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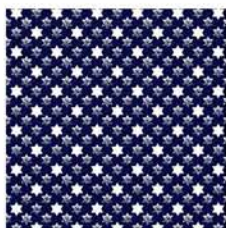

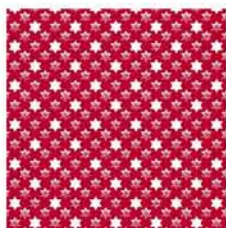

General Instructions:

All blocks will measure 9 1/2" X 9 1/2" (finish 9" X 9") unless otherwise noted. Use 1/4" seam allowances throughout. Accurate cutting and seam allowances will insure success. It is suggested that all seams should be pressed open.



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Cutting Instructions:

35011-2 White

Cut 6 strips 6 ½" X WOF

Cut 1 strip 4 ½" X WOF

Cut 4 Strips 2 ½" X WOF

35012-1 Blue

Cut 7 strips 8 ½" X WOF (Fussy cut to insure eagles will align in borders)

Fussy cut 18 eagles 5" X 5" (keeping eagle centered)

35012-2 White

Fussy cut 17 eagles 5" X 5" (keeping eagle centered)

35013-1 Blue

Cut 9 strips 2 ¾" X WOF

35013-3 Red

Cut 9 strips 2 ¾" X WOF

35014-1 Blue

Cut 14 strips 2 ¾" X WOF

35014-3 Red

Cut 14 strips 2 ¾" X WOF

35017-3 Red

Cut 10 Strips 2 ½" X WOF

Cut 1 strips 6 ½" X WOF

Cut 9 strips 2" X WOF for binding

Making The Eagle Blocks

35013-1 Blue

Sub-cut 72 pieces 2 ¾" X 2 ¾" from the 2 ¾" X WOF strips.

35013-3 Red

Sub-cut 68 pieces 2 ¾" X 2 ¾" from the 2 ¾" X WOF strips.

35014-1 Blue

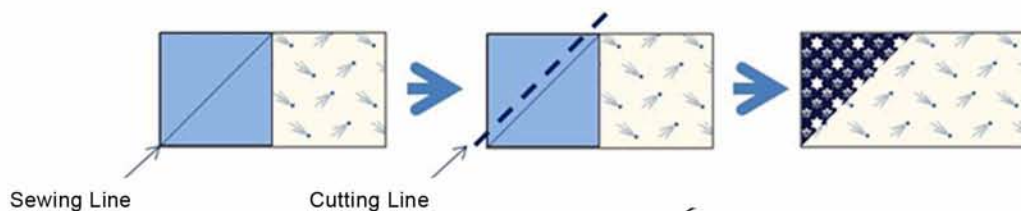
Sub-cut 212 pieces 2 ¾" X 5" from the 2 ¾" X WOF strips.

35014-3 Red

Sub-cut 208 pieces 2 ¾" X 5" from the 2 ¾" X WOF strips.

Step 1 - Making Flying Geese Units

Place a 2 ¾" X 2 ¾" square of 35014-1 Blue right sides together (RST) on the left side of a 2 ¾" X 5" rectangle of 35013-1 Blue. Draw a diagonal line on the back of the 2 ¾" square from bottom left to top right. Sew on the line and trim leaving a ¼" seam allowance. Flip and press.

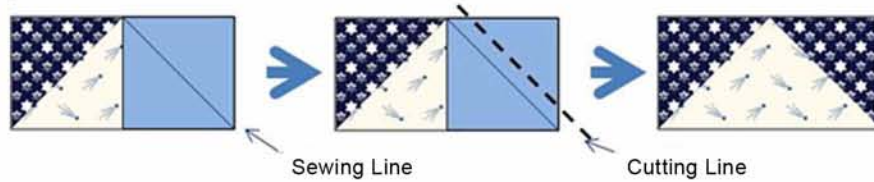


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Next place a 2 3/4" X 2 3/4" square of 35013-1 Blue RST on the right side of rectangle. Draw a diagonal line on the back of the 2 3/4" square from top left to bottom right. Sew on the line and trim leaving a 1/4" seam allowance. Flip and press.



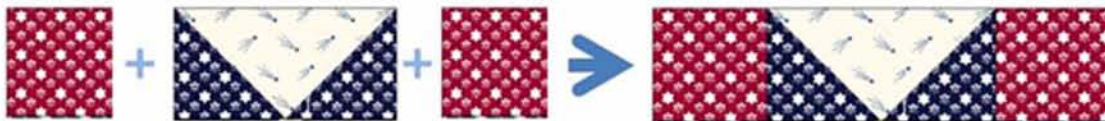
Follow the previous steps to complete the unit types shown in Table 1 below.

Table 1

| Unit Type | Rectangle Fabric | Square Fabric | Units Required |
|-----------|------------------|---------------|----------------|
| A | 35013-1 Blue | 35014-1 Blue | 72 |
| B | 35013-3 Red | 35014-1 Red | 68 |

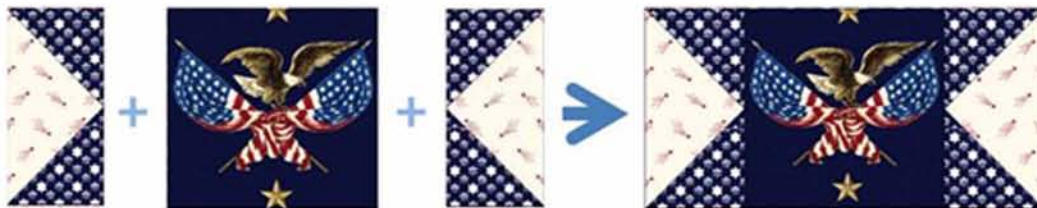
Step 2 - Making block top and bottom units

Sew one 2 3/4" square of 35014-3 Red to each end of a Type A flying geese unit as shown - Make 36 units. Repeat the process using a 2 3/4" square of 35013-1 Blue and a Type C flying geese units - Make 34 units.



Step 3 - Making the block centers

Sew one Type B flying geese Step 1 unit to each side of the 18 fussy cut blue eagle squares - Make 18 units as shown. Repeat for the Type D flying geese units and the white eagle squares - Make 17 units.

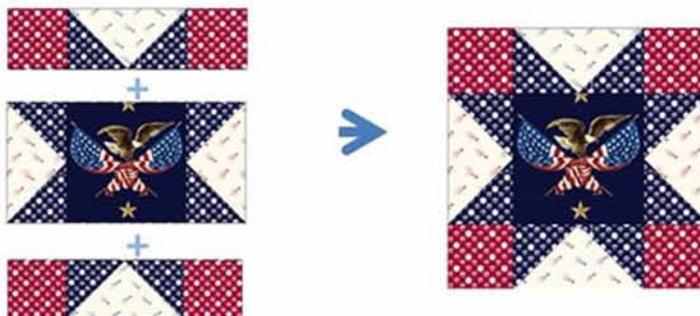


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Step 4 - Completing the Eagle Blocks

Sew one top and bottom units (from step 2) with a Type A flying geese unit to each blue eagle center unit (from step 3) as shown - Make 18 blocks. Repeat for the Type C flying geese units and the white eagle center units. Make 17 blocks.



Making The Pieced Corner Blocks

35011-2 White

Sub-cut 4 pieces 4 1/2" X 4 1/2" from the 4 1/2" X WOF strips.

Sub-cut 32 pieces 2 1/2" X 2 1/2" from the 2 1/2" X WOF strips

35017-3 Red

Sub cut 16 pieces 2 1/2" X 4 1/2" from the 2 1/2" X WOF strips

Sub cut 16 pieces 2 1/2" X 2 1/2" from the 2 1/2" X WOF strips

The corner blocks are made using the same process as the eagle blocks but will measure 8 1/2" X 8 1/2" (finish 8"X 8"). Refer to the previous step diagrams and substitute the appropriate fabrics for the corner blocks as described below.

Step 1 - Making Flying Geese Units

Place a 2 1/2" X 2 1/2" square of 35011-2 White RST on the left side of a 2 1/2" X 4 1/2" rectangle of 35017-3 Red. Draw a diagonal line on the back of the 2 1/2" square from bottom left to top right. Sew on the line and trim leaving a 1/4" seam allowance - Flip and press

Place a 2 1/2" X 2 1/2" square of 35011-2 White (RST) on the right side of the rectangle. Draw a diagonal line on the back of the 2 1/2" square from top left to bottom right. Sew on the line and trim leaving a 1/4" seam allowance - Flip and press.

Step 2 - Making block top and bottom units

Sew a 2 1/2" square of 35017-3 Red to each end of a flying geese unit from step 1 - Make 8 units.

Step 3 - Making the block centers

Sew a Step 1 flying geese unit to each side of a 4 1/2" X 4 1/2" square of 35011-2 White - Make 4 units.

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Step 4 - Completing the Corner Blocks

Sew one top and bottom unit from Step 2 to each of the centers from Step 3 - Make 4 units. Blocks will measure 8 1/2" X 8 1/2".



Assembling the Quilt

Quilt Center Section

The quilt center is composed of 7 rows of 5 blocks each with the eagle blocks alternating by color as shown. Follow the diagrams.

Rows 1,3,5,7



Rows 2,4,6



First Border

Using diagonal seams, sew the remaining 2 1/2" X WOF strips of 35017-3 Red together to form one long strip. Cut 2 strips 45 1/2" and 2 strips 67 1/2". Sew the 45 1/2" strips to the top and bottom of the center. Sew the 67 1/2" strips to each side of the center as shown below left.



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Second Border

Sub-cut four 6 1/2" X 6 1/2" squares from the 6 1/2" X WOF strip of 35017-3 Red for corner blocks. Using diagonal seams, sew the 6 1/2" X WOF strips of 35011-2 White together to form one long strip. Cut 2 strips 49 1/2" and 2 strips 67 1/2", Sew the 49 1/2" strips to the top and bottom of the quilt. Sew a 6 1/2" corner block to each end of the 67 1/2" strips. Sew these to the left and right side as shown above right

Third Border

Sew two 8 1/2" X WOF strips of 35012-1 Blue together using care to make sure the eagles line up.. Make 4 units. Cut 2 strips 61 1/2" and 2 strips 79 1/2". Sew the 61 1/2" strips to the top and bottom of the quilt. Sew a pieced corner block to each end of the 79 1/2" strips. Sew the units to the left and right sides as shown.



Your Quilt is complete - Quilt as desired.....bind....ENJOY!
