## General Instructions

This quilt uses the fabric collection "Ribbons of Hope" from Windham Fabrics. The quilt contains 6 different blocks plus borders. They are identified as block A thru F in these instructions. All blocks will measure 10 1/2" X 10 1/2" (finish 10" X 10") unless otherwise noted. Use 1/4" seam allowances throughout. Accurate cutting and seam allowances will insure success. It is suggested that all seams should be pressed open.

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## Initial Cutting Instructions

35043-X Multi

Fussy cut 4 pieces 6 1/2" X 6 1/2" with the Ribbon centered in the block

Fussy cut 4 pieces 7 5/8" X 7 5/8" with the Ribbon centered in the block

Fussy cut 4 pieces 7 5/8" X 7 5/8" with the Love centered in the block

35044-1 Black

Cut 1 strip 2 1/8" X WOF

35044-2 Pink

Cut 2 strips 1 7/8" X WOF

35045-1 Black

Cut 14 strips 2 1/2" X WOF

35045-3 White

Cut 11 strips 2 1/2" X WOF

Cut 8 strips 3 7/8" X WOF

Cut 6 strips 6 1/2" X WOF

35046-2 Pink

Cut 2 strips 1 7/8" X WOF

Cut 1 strip 2 1/2" X WOF

35046-3 White

Cut 1 strip 1 7/8" X WOF

Cut 2 strips 2 1/2" X WOF

35047-1 Black

Cut 13 Strips 1 1/2" X WOF

35047-2 Pink

Cut 1 strip 1 7/8" X WOF

Cut 6 strips 2 1/2" X WOF

## Block A

From a 2 1/2" strip of 35046-3 White - sub-cut 12 pieces 2 1/2" X 2 1/2".

From a 2 1/2" strip of 35047-2 Pink - sub-cut 9 pieces 2 1/2" X 2 1/2".

From a 2 1/2" strip of 35045-3 White - sub-cut 4 pieces 2 1/2" X 2 1/2".

Block A consist of 5 - five patch rows. Assemble the rows as follows:

Row 1 & 5 = 35047-2 | 35046-3 | 35045-3 | 36046-3 | 36047-2



Row 2 & 4 = 35046-3 | 35047-2 | 35046-3 | 36047-2 | 36046-3



Row 3 = 35045-3 | 35046-3 | 35047-2 | 36046-3 | 36045-3



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Assemble the five rows as shown to complete the block.

## Preparing for Blocks B,C,and D

- From a 2 1/2" strip of 35046-3 White - sub-cut 8 pieces 2 1/2" X 2 1/2".
- From a 2 1/2" strip of 35045-1 Black - sub-cut 40 pieces 2 1/2" X 2 1/2".
- From the 2 1/2" strips of 35045-3 White - sub-cut 48 pieces 2 1/2" X 3 7/8".
- From the 3 7/8" strips of 35045-3 White - sub-cut 48 pieces 3 7/8" X 5 7/8".

Sew a 2 1/2" X 2 1/2" square of 35046-3 White to a 2 1/2" X 3 7/8" rectangle of 35045-3 White. Make 8 units.



With the square of 35045-3 White on the left - sew a 3 7/8" X 5 7/8" to the bottom of the unit. Label these S1 - make four units. The units will measure 5 7/8" x 5 7/8".

With the square of 35045-3 White on the right - sew a 3 7/8" X 5 7/8" to the bottom of the unit. Label these S2 - make four units. The units will measure 5 7/8" x 5 7/8".

Sew a 2 1/2" X 2 1/2" square of 35045-1 Black to a 2 1/2" X 3 7/8" rectangle of 35045-3 White. Make 40 units.



With the square of 35045-3 White on the left - sew a 3 7/8" X 5 7/8" to the bottom of the unit. Label these S3 - make 20 units. The units will measure 5 7/8" x 5 7/8".

With the square of 35045-3 White on the right - sew a 3 7/8" X 5 7/8" to the bottom of the unit. Label these S4 - make 20 units. The units will measure 5 7/8" x 5 7/8".

## Block B

Start with the 2 1/8" square of 35044-1 Black

1. Sew a 1 7/8" X 2 1/8" rectangle of 35046-3 White to the right side. Turn the unit 1/4 turn clockwise.
2. Sew a 1 7/8" X 3 1/2" rectangle of 35046-3 White to the right side. Turn the unit 1/4 turn clockwise.

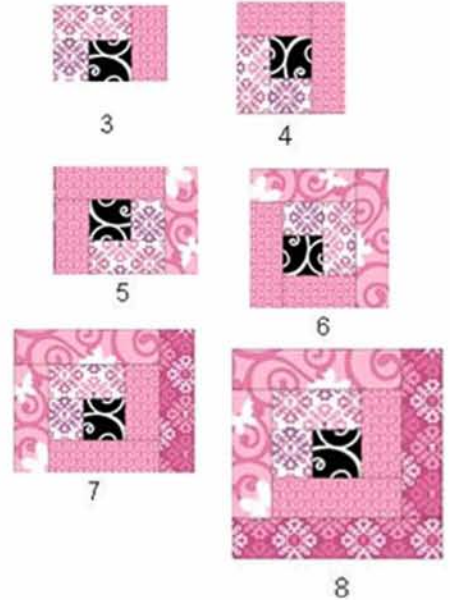
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3. Sew a 1 7/8" X 3 1/2" rectangle of 35047-2 Pink to the right side.  
Turn the unit 1/4 turn clockwise.
4. Sew a 1 7/8" X 4 7/8" rectangle of 35047-2 Pink to the right side.  
Turn the unit 1/4 turn clockwise.
5. Sew a 1 7/8" X 4 7/8" rectangle of 35044-2 Pink to the right side.  
Turn the unit 1/4 turn clockwise.
6. Sew a 1 7/8" X 6 1/4" rectangle of 35044-2 Pink to the right side.  
Turn the unit 1/4 turn clockwise.
7. Sew a 1 7/8" X 6 1/4" rectangle of 35046-2 Pink to the right side.  
Turn the unit 1/4 turn clockwise.
8. Sew a 1 7/8" X 7 5/8" rectangle of 35046-2 Pink to the right side.

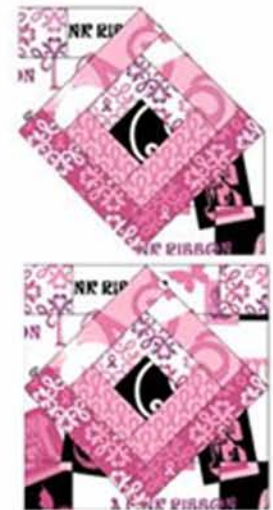


Repeat this sequence four times to yield 4 log cabin blocks, the log cabins should measure 7 5/8" x 7 5/8"

Using one each of the S1, S2, S3, and S4 units - cut the diagonals from point to point in the direction that does not include the corner square. This will yield four distinct triangles as shown at right. (T1 – T4)



With the log cabin on point and the 35042-2 Pink sides at the bottom - sew the T1 triangle to the top left side and the T3 triangle to the bottom right side.



Next add T2 to the upper right and T4 to the lower left to complete the block. Repeat the process to form 4 block B's.

Repeat the process changing the position of the corner triangles to match the diagrams below to complete 4 blocks.



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## Block C

Start with a 7 5/8" fussy cut "Love" square.

Using two each of the S3 and S4 units - cut the diagonal from point to point in the direction that does not include the corner square. This will yield two each of two distinct triangles as shown at right. (T3 & T4)



With the Love Square on point as shown - sew a T3 triangle to the top left side the bottom right side.



Next add a T4 triangle to the upper right and the lower left to complete the block.



Repeat the process to form 4 block C's.

## Block D

Repeat the Block C steps substituting the 7 5/8" fussy cut Ribbon squares. Make a total of 4 Block D's.



## Preparing Segments for Blocks E and F

To make the segments for blocks E & F construct strip sets from the remaining 2 1/2" strips. The sets will then be sub-cut into segments for the blocks. The strip set and segment types will be numbered 1 thru 5. The strips should be sewn together lengthwise in the order shown. The number and length of the sets is indicated in each segment type detail. *Please note that 1/2 - WOF strip is a set composed of 22" length strips.* The strip sets are then cut into the number of 2 1/2" segments required for the blocks.

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## Segment Type 1

Sequence: 32045-1 | 35047-2 | 35045-1 | 35047-2 | 35045-1

Strip Sets: 1 - WOF + 1/2 - WOF

Segments Required: 20



## Segment Type 2

Sequence: 32047-2 | 35045-1 | 35045-3 | 35045-1 | 35047-2

Strip Sets: 1 - WOF + 1/2 - WOF

Segments Required: 20



## Segment Type 3

Sequence: 32045-3 | 35045-1 | 35047-2 | 35045-1 | 35045-3

Strip Sets: 1 - WOF Segments Required: 12



## Segment Type 4

Sequence: 32046-3 | 35047-2 | 35045-1 | | 35047-2 | 35045-1

Strip Sets: 1/2 - WOF

Segments Required: 4



## Segment Type 5

Sequence: 32047-2 | 35046-3 | 35045-3 | | 35045-1 | 35047-2

Strip Sets: 1/2 - WOF

Segments Required: 4



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## Block E

Sew the segments made previously together in the order as shown below. Make 4 blocks.



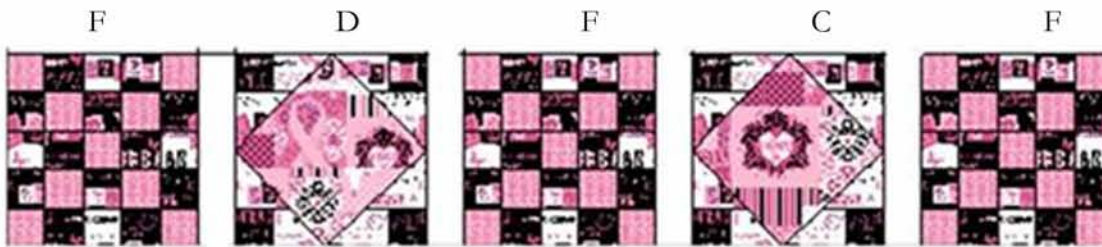
## Block F

Sew the segments made previously together in the order as shown below. Make 8 blocks.

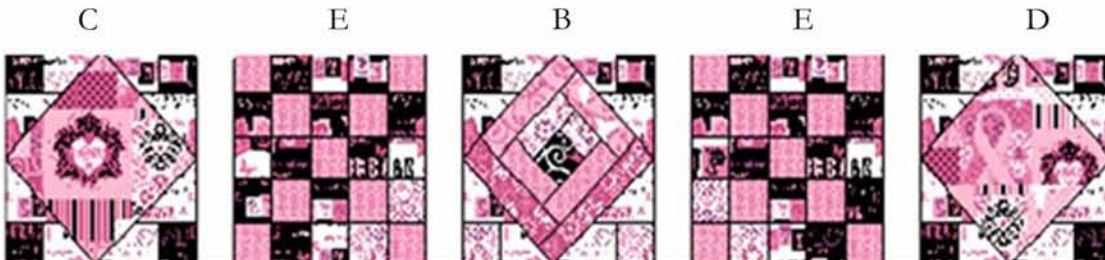


Sew the blocks together into rows in order shown - paying attention to block orientation. Then sew the rows together to complete the quilt body. The body should measure 50 1/2" X 52 1/2"

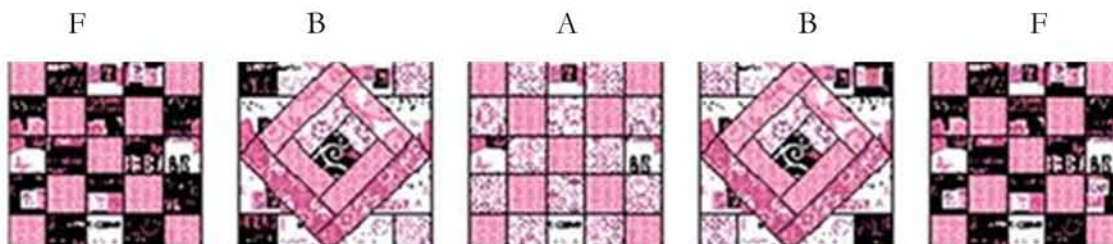


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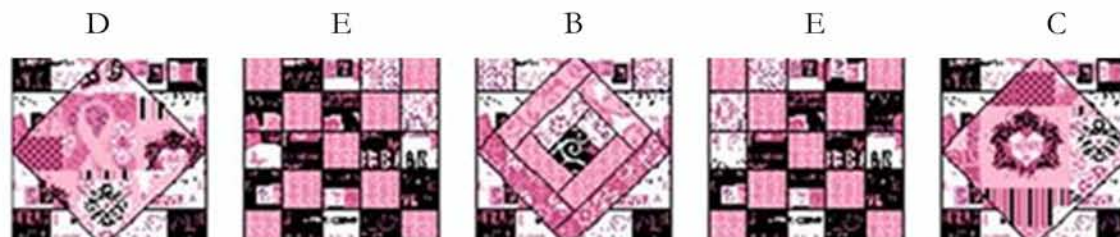
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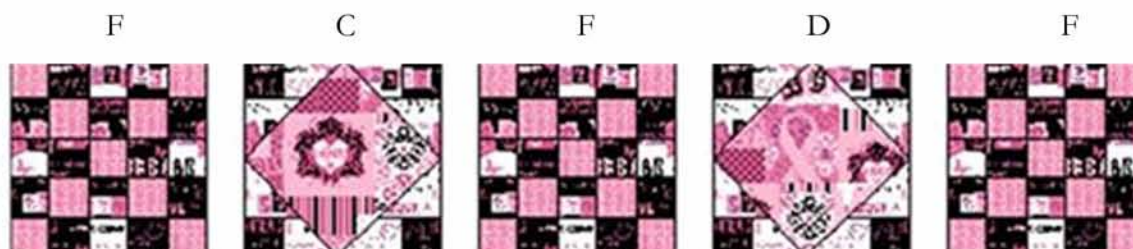

## Adding The Borders

Sew the thirteen 1 1/2" strips of 35047-1 Black together using diagonal seams to form one long strip.

Sew the six 6 1/2" strips of 35045-3 White together using diagonal seams to form one long strip.

Cut 2 pieces of the 35047-1 Black strip 50 1/2" long and sew to the top and bottom of the quilt body.

Cut 2 pieces of the 35047-1 Black strip 52 1/2" long and sew to the left and right sides of the quilt body. The quilt should measure 52 1/2" X 52 1/2".

Cut 4 pieces of the 35045-3 White strip 52 1/2" long. Sew one to the top and bottom of the quilt.

Sew one of the fussy cut 6 1/2" ribbon squares to each end of the other two pieces of 35045-3 White - paying attention to the orientation of the ribbon. Sew these to the left and right sides of the quilt. The quilt should measure 64 1/2" X 64 1/2".

Cut 2 pieces of the 35047-1 Black strip 64 1/2" long and sew to the top and bottom of the quilt body.

Cut 2 pieces the 35047-1 Black strip 66 1/2" long and sew to the left and right sides of the quilt body. The completed quilt top should measure 66 1/2" X 66 1/2".

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Back, quilt, and bind your quilt. Don't forget the label!
