	31949-1		•For block A, cut 5 strips 5 3/8" x WOF. Cut into 64 pieces @ 2 3/4" x 5 3/8". Use template for final cut. See illustration in block construction directions.
	31949-4	1 1/2 yards	<ul> <li>•For block A, cut 6 strips 2 1/2" x WOF. Cut into 90 pieces @ 2 1/2" x 2 1/2".</li> <li>•For half block A, cut 1 strip 2 7/8" x 18". Cut into 6 pieces @ 2 7/8" x 2 7/8". Cut in half diagonally.</li> <li>•For block B, cut 3 strips 4 1/2" x WOF. Cut into 24 pieces @ 4 1/2" x 4 1/2".</li> <li>•For half block B, cut 2 strips 4 7/8" x WOF. Cut into 12 pieces 4 7/8" x 4 7/8". Cut in half diagonally.</li> </ul>
	Gees Bend 14	1 3/4 yards	<ul> <li>For block A, cut 5 strips 2 1/2" x WOF. Cut into 64 pieces (a) 2 1/2" x 2 1/2".</li> <li>For block B, cut 3 strips 4 7/8" x WOF. Cut into 24 pieces (a) 4 7/8" x 4 7/8". Cut in half diagonally.</li> <li>For border #2, cut 9 strips 1 1/2" x WOF. Sew together with diagonal seams. Will be trimmed to size after center is made. Starch well to stabilize.</li> <li>For binding, cut 10 strips 2 1/2" x WOF. Sew strips together with diagonal seams. Fold and press in half.</li> </ul>
	33898-X	print	•Starting 1/4" past the complete red stripe, trim stripe of horses and print to 11 1/2" wide x WOF. See illustration at the end of the pattern. Sew 2 repeats together. Make 4 sets for outer border. Will be trimmed to size after center is made.
	33901-1	2 yards	<ul> <li>For block A, cut 8 strips 4 3/4" x WOF. Cut into 64 triangles using template #2.</li> <li>For block A, cut 11 strips @ 21/2" x WOF. Cut into 140 pieces 21/2" x 2 1/2".</li> <li>For half block A, cut 1 strip 2 7/8" x WOF. Cut into 12 pieces @ 2 7/8" x 2 7/8". Cut in half diagonally.</li> <li>For border #1, cut 7 strips 1 1/2" x WOF. Size or starch well before cutting to stabilize the narrow strips.</li> </ul>
	33901-3	1/2 yard	•For block B, cut 3 strips 4 1/2" x WOF. Cut into 24 pieces @ 4 1/2" x 4 1/2".
	33902-3	5/8 yard	•For block B, cut 3 strips 4 7/8" x WOF. Cut into 24 pieces @ 4 7/8" x 4 7/8". Cut in half diagonally.

For quilt center you will need to make 13 whole block A's and 6 half block A's. You will need 8 whole block B's and 8 half block B's. Size or starch pieces to be cut into half square triangles before cutting.

## Making Block A:

- 1. Assemble 4-patch blocks of the red and turquoise and the black and turquoise  $2 \frac{1}{2}$  squares. Make 24-red 4-patches and 18-black 4-patches for the whole block A's. Make 6-red 4-patches for half block A's.
- 2. On each side of one black  $2 \frac{1}{2}$  square, sew a half square turquoise triangle as shown below in fig 1. Make 12.
- 3. Using template #2, cut 64 turquoise triangles from 4 3/4" strips. See fig 2.
- 4. Using templates #1 and #3, cut 128 triangles, 64 out of #1 and 64 out of #3. (Hint. If you cut two layers at a time, wrong sides together, you will be cutting 2 each of #1 and #3.) See fig 3.





- 5. When triangles are all cut, sew a #1 to one side of #2 and then a #3 to the other side of #2 as shown in the illustrations below fig 4.
- 6. Trim to  $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " if necessary. If patch is coming out too small, take smaller seams.
- 7. Following the diagram on the next page, assemble rows, then sew rows together to create a block.
- 8. Make 13 whole blocks and 6 half blocks as shown on next page.
- 9. If necessary, trim blocks and half blocks to 12 1/2" on each straight side. Trim up diagonal seam on half blocks.






Completed whole and half block A's are shown above.

## Making block B:

- 1. Join the two different half square triangles cut for block B to create 4 1/2" squares. Make 54.
- 2. Following the diagram below, sew rows as illustrated. Join rows to create blocks. Make 8 whole blocks and 8 half blocks.
- 3. If necessary, trim to 12 1/2" on a side.



Completed whole and half block B's are shown above.

## Assembling the quilt:

- 1. Following the layout of the picture of the quilt, create diagonal rows as follows:
  - a. half block B + half block A
  - b. half block B + block A + block B + half block A
  - c. half block B + block A + block B + block A + block B + half block A
  - d. half block B + block A + block B + block A + block A + half block B
  - e. half block A + block B + block A + block B + block A + half block B
  - f. half block A + block B + block A + half block B
  - g. half block A + half block B
- 2. If the layout is creating vertical stripes through the quilt center, you have it right!
- 3. Sew together two rows at a time.
- 4. Join the two-row pieces to create the center of the quilt
- 5. Measure the center of the quilt lengthwise. Be careful not to stretch the bias edges of the half blocks.



- 6. Trim 2 turquoise borders to size. Attach to sides of quilt.
- 7. Measure the center of the quilt crosswise. Be careful not to stretch the bias edges of the half blocks.
- 8. Trim 2 turquoise borders to size. Attach to top and bottom of quilt of quilt.
- 9. NOTE: See the illustration on the next page for trimming the border width.
- 10. NOTE: When attaching the horse borders, make sure the horses are next to the center of the quilt and the red stripe is on the outside edge. See below.
- 11. Measure the center of the quilt lengthwise. Trim two horse borders to size and trim 2 black borders #2 to size. Sew black border to horse side of outer border and attach to the sides of the quilt. Use a walking foot if you have one. A border cut on the cross of the fabric is not as stable as one cut on the length.
- 12. Measure the center of the quilt crosswise. Trim two horse borders to size and trim 2 black borders #2 to the same size. Sew black border to horse side of outer border. Sew a block A to each end of the borders. Sew to top and bottom of quilt.
- 13. Make a sandwich of top, batting, and backing. Sew binding to this side using the 1/4" allowed
- 14. Quilt as desired...but think cactus.
- 15. Bind using a 1/4" seam exactly at the edge of the red stripe. Sew binding to this side using the 1/4" allowed!
- 16. Finish by hand at the back of the quilt.
- 17. Add a label.
- 18. Enjoy!


Note! When horse border and black border are sewn together, it should be 12 1/2". Adjust horse and/or black border as necessary to be 12 1/2"!!
