The inspirations for the graphics are based upon interpreting rhythms from music of different tempos and creating small individual linear units within a grid or straight line format. These colorful designs are actually adaptations from drawings based on this idea of a vertical, horizontal, and grid formats.

The warm colors and perky prints offer wonderful movement and flow to any quilted piece and are sure to appeal to fabric aficionados of all ages.

27349-5		fabric C	(1) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strip, cut 8 half sq triangles
27350-3		fabric D	4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips for half square triangles 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips for triple square block 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strip for centers of triple sq block
27350-4		fabric E	(4) 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares
27350-5		fabric F	(1) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strip, cut into 8 half sq triangles (6) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips for triple square block, cut into (12) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " pieces, (20) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " pieces and (4) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " pieces
27352-4		fabric G	(2) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips, cut into 20 half sq triangles (2) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares
27354-3		fabric H	(2) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips, cut into 20 half sq triangles (4) 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares
27355-5		fabric I	4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips (4) 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares (3) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips, cut (8) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " pieces and (8) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " pieces for triple square
27357-3		fabric J More dark	(1) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strip cut into 8 half sq triangles (2) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares
27357-6		fabric K More light	4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strip, cut 4 half sq triangles (2) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips from these cut, (8) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " pieces and (8) 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " pieces
27357-7		fabric L	(2) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips cut into 24 half sq triangles (8) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares

This quilt is made in sections; follow the diagrams for fabric placement:

Make 5 four patches using fabric in picture.

Triple Squares made from 3 fabrics (need 18 in total):

Center is cut 2-1/2", this is fabric 1

add 2-1/2" pieces of fabric 2 to opposite sides, press

add (2) 4-1/2" pieces of fabric 2 to other opposite sides, press

add (2) 4-1/2" pieces of fabric 3 to opposite sides, press

add (2) 6-1/2" pieces of fabric 3 to other opposite sides and press

				The top and bottom rows are made the same way.
Make 5 four patches	Make 18 triple squares following the directions above.	Add half square units to center 9 patch. This is the main unit.	Make 2 to put on the left and right side of main unit. Make 2 more and add a block to the left and right side.	Always look at the picture for fabric placement.

Add a 1-1/2" border of fabric D to all 4 sides.

Add a 6" border of fabric f to all 4 sides.

Bind with fabric G.
