Cutting the quilt:

- 1. Cutting starts at the quilt shop. Make sure the panels are cut apart down the center between two panels. You will need seam allowance from this area.
- 2. When you get the panel home, you will need to trim it.
- 3. Press and starch or size the panel well. If it is not square, square it up while starching.
- 4. On each side of the panel, cut 1/4" seam allowance outside of the panel border. See below.
- 5. On the top and bottom of the panel, cut along the line between the colors. The seam will be 1/4" inside the printed area with the animals. See next page.







- 6. The final size of the panel should be 39" x 23", but if it is somewhat different, it is ok. There will be fudge room in border #3.
- 7. Note! The animal print at the top and bottom of the panel center is considered part of border #1. Sides will be added to complete this border. The remaining borders go all the way around the quilt center.
- 8. Measure the animal print border from the last panel center border to the cut edge. It should measure 6 1/2". If it doesn't, trim down to size or adjust the sides of border #1 to match the measurement you have.



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On all borders, cut extra length to allow for differences in piecing. Measure and trim to exact length after center and/or previous border has been finished.



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
Assembling the quilt: (See layout on next page.)

- 1. Sew a $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " square to each end of the animal print border.
- 2. Sew side border to each side of the panel.
- 3. Measure the sides of the quilt. Trim the 1 1/2" x 39" pieces to fit. Cut both sides the same and stretch or ease center to fit if necessary. Sew to sides. Be careful with your 1/4" seams. Taking an uneven seam in a 4" border doesn't show very much, but it is very noticeable in a 1" border!
- 4. Measure across the quilt. Trim the 1 1/2" x 37" pieces to fit. Cut both ends the same and stretch or ease the center to fit if necessary. Sew to the top and bottom of the quilt. Note again: Be careful with your 1/4" seams. Taking an uneven seam in a 4" border doesn't show very much, but it is very noticeable in a 1" border!
- 5. For border #3, sew 8 sections of the $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " stripe together. The border should end up $4 \frac{1}{2}$ " wide by 44" long. Remember to chevron the stripes. Make four.
- 6. Measure sides of quilt. Trim two of the borders to length by trimming evenly from each end. In other words, if the border is too long, take 1/2 of the amount it is too big from each end so that the two end pieces are the same size as each other. Sew to sides of quilt.
- 7. Measure across quilt not including the two new sections, but adding 1/2" for seams. Trim two of the borders to length by trimming evenly from each end. In other words, if the border is too long, take 1/2 of the amount it is too big from each end so that the two end pieces are the same size as each other. Add a 4 1/2" fussy cut corner block to each end. Make two.
- 8. Sew to top and bottom of quilt.
- 9. Make 60 prairie points. Take each 6 1/2" square. Fold in half across the middle. Fold each side down to the middle to create the point. Pin or glue folds down. Turn over so folded "seam" is on bottom, or leave it up if you like that "look" better. See below:





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Layout of quilt showing panel in center:




- 10. Make the base of the prairie point borders by measuring the length of the quilt and trimming the $3 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 49" borders to size.
- 11. Do the same with the across measurements and the $3 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 45" borders.
- 12. Place the prairie points along the border alternating colors. Spread or squeeze the points a tiny bit each to make them fit. Remember to leave 1/4" seam on each end. Pin or glue the points securely.
- 13. When all the points are in place, baste them down to hold securely.
- 14. Sew the cornerstones to each end of the top and bottom borders.
- 15. Sew the side borders to the quilt.
- 16. Sew the top and bottom borders to the quilt.
- 17. Make a sandwich of the quilt top, batting and backing.
- 18. Quilt as desired.
- 19. Carefully trim the edges making sure to NOT catch the points during the trim.




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- 20. There are two ways to bind the edge. Start both by sewing the 2 1/2" strips together with diagonal seams. Press and starch or size. Fold in half and press again. Choose one of the following ways to attach the binding: (See illustrations below.)
- A. Bind the edge normally, but make sure the points are out of the way while sewing on the binding.
- B. Carefully pin the prairie points to the edge of the quilt and bind over the top of them. This will keep them flat to the quilt.
- 21. Turn binding to back of quilt and hand stitch down.
- 22. Enjoy!
