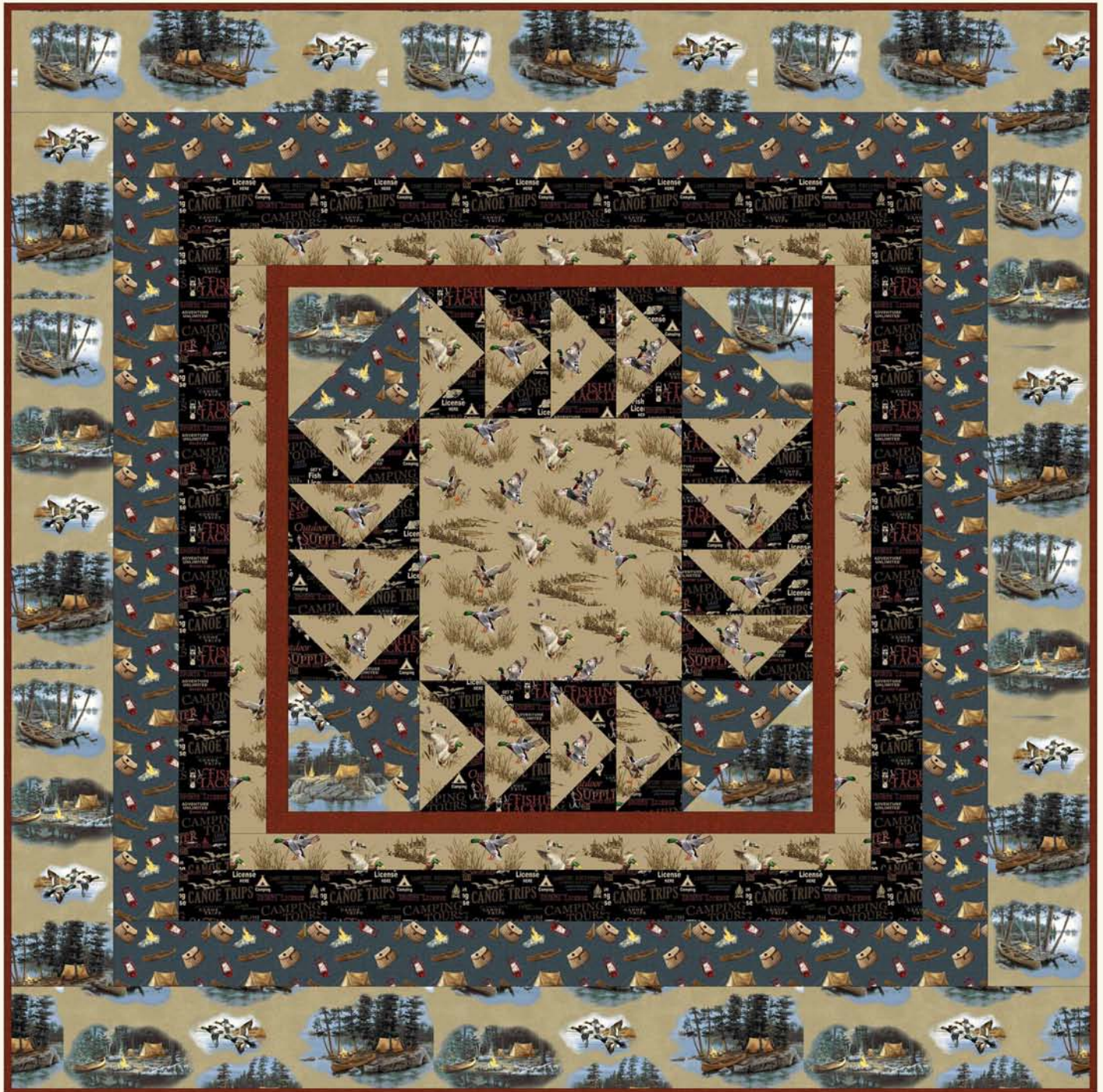

WINDHAM FABRICS

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FABRIC REQUIREMENTS:

SAMPLE	KEY/ SKU	QTY	CUTTING FOR THE QUILT
	35477-X	3 yds	Border #5, center corners
	35476-1	1 3/4 yds	Border #2, center, flying geese blocks
	35480-5	2 1/8 yds	Border #4, center corners
	35478-2	1 3/4 yds	Border #3, flying geese blocks
	35453-1	1 1/4 yds	Border #1, binding
	32409A-X	4 1/2 yds	Backing

•CUTTING THE QUILT•

Cutting is based on fabric 41" wide after the selvages are trimmed off.
All seams are 1/4" unless otherwise noted. Use a scant 1/4", how scant depends on how thick your thread is.

CUT BORDERS FIRST. CUT STRIPS/PIECES FROM REMAINDER OF WOF.












Cutting diagrams are not to scale. For layout only.



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SAMPLE	Placement/Cutting
	<p>Border #5 - Fabric is directional!</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> •Cut 2 strips lengthwise 60 1/2" x 7 1/2" (Add a little extra for differences in piecing.) •Cut 4 strips crosswise 7 1/2" x WOF. Seam together and cut into 2 strips 74 1/2" x 7 1/2" (Add a little extra for differences in piecing.) <p>Center Corners -</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> •Cut 2 squares 10" x 10". 
	<p>Border #2 - Fabric is directional!</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> •Cut 2 strips lengthwise 39 1/2" x 3" (Add a little extra for differences in piecing.) •Cut 3 strips crosswise WOF x 3". Seam together and cut into 2 strips 44 1/2" x 3". (Add a little extra for differences in piecing.) <p>Center Block -</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> •Cut 1 square 18 1/2" x 18 1/2". <p>Flying geese block - The direction on the fabric doesn't matter.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> •Cut 6 strips 5" wide (cut 2 from WOF below borders and 4 in remainder after lengthwise borders are cut). Cut into 16 rectangles 9 1/2" x 5". 
	<p>Border #4 - Fabric is directional!</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> •Cut 2 strips lengthwise 51 1/2" x 5" (Add a little extra for differences in piecing.) •Cut 3 strips crosswise WOF x 5". Seam together and cut into 2 strips 60 1/2" x 5" (Add a little extra for differences in piecing.) <p>Center Corners -</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> •Cut 2 squares 10" x 10". 
	<p>Border #3 - Fabric is directional!</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> •Cut 2 strips lengthwise 44 1/2" x 4" (Add a little extra for differences in piecing.) •Cut 3 strips crosswise WOF x 4". Seam together and cut into 2 strips 51 1/2" x 4" (Add a little extra for differences in piecing.) <p>Flying geese block -</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> •Cut 6 strips 5" wide. Cut into 32 squares 5" x 5" 
	<p>Border #1 - Press with Best Press or Spray Starch before cutting narrow strips.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> •Cut 2 strips lengthwise 36 1/2" x 2" (Add a little extra for differences in piecing.) •Cut 2 strips lengthwise 39 1/2" x 2" (Add a little extra for differences in piecing.) <p>Binding</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> •Cut 9 strips 2 1/2" x WOF. Seam together with diagonal seams. Press folded in half. 
	<p>Backing - Cut in half crosswise. Seam together lengthwise. Press seam open.</p>



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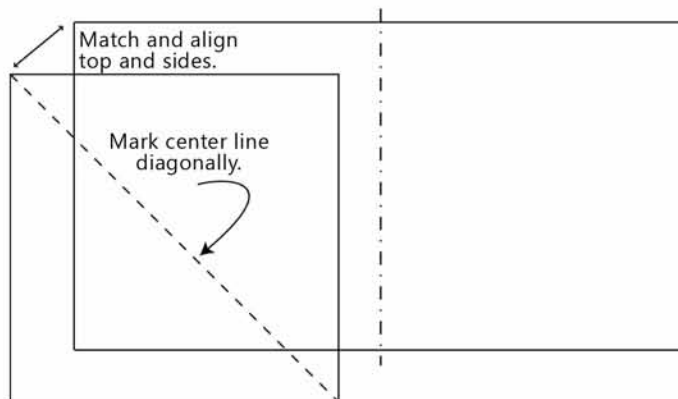
Make the flying geese units--

1. Finger press the center of the 9 1/2" x 5" rectangles.

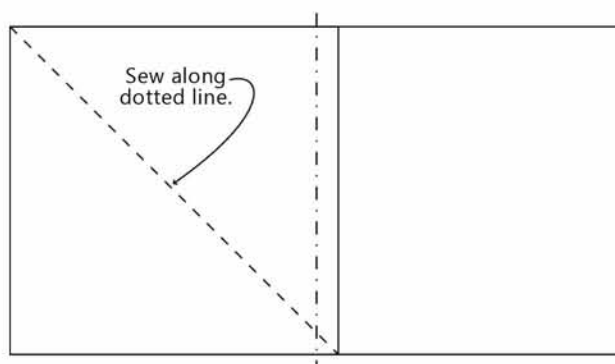


2. Mark a diagonal line down the center of a 5" black ground square.

3. Place the square on one half the rectangle aligning the side, top and bottom.



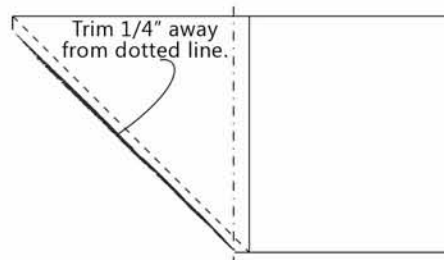
4. Sew along the marked (dotted) line as shown below.



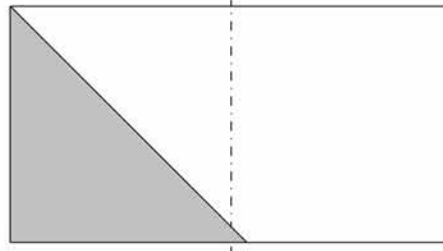
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5. Trim 1/4" away from the sewn line.

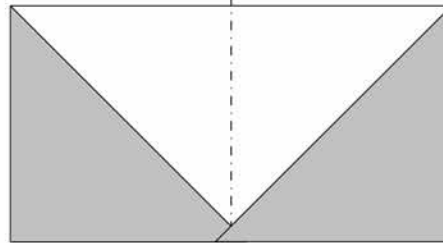


6. Press as shown below:

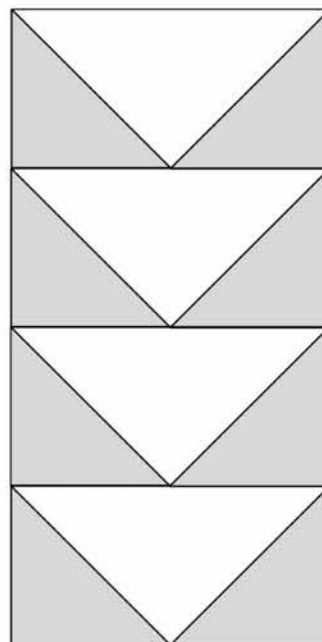


7. Repeat on the other side to create the flying geese block shown below.

8. Make 16 blocks.



9. Sew together 4 flying geese blocks into a unit as shown below. Make 4 units.



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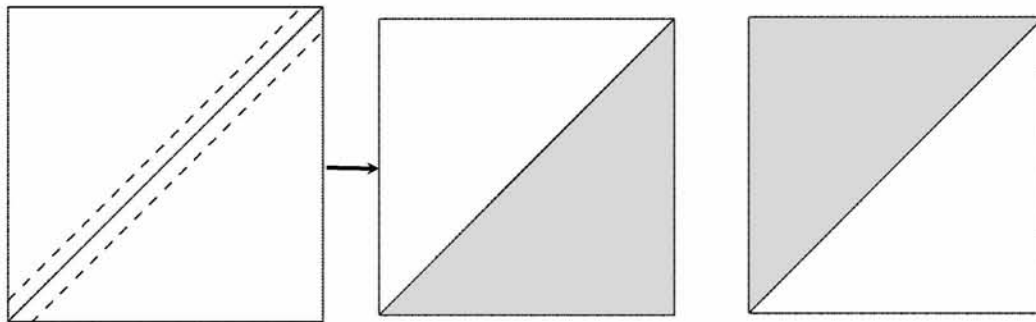


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Make the corner squares--

1. Mark the center diagonal line on the focus fabric 10" square.
2. Place on top of the blue 10" square, right sides together.
3. Sew 1/4" on either side of the center line.
4. Cut apart on the drawn line.
5. Open each to a square, pressing the seam toward the dark.
6. Make a total of four corner squares.
7. Using the center seam as a guide, trim the square to 9 1/2".



Assembling the quilt --

REFER TO THE PICTURE OF THE FINISHED QUILT FOR THESE STEPS:

1. Sew a corner square to each side of a flying geese unit. The geese points should point to the right. The blue triangle of the corner squares should point down and toward the flying geese unit.
2. Make another row like this, except the blue triangles should point UP and toward the flying geese unit.
3. Paying close attention to the direction of the center square fabric, sew a flying geese unit to each side of the center square with the points going down.



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4. Sew the three rows together as shown in the finished quilt picture.
5. The quilt center should measure 36 1/2" square. If it doesn't, adjust the sizes of your borders accordingly.
6. Be sure to cut each side of each border exactly the same length. The same is true for the top and bottom borders. By making sure the borders are the same, you will keep the quilt square. After the first border is attached, the rest should be easy.
7. **NOTE!** Sewing the side borders on should be straight forward. You are sewing lengthwise to lengthwise. The top and bottom borders are cut on the crosswise grain and will have a tendency to stretch. Use more care in attaching these borders.
8. Sew each border to the quilt by attaching the shorter borders to the sides. Press toward the border. Then add the longer borders to the top and bottom, once again pressing toward the border.
9. Continue to add borders 1-5, pressing all the seams out towards the borders.
10. Press the completed top well.
11. Make the sandwich and quilt as desired.
12. Set the binding with a 3/8" seam.
13. Enjoy!
