Home for the Holidays - Tree Skirt

Fabric Requirements:

(1) Christmas Tree Skirt panel
(1) 45" square backing fabric
(1) 45" square batting
260" of bias binding, folded in half lengthwise (make 27" square of binding fabric)

Making the Tree Skirt:

Trim away excess fabric from the outer curve of the tree skirt.
 Use a ruler and rotary cutter to cut a straight line.

Tip: Cut the line between floral motifs. Using the gold line surrounding the green ring as a guide, cut out the inner circle for the tree skirt. (**Fig. 1**)

2. Lay 45" square backing fabric square right side down on a flat surface. Next, layer the 45" batting square onto the backing. Now layer the tree skirt, wrong side down, on top of the batting. (**Fig. 2**)

3. Baste layers together and quilt as desired.

4. Trim away excess fabric and batting from the outer and inner edges of the quilted tree skirt, trimming to edge of the tree skirt design.

5. Cut (6) 11" lengths from binding strip. Unfold each length, fold raw edges in lengthwise and press. Refold on original fold. Tuck raw edges in on one short end. Stitch the length of strip to secure folds. Position raw ends of strips along split edge of tree skirt as shown and baste in place. (**Fig. 3 and Fig. 4**)

6. Use the bias binding to bind the tree skirt using your preferred method, including the two split edges and the inner circle. The binding will secure the tie strips for the tree skirt. Enjoy!

Optional Table Topper Finish:

1. Trim away excess fabric from the outer circle of the design.

2. Lay 45" square backing fabric square right side down on a flat surface. Next, layer the 45" batting square onto the backing. Now layer the topper, wrong side down, on top of the batting. (**Fig. 5**)

3. Baste layers together and quilt as desired. Trim excess fabric and batting up to edge of the design.

4. Use the bias binding to bind the tree skirt using your preferred method. Enjoy!
