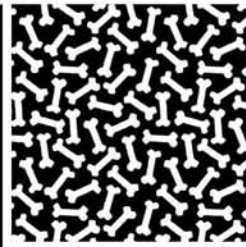

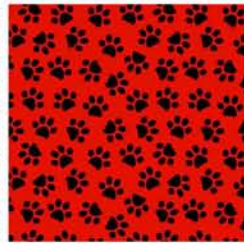

Fabric Requirements:

3 vertical rows of blocks (about 1/2 yard) of either 39413-X Dogs or 39410-X Cats

3/4 yard 39412-2 Grey for sides and binding

1/2 yard of either 35558A-1 Red (for cats) or 35559A-3 Black (for dogs) for lining

Cutting:

Note: All seams are 1/4" wide

39413-X or 39410-X Block print (dogs or cat)

Cut (2) sets of blocks in panel of 3 blocks wide x 3 blocks tall. Seam allowance (black around blocks) will be about 1/4" wide

39412-2 Grey word pattern

Cut (5) 1 1/2" x WOF strips for binding

Cut (4) 3" x 24" strips for bottom and sides (inside and outside)

Cut (2) 3" x 40 1/2" strips for handles (includes underside for handles)

35558A-1 Red paw print or 35559A03 Black bone print

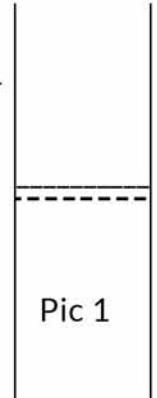
Cut (2) 14" wide x 17 1/2" tall rectangles for lining. They are a little large but you can trim excess later.

Assembly:

1. With right sides together join lining and one block panel together at the top. Press seam allowance towards the lining and edge top stitch. Fold with wrong sides together and press the top seam flat.
2. Now that the wrong sides are together, pin lining to outside. 1/8" stitch the 3 open sides together. Trim excess lining to match outside if necessary. Repeat for the other side.
3. Sew handle 3" wide strips together. Press seam in one direction edge stitch. See pic 1
4. Next sew handle ends to the side strips. Press seam in one direction edge stitch. Sew the side strips together at the bottom so that you have created a continuous 'loop'. Press seam in one direction edge stitch. Repeat for the under side of the handle and bag inside side panels.
5. With wrong sides together, join the underside of the handle 'loop' to the upper side. Edge stitch around each open edge to hold together.
6. Take one side of the tote and find the bottom middle. Place a pin at this point. Take the handle loop and line up the bottom 'loop' seam with the bottom center of the tote. Pin around the tote body attaching the side panel to the tote body. Seam allowance will be facing outside as you will bind off later.
7. With a 1/4" seam, stitch around the sides and bottom of the tote. Repeat for the other side of the tote.
8. Create binding by sewing the strips of cut binding together. Starting on one side of the tote, bind off on all sides, bottom and handle 'loop'. Repeat for the other side. Pic 2
9. At top of the handle, fold the sides of the handle in to meet at the center (on the underside of the handle). Pic 3
10. Stitch across the top of the handle a few times to secure. This will make the handle narrower at the point it sits on your shoulder making it easier to stay in place. Pic 4
