## Second Border Assembly

8. Sew one each $4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 48-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric E strips to left and right sides of quilt.
9. Make two flying geese units from $4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric G squares and 4-1/2" x $8-1 / 2$ " Fabric F rectangles.
10. Sew 4-1/2" x $12-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric E rectangles to left and right sides of flying geese units. Sew 4-1/2" Fabric C squares to both ends of this strip, then attach completed strips to top and bottom of quilt top (Fig. 8).

Third Border Assembly
11. Sew $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 56-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric H
strips to left and right sides of quilt top. Sew $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 42-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric H strips to top and bottom of quilt top.

## Fourth Border Assembly

12. Sew $4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 58-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric I strips to left and right sides of quilt top. Sew $4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 50-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric I strips to top and bottom of quilt top.

## Finishing the Quilt

Layer, quilt and bind as desired.

(7) 8-1/2" squares (fussy cut)
(24) $4-1 / 2$ " squares
(20) $4-1 / 2$ " squares
(12) $4-1 / 2$ " squares
(6) $4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 8-1 / 2$ " rectangles
(4) $8-1 / 2$ " squares
(4) $4-1 / 2$ " $\times 12-1 / 2$ " rectangles
(2) $4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 48-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips
(6) $4-1 / 2$ " $\times 8-1 / 2$ " rectangles
(4) $9-1 / 4$ " squares (cut in half on diagonal twice to make 4 triangles)
(4) $4-1 / 2$ " squares
(2) $4-7 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ squares (cut in half on diagonal once to make 2 triangles)
(2) $9-1 / 4$ " squares (cut in half on diagonal twice to make 4 triangles)
(2) $9-3 / 8$ " squares (cut in half on diagonal once to make 2 triangles)
(2) $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 42-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips
(2) $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 56-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips
(5) 2-1/4" strips width of fabric for binding
(2) $4-1 / 2$ " $\times 50-1 / 2$ strips
(2) $4-1 / 2$ " $\times 58-1 / 2$ strips

Cut and piece to fit quilt top with 4 " overlap for quilt backing

2. Sew two each 4-1/2" Fabric D squares to two opposite corners of six 8-1/2" Fabric A squares. Sew two each 4-1/2" Fabric B squares to remaining opposite corners. Press and trim 1/4" away from seams. Make six blocks (Fig. 2).

## Block Assembly

1. Sew four 4-1/2" Fabric B squares to each corner of one 8-1/2" Fabric A square. Flip each square towards corner, press, and trim 1/4" away from seams. Make one block (Fig. 1).

2. Sew four each 4-1/2" Fabric C squares to each corner of four $8-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric E squares. Press and trim 1/4" away from seams. (Fig. 3). Make four blocks.
3. Sew two each 4-1/2" Fabric B squares to opposite corners of four 4-1/2" x 8-1/2" Fabric F rectangles. Press and trim $1 / 4$ " away from seams. Make four units (Fig. 4).

## Quilt Top Assembly

5. Following Fig. 5 diagram, assemble blocks in rows. Sew one each 4-1/2" x $8-1 / 2$ " Fabric D rectangle to top and bottom of left and right rows.

## First Border Assembly

6. Sew five Fabric F triangles to four Fabric G triangles (cut from 9-1/4" squares). Attach triangle strips to left and right sides of quilt top (Fig. 6).
7. Sew one each Fabric G triangle (cut from $4-7 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ squares) to four Fabric F triangles. Sew these units to $4-1 / 2$ " $\times 8-1 / 2$ " Fabric D rectangles and attach to top and bottom of quilt top. Sew large corner Fabric G triangles (cut from 9-3/8" squares) to four corners (Fig 7).
