# Fuzzball Flowers By Susan McDermott

## **Materials:**

**Cuddles Bubble and Cuddles Flat:** 

1/8 vd of several colors (5 bubble and 5 flat were used in the sample)

Feedsack II: Muslin: 1/8 yd. of all 45 Feedsack II fabrics 2 yards 3 ½ yds. for backing Optional:

5/8 yd. Feedsack II #22422-3 for binding 2 Yards fusible web

# Pattern:

Enlarge the block pattern 200%.

If using hand appliqué methods: add 1/4" seam allowance around all sides of the petal and center templates.

If using fusible web method: add 1/4" seam allowance to bottom edge of petal only, to tuck under center circle. Trace on paper side of web.

Do not fuse the Cuddles. It will flatten too much, esp. the Cuddles Bubble. Since Cuddles is a knit, it will not ravel so it can be cut to the exact size of the flower center template and stitched on by machine with invisible thread. Cuddles is perfect for a fuzzy flower center!

# Cut:


Muslin: 16 - 10 1/2" squares

Feedsack II: 167 - 2 1/2" squares

24 - 2 1/2" x 10 1/2" strips

Remainder of Feedsack II will be used to make 128 flower petals

Cuddles: 16 flower center circles

# Assembly:

#### Blocks:

Appliqué flowers to muslin squares, using enlarged pattern as a placement guide

#### .Quilt top:

Assemble quilt top in rows following diagram.

# Complete the quilt:

Layer quilt top, batting and backing. Quilting is done in the ditch around blocks, with echo quilting every ½" around the flowers.

#### Binding:

The fabric used to bind this quilt is a plaid printed on the bias. To maintain the bias look the binding was cut on the cross-grain in  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " strips, joining the sections to make a 220" length.
