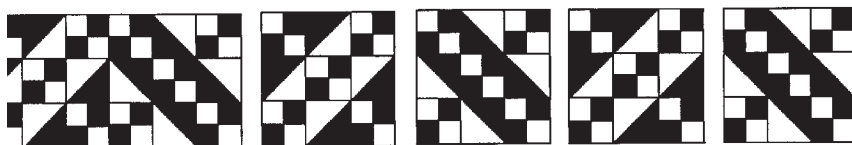


Joining Blocks



Join an A Block to a B Block.

Rotate your blocks to get the pattern shown above.



Continue joining A to B Blocks alternating across the row.

You will have 6 blocks in each row – as shown above.

Be sure to rotate the A and B blocks to get the pattern shown.

Row 1, 3, 5, 7



Row 2, 4, 6, 8



In Row 2 you will begin with a B Block and continue as shown.

Join Row 1 to Row 2.

Continue with this pattern of sewing your blocks together.

Jacob's Ladder

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Finished block: 9" square

Cutting Instructions:

Lights:

The lights we used were all the beiges and pinks.

There are 13 light fabrics.

From each of the 13 light fabrics cut two 3-7/8" x 20" strips

Sub-cut the 3-7/8" strips into 3-7/8" squares

From each of the 13 light fabrics cut four 2" x 20" strips (52) – (48 needed)

Darks:

The darks are the remainder of the fabrics in the kit.

There are 23 Darks.

From 24 dark fabrics cut two 2" x 20" inch strips. (48)

You will use one of your favorite fabrics twice.

Cut one 3-7/8" x 20" strip from each of the 24 dark fabrics.

Sub-cut the 3-7/8" strips into 3-7/8" squares.

**You are making 48 blocks for your quilt top.
(24 A blocks and 24 B Blocks.)**

For each block you will need the following:

Each block uses one light and one dark fabric.

One 2" strip of dark

One 2" inch strip of light

Two 3-7/8" of dark squares

Two 3-7/8" of light squares

Binding:

For a scrappy binding use six of your favorite fabrics.

You will need 14 strips 2-1/2" x 20".

We used reds for our scrappy binding.

Sewing:

Each block uses the same light and the same dark fabrics. Piece one light 2 inch strip and one dark 2 inch strip. Press towards the dark.



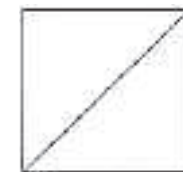
Sub-cut into ten 2 inch pieces.



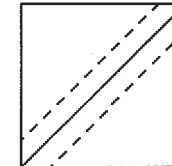
Piece these together to make 5 four-patches.



Using the same light and dark fabrics as in your four patches, for each block you need two light squares and two dark squares. Draw a diagonal line on the back of the two light squares.(Half-square triangles.)



Lay a light 3-7/8" square on top of a dark 3-7/8" squares. Right sides together. Sew 1/4 inch on both sides of the line.



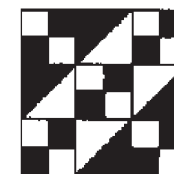
Cut on the drawn line and press towards the dark.

Tip:

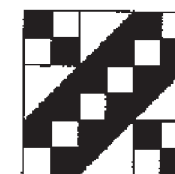
Iron before cutting to set your seam.



The Jacob's Ladder pattern consists of A blocks and B blocks. Refer to the diagrams below and make 24 A blocks and 24 B blocks.
