


Victorian Rose

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Finished Quilt Size: 48-1/2" x 48-12"

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS:

Using fabrics from the **Victoria** collection of fabrics by Mary Koval, you will need:

3/4 yd #24205-3
1/3 yd #24196-1, #24198-1, #24205, #24201-1
1 yd #24201-3 (includes 1/2 yd for binding)
1/2 yd #24202-3
3-1/2 yds #24193 - backing
fat 8ths, or scraps of th remaining Victoria fabrics

Cutting & Assembly

Center block: cut (1) one 16-1/2" square of #24205-3/ Find the center of the square by folding it in quarters, so you can center the appliqué. Using the pattern and your favorite appliqué method, complete the flower basket and birds.

Sawtooth inner border:

Cut (18) eighteen 2-7/8" squares of #24196-1 and (18) eighteen 2-7/8" squares of #24205-3. Make 26 half square triangle units by marking a diagonal line on the back of the light square. Place a red and a light square right sides together and sew 1/4" on either side of the diagonal pencil line. Cut them apart ON the diagonal line and press open to the dark fabric. Arrange them as shown in the photo and sew together to form the border.

Four triangle units: Fussy cut (4) four 7-1/2" squares of #24193, centering the figures in the scene. Cut (2) two 11-1/4" squares of #24202-3, cutting twice on the diagonal. Assemble per photo.

Flying geese borders: cut (28) twenty-eight rectangles 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" of 24201-1 and (28) twenty-eight rectangles 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" of 24201-3. Cut (56) fifty-six 2-1/2" squares of #24205-1



and (56) fifty-six 2-1/2" squares of #24198-1. On the back of the light squares, lightly mark a diagonal line. Place a small square atop the rectangle with edges aligned. Sew ON the diagonal line. Press the triangle back and cut off the excess seam allowance. Do the same on the other end of the

rectangle to form flying geese units. Sew these together, per photo, with 14 units on each side, adding a 4-1/2" square of #24195-1 to the ends of two sides to form the border.



Blue border: From fabric #24202-3, add (2) two 2-1/2" x 36-1/2" strips and two (2) 2-1/2" x 40-1/2" strips to form the next border.

Four patch border: cut 2-1/2" squares from various Victoria fabrics. Sew these together to form 4-1/2" four patches. There will be (10) ten four-patch units per side. Fussy cut (4) four 4-1/2" squares from #24193 to add to the ends of the four-patch rows.

Layer and baste your quilt top. Quilt as desired and bind.
