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
The quilt is made from 4 - 15" blocks sewn together and set on point to create a center medallion. Lots of pumpkins and diagonally printed stripes square out the quilt. Perfect for making your holiday home warm and welcoming!



6 72	36246-2	2/3 yd	•Center Blocks - Cut 1 strips 3 1/2" x WOF. From these cut 11 - 3 1/2" squares. (you need 12. The last one is cut from the leftover strip of the outer block.) •Outer Blocks - Cut 3 strips 6 1/2" x WOF. From these cut 16 - 6 1/2" squares. From remainder of strip, cut 1 - 3 1/2" square for the center blocks.

Allow extra for differences in piecing. •Border #3 - On length of goods,cut 2 strips 48 1/2" x 1 1/2"cut 2 strips 50 1/2" x 1 1/2". These measures are exact. Allow extra for differences in piecing.
	36248-3	3/8 yd	•Center Blocks - Cut 2 strips 6 7/8" x WOF. From these cut 8 - 6 7/8" squares. Cut in half diagonally.
	36248-1	1/4 yd	•Center Blocks - Cut 1 strip 4 1/4" wide. From this cut 8 - 4 1/4" squares. Cut in half diagonally twice.
	36251-6	1/4 yd	•Center Blocks - Cut 1 strip 4 1/4" wide. From this cut 4 - 4 1/4" squares. Cut in half diagonally twice.
	36245-X	1 3/4 yds	•Border #4 - On length of goods,cut 2 strips 50 1/2" x 3 1/2"cut 2 strips 56 1/2" x 3 1/2". These measures are exact. Allow extra for differences in piecing.

The state of the s	36249-5	1/4 yd	•Center Blocks - Cut 1 strip 3 1/2" wide. From this cut 4 - 3 1/2" squares. •Center Blocks - Cut 1 strip 4 1/4" wide. From this cut 4 - 4 1/4" squares. Cut in half diagonally twice.
	36250-X	1 yd	•Setting Triangles - Cut 1 strip 9 3/4" x WOF. From this cut 4 - 9 3/4" squares. Cut in half diagonally twice. •Setting Triangle corners - Cut 1 strip 5 1/4" x WOF. From this cut 2 - 5 1/4" squares. Cut in half diagonally. •Binding - Cut 7 strips 2 1/2" wide. Seam together with diagonal seams. Press in half. Set aside.
	36245-X	3 yds	•Backing - Cut a 65" length. Split the remainder in half lengthwise. Sew end to end. Sew to the 65" length.





Shown above are two views of the center blocks. One with fabric and one without the print, which may be a little easier to see how the block goes together. NOTE that one corner is the cream print and the rest are the orange pumpkins. Look at the picture of the finished quilt. All the cream corners are "pointing" to the edges of the quilt. All 4 of the blocks are made the same, but when sewing them together, make sure that the placement of the cream corners is correct.






Assembling the Block - Make 4 to finish 15" (15 1/2" with seams allowed)

- 1. Referring to the diagrams above, sew an orange 1/4 square triangle to a brown leaf one. Make 16.
- 2. Do the same with the cream wheat print and the brown leaf. Make 16.
- 3. Sew two 1/4 square units onto a square as shown below. NOTE! Sew one unit that has orange pumpkin square and orange on each side. Sew one unit that has cream square with cream on each side. Sew two that are orange pumpkin squares with one orange and one cream on each side.
- 4. Finish the unit by sewing on a green leaf half square triangle.
- 5. Trim to 6 1/2" square by placing the 45 degree line on your ruler down the seam down the center of the block. If the block is coming out too small, take smaller seams.

6. Make 4 of each unit shown below.



- 6. After all the units are made, create rows. Row 1 has the units illustrated below. Press toward center. Row 2 is a 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangle sewn to each side of an orange square. Press away from center. Row 3 is sewn as shown below. Press toward center.
- 7. Sew the rows together.
- 8. Make 4 blocks.



- 9. After the blocks are made, arrange them so that the orange pumpkin squares come together in the center and all the cream wheat squares are on the outside of the center of the quilt. See illustration on last page.
- 10. Sew the blocks together to make the center of the quilt.
- 11. Set aside to make the corners of the quilt.








### Assembling the corners

- 1. Following the diagram below, make two rows using the remaining 6 1/2" squares of pumpkin print and the striped triangles.
- 2. Sew the rows together and add the striped 1/4 square triangle on top.
- 3. If necessary, trim the edges to smooth out.
- 4. Make 4.
- 5. Sew to the four sides of the center of the guilt.
- 6. See the last page for the illustration of the completed center.




### Adding the borders

- 1. Add the borders in numerical order, one at a time. Add first to the sides and then to the top and bottom.
- 2. Press all the seams away from the center.
- 3. After all the borders have been added, create your sandwich of backing, batting and the top and quilt as desired.
- 4. Using the striped binding, bind the edges of the quilt.
- 5. Enjoy.
