

# Ice Cream Social

## Assemble the Quilt

- Lay out five rows of five blocks each as shown in the quilt layout diagram. Sew together the blocks in each row. Sew together the rows.
- Cut, or piece if necessary, two 1 ½ " wide brown strips 40 ½ " long. Sew these to the top and bottom of the quilt.
- Sew four pink 4 ½ " squares, four medium brown 4 ½ " squares and two dark brown 4 ½ " squares in a row positioning the colors randomly. Make four border rows. Sew one of these rows to the top and bottom of the quilt.
- Piece two 1 ½ " wide brown strips 50 ½ " long and sew these to the sides of the quilt.
- To each end of the remaining two border rows sew a 1 ½ " X 4 ½ " brown strip then a 4 ½ " pink square. Sew these to the sides of the quilt.
- Layer the backing, batting and quilt top. Baste and Quilt as desired.
- Use the 2 ½ " wide pink strips to bind the quilt.

Skill Level: Intermediate

**Designer's Note:** *I made this quilt using scraps of lots of different fabrics. I give directions for using just one fabric from each color category. You may purchase quarters or fat eighths if you desire.*

## Material

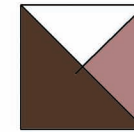
- ½ yard tan print
- 1 ¼ yard pink print
- ½ yard red print
- 1 yard dark brown print
- ½ yard medium brown print
- ½ yard cream print

## Cutting Directions

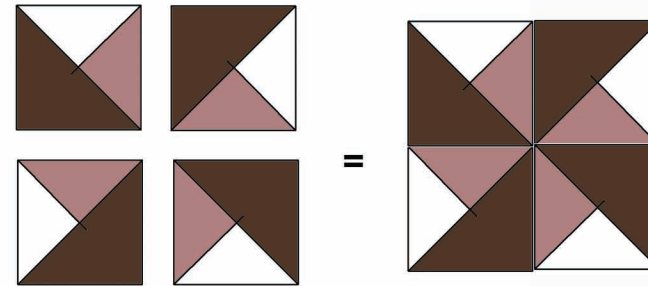
- From the tan print cut: twenty-four 4 ½" squares
- From the pink print cut: forty-four 4 ½" squares, thirteen 5 ¼" squares cut along each diagonal to yield fifty-two small triangles, six 2 ½" X width of fabric (WOF) strips
- From the cream print cut: thirteen 5 ¼" squares cut along each diagonal to yield fifty-two small triangles
- From the red print cut: twelve 4 7/8" squares cut along a diagonal to yield twenty-four large triangles
- From the dark brown print cut: fourteen 4 7/8" squares cut along a diagonal to yield twenty-eight large triangles, eight 4 ½" squares, six 1 ½" x WOF strips
- From the medium brown print cut: sixteen 4 ½" squares

## Pinwheel Blocks (Make seven brown and six red)

- Referring to the unit diagram, sew a cream triangle to a pink triangle. Sew on a red or brown triangle. Make four identical units.
- Follow the block diagram to position the units correctly, pinwheel fashion. Sew the units in the top and bottom rows together then sew together the two rows to form one block.



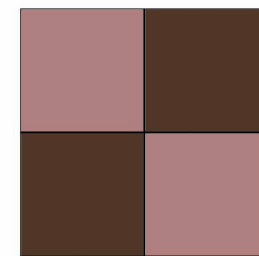
Pinwheel Unit

## Alternate 4-patch Blocks (Make twelve)

- Sew two pink 4 ½" squares to two tan 4 ½" squares. Sew these units together with the tan next to the pink as shown in the block diagram.
