

Tumbling Dice

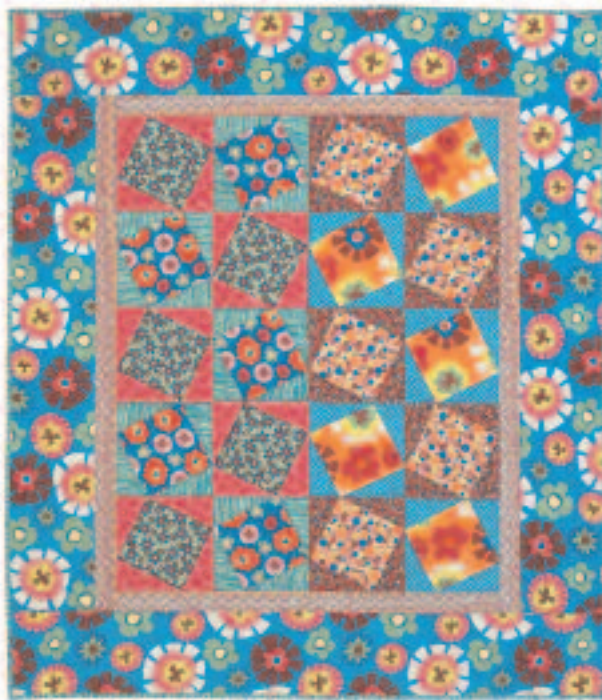

7. Measure quilt through the center. It should be 40-1/2" x 49-1/2". Cut two 8-1/2" x 49-1/2" strips from outer border print (26399-2). Sew one to each quilt side. Press. (Measure your quilt again for this next step; change the numbers to work with your own quilt width.) Cut two 8-1/2" x 56-1/2" strips of border print. Sew to quilt top and bottom. Press well.

Quilting & Binding

8. Layer the quilt top, batting and backing. Pin the layers together and quilt securely in place using your favorite method.

9. Bind outside edges of quilt by cutting 2-1/4" wide green stripe (26401-2). Fold in half lengthwise and press on fold line. Pin and sew raw edges of binding to raw edges of top and quilt. Turn folded edge to back of quilt and stitch in place.

All fabrics are from the Play collection by Jackie Shapiro for Windham Fabrics

Fabric Requirements:

For the block centers, 1/3 yard EACH of:
26396-1, 26399-2, 26405, and 26400-2

For the block triangles, 1/4 yard EACH of:
26401-2, 26404-2, 26398-2, and 26397

1/2 yard zig zag stripe for inner border (26406)
2 yards blue floral print for outer border (26399-2)
1/2 yard green stripe for binding (26401-2) NOTE: this is also used in the block triangles

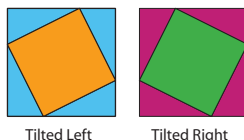
Twin sized batting

3 yards backing

Recommended tool: Tri-Recs® ruler by EZ Quilting®Products

Making the Blocks

1. Transfer template markings for triangle to template plastic or freezer paper. Cut out. If using the Tri-Recs® tool, see next step. Cut a 6-1/2" x 42" strips of EACH of the four triangle fabrics. Cut out (5) 7-1/4" squares from EACH of the block center fabrics. Pair the block centers with their corresponding strips (to become triangles). Decide which of the pairs will tilt to the left and which to the right. Separate the pairs. Use the quilt photo to assist you.



2. Open up the two 6-1/2" strips for the blocks that will tilt to the left and stack them RIGHT sides UP. Using your triangle template or the Tri-Recs® tool, cut out a total of 20 triangles from each strip. Note that the template is flipped from top to bottom with each cut. See Diagram 1.

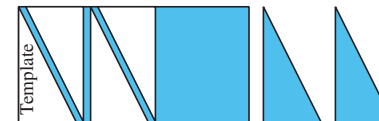


Diagram 1 - Right side of fabric

3. Open up the two 6-1/2" strips for the blocks that will tilt to the right and stack them WRONG sides UP. Using your triangle template or the Tri-Recs® tool, cut out a total of 20 triangles from each strip. Note that the template is flipped from top to bottom with each cut. See Diagram 2.

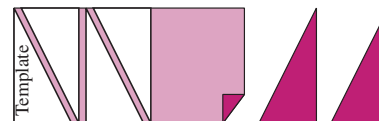


Diagram 2 - Wrong side of fabric

4. Pair the triangles with the corresponding block center squares. Make ten blocks that tilt to the left and ten that tilt to the right. See Diagram 3.

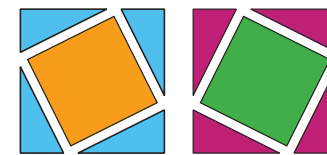

Quilt Assembly

5. Arrange the 20 blocks in five rows of four blocks each, taking care that the blocks alternate, tilting left to right as shown in the Row Assembly, Diagram 4. Sew all blocks together and press seams well.

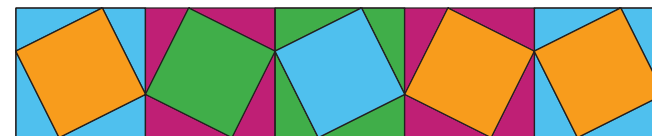


Diagram 4- Row Assembly

Adding Borders

6. Cut (5) 2-1/2" x 42" strips of the zigzag inner border fabric (26406). Sew one to the quilt top and bottom; trim and press. Cut one of the strips in half (21"); sew each half to one end of the remaining two longer strips. Press seams. Sew these last two long strips to the quilt sides.
