Quilt Size: 70" x 70"



Fabric A

Note: for outer borders choose one: the full borders or the optional pieced borders as in the Ad from McCall's Quilting February 2010 issue

30805-2 1-1/2 yd large floral for full borders #5

Cut (7) 6-1/2" x width of fabric strips, then recut into
2 pieces 6-1/2" x 58-1/2" and 2 pieces 6-1/2" x 70-1/2"

OR

*30805-4 3/4 yd large floral for optional pieced borders #5

*30810-4 3/4 yd small floral for optional pieced borders #5

Cut (2) strips from both fabrics 6-1/2" x 29" and (2) strips from both fabrics
6-1/2" x 35"

Fabric B

30808-3 green 5/8 yard for background

Cut (2) 18-1/2" squares

Fabric C

30808-2 pink 5/8 yard for background

Cut (2) 18-1/2" squares

Fabric D

1/2 yd 30806-2 pink for triangle shapes cut 6-7/8" squares and stack the squares with right sides all facing up before cutting the triangles as shown in the Pinwheel cutting diagram. Cut (32) pink triangle shapes for border #3

Fabric E

1/2 yd 30806-3 green for triangle shapes cut 6-7/8" squares and stack the squares with right sides all facing up before cutting the triangles as shown in the Pinwheel cutting diagram. Cut (32) green triangle shapes for border #3

Fabric F

1 yd 30812-4 black for triangle shapes cut 6-7/8" squares and stack the squares with right sides all facing up before cutting the triangles as shown in the Pinwheel cutting diagram. Cut (64) black triangle shapes for border #3

Cut a 17" circle for the background of the peace sign

Fabric G*

1/3 yd 30806-4 black for peace sign

Cut (3) curved pieces for peace sign using template

Cut (3) 2" x 4-1/2" for piece sign

Fabric H

1/4 yd 30810-2 pink for peace sign

Cut (2) curved pieces for peace sign using template

Cut (3) 2" x 4-1/2" pieces and (1) 2" x 6-1/2" piece for peace sign

Fabric I

3/4 yd 30812-2 pink for borders and binding

Cut (2) pieces 2" x 14-1/2" for vertical borders #1

Cut (2) pieces 2" x 22-1/2" for horizontal borders #1

Cut remainder into 2-1/4" x wof strips for binding

Fabric J

1/2 yd 30812-3 green for borders and binding

Cut (2) pieces 2" x 22-1/2" for vertical borders #1

Cut (2) pieces 2" x 17-1/2" for horizontal borders #1

Cut remainder into 2-1/4" x wof strips for binding

Fabric K

3/4 yd 30807-4 black for peace sign and borders

Cut (2) 2" x 39-1/2" strips for vertical border #2

Cut (2) 2" x 42-1/2" strips for horizontal border #2

Cut (2) 2-1/2" x 54-1/2" for vertical border #4

Cut (2) 2-1/2" x 58-1/2" for vertical border #4

Cut (3) curved pieces for peace sign

Cut (4) 2" x 4-1/2" pieces for peace sign

*additional fabric needed for backing **Fabric G** – 4 1/4 yards

Fusible web (read and follow the manufacturer's directions before cutting)

Invisible thread

*cutting fabrics D, E and F; cut 6-7/8" squares and stack the squares with right sides all facing up before cutting the triangles as shown in the Pinwheel cutting diagram.

Quilt Assembly

1. Refer to Quilt Diagram throughout for quilt assembly.
2. Sew the (4) 18-1/2" fabric B and fabric C squares together to make the center background square for the peace sign.
3. Adhere fusible web to the back of the fabric F circle and fuse to the center of the background square sewn in Step 2. Arrange the 8 curved pieces that make up the circle around the outside edges of the peace sign and to the straight pieces for the center of the peace sign to make the piece sign in the center of the background square. Fuse to the quilt center using a fusible web. Applique in place using a zig-zag stitch with invisible thread.

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Templates

4. Sew the fabric I and fabric J vertical strips together end-to-end and sew to opposite sides of the quilt center. Sew the horizontal fabric I and fabric J horizontal strips together end-to-end and sew to top and bottom of the quilt center for border #1.
5. Sew the fabric K vertical borders #2 to opposite sides of the quilt center, then sew the horizontal borders #2 to the top and bottom of the quilt center.
6. Piece a pinwheel block together using 1 fabric D triangle shape, 1 fabric E triangle shape and 2 fabric F triangle shapes. Make 32 pinwheel blocks.
7. Sew (7) pinwheel blocks together to make for border #3. Make 2 rows, then sew to opposite sides of the quilt center. Sew (9) pinwheel blocks together for border #3. Make 2 rows, then sew to top and bottom of the quilt center.
8. Sew vertical borders #4 to opposite sides of the quilt center. Sew horizontal borders #4 to top and bottom of the quilt center.
9. Sew fabric a vertical borders #5 to opposite sides of the quilt and horizontal borders #5 to top and bottom of the quilt.
10. Optional Border: Sew the vertical border strips (1 large floral print and 1 small floral print) together for side borders. Sew to opposite sides of the quilt top. Sew the horizontal borders in the same manner and sew to top and bottom of the quilt top.

Finishing

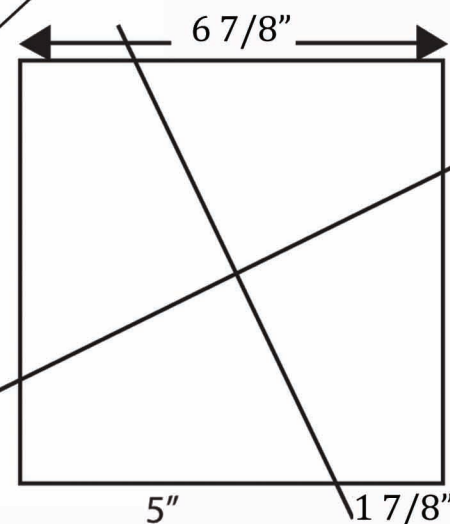
11. Layer the quilt top, batting and backing and baste layers together.

Quilt as desired.

Bind to finish the quilt.
